**Allen Charles** Private Oct 31st.1861 3 Yrs Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Transferred to Vet Res. Corps. Jan. 18th 1864.

**Allgard Fenton Snyder.** Drafted soldier 22<sup>nd</sup> July 1863 at Frankfort Pa and mustered in same day into 71<sup>st</sup> Pa.. Transferred from Co. K of 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. to Co. A 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 1<sup>st</sup> June 1864. Absent sick at muster out 20<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1864. Had been ill with phthisis (T.B.) and anemia and was sent to a New York hospital and one source states deserted from there 4<sup>th</sup> Aug 1864 and did not return. Married twice. Firstly to Harriett Crouthamel Allgard (15.8.1846-19.9.1887) and Annie Allgard (1863-1946). Fenton was born June 6<sup>th</sup> 1842 died 1916. All three buried in Tohickon Cemetery Bedminster Bucks Co. Pa. Plot Section D Row D-7. Absent at muster out.1<sup>st</sup> June 1864. See letter from W.D. A. G. C. dated 16<sup>th</sup> July 1909.

**Amon Jame** Private Dec.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Died at Point Lookout Md. Aug. 20th 1862.

**Apple Nathan** Private July 22nd 1863 3 Yrs. Nathan was a drafted soldier from Bucks Co. Pa. He was initially drafted aged 30 into the 71st Pa Regt. However he did not show up for service was found and arrested on 22nd April 1864. He then joined the 71st again but when it was disbanded he was "shifted on paper" into the 69th. Pa though never served. He died from disease at Beverley N. J. Oct. 14th 1864. Buried Beverley National Cemetery Burlington Co. N. J. Section 1 Plot 72 .

**Armstrong William** Private No info. Discharged on Surgeons Certificate Feb. 18th 1864

**Barbin William M.** Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Certificate April 19th 1863. Died Nov. 3rd 1891 buried Hepziabah Cemetery Chester Co Pa. near Coatsville and Modena.

\* \* **Barritt James J (Barrett).** (Co. CORK) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Certificate April 1863. Born Co. Cork Ireland 1816 died 13<sup>th</sup> Aug 1895 Pa. Had initially been in the 3 months enlistment of Co A of the 24<sup>th</sup> Pa. then into Co A of the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. A small man just 5ft 5ins. Married. Labourer by trade. Was in the Southern Old Soldiers Home Aug 2<sup>nd</sup> 1887 until Aug 2<sup>nd</sup> 1891 when he transferred to the Central Old Soldiers Home until April 25<sup>th</sup> 1892 when he was released on his request. Buried in St Michaels Roman Catholic Cemetery Chester Del C. Pa. He may have military marker on his grave. May have Co. F on his marker.

**Bastion Robert** Private Oct.31st.1861 3 Yrs. Transferred to Co. H Dec.18th 1861.

**Beam Daniel** Private May 25th 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**Behney Melchoir** Private Sept.25th 1863 3 Yrs. Captured June 22nd 1864. Transferred to Vet Res. Corps June 1st 1865. Born 18<sup>th</sup> Dec.1846 Shafferstown Lebanon Co. Pa. Died aged 74 May 17<sup>th</sup> 1915 in Kansa City. Buried Mount Washington Cemetery Independence Jackson Co. Missouri.

**Belflow Francis** Corp. Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs. Prom. Corp. June 1st 1864. Captured June 12th 1864. Held in Andersonville Ga where his name was recorded as Bellows. Sent Millen Ga 31st. Oct 1864. Survived and discharged by General Order. June 5th 1865.

**Benson Franklin** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted absent sick at muster out.

**Berry James** Corp. Sept.30th 1863 3 Yrs. Prom. Corp. May 1st 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Berry John** Private Enl. Philadelphia 31.3.1861 aged 20 for 3 Yrs. Killed near Petersburg Va. June 10th 1864. His wife Elizabeth Ann Boyer is buried Morris Cemetery Phoenixville Pa. Section F lot 83 Jan 6th 1923. John probably buried in same grave. Records lost early 1900's. John was a native New Yorker who moved west to Pa. aged 20. Firstly lived in Bethel Pa. and then Phoenixville Pa. A late recruit into the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Apparently selected the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. by choice. A printer by trade. Dark complexion 5ft 6ins blue eyes.

**Berry John** Private .This John Berry had enlisted in the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. Co. K. having enlisted in Phoenixville Pa. 13.8.1861 and mustered in Wash. D.C. 23.8.1861 aged 37. Later transferred to Co. A. 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 17.6.1864.

**Bevonstead Frederick** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Died Aug. 6th 1863 at Letterman hospital of wounds received at Gettysburg. 3rd July 1863 aged 41. Buried in National Cemetery Gettysburg. Section C. Grave 86. Named spelt Bordensted.

**Black Andrew J** Private Nov.10th 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**Blanch Thomas** Private Oct.31st.1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Oct. 30th 1862.

**Briggs Andrew J** Private Jan.13th 1865 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**\* \* Bushill Edward** (Co. TIPPERARY). Sergt.Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs. Born 1832 Co. Tipperary Ireland: Died at Alexandria Va. Nov. 7th 1864 aged 29 Buried in National Cemetery Alexandria Va. Grave 2863. However his body was returned to Philadelphia and he was buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetery. Section H Range 4 grave 45. He had enrolled 23.8.1861 at Philadelphia and mustered in as Corp 31.10.1861 at Camp Observaton Md. He was aged 29, fresh complexion, 5ft 10 ins. Grey eyes . Re-enlisted at Stevensburg Va. as Pvte. and again promoted Sergt 17<sup>th</sup> Feb 1864. A labourer by trade.

**### Cardell Arthur** Private Oct.31st.1861 3 Yrs. Absent on detached service at muster out. Born 1827 Ireland. Died Philadelphia Sept 14<sup>th</sup>. 1896. Buried Mount Moriah Cemetery Philadelphia.

**Carland Robert** Corp. Mar.21st 1864 3 Yrs. Not mustered on muster out roll.

**Carpenter John** Private April 1st 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**Carpenter Morris** Corp Mar.21st 1864 3 Yrs. Not mustered on muster out roll.

**Cassidy Francis** + Sergt.Aug.19th 1861 3 Yrs. Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House Va May 12th 1864. Prom. Corp. Aug. 1st 1864 Prom. Sergt. May 1st 1865.

Mustered out with Co. July 1st.1865.Born 6.12.1839. Died 10.9.1908 in Soldiers Home in Erie Pa. Buried Trinity Cemetery Erie Pa. Soldiers Plot Row 2 Grave 7. Became bricklayer after the war. Joined aged 22 fair complexion, 5ft 4 1/2ins. Grey eyes black hair.

**Cassidy Philip** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Aged 27.Discharged on Surgeons Cert .Nov. 5th 1862.

**Clarke Patrick** Private Sept. 24th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted Captured Aug. 25th 1864. Absent with leave at muster out.

**Cochlan Michael** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Feb.28th 1862.

**Cole James** 2nd Lieut. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Private to 2nd Lieut .May 1st 1863. Discharged June 12th 1863.

**Coleran William** Private Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Sept. 1st 1861.

\* \* **Collins Daniel** (Co.LIMERICK) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Limerick Ireland: Was captured at one period of the war by Confederates taken to Richmond but paroled.. Deserted .

**Connor James** Private Oct.31st 1861 3Yrs. Deserted Feb.28th 1862

**Conway Bartholemew** Corp. Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs. Born in Lancashire England. Parents John and Margaret Conway were Irish. Enlisted 1.5.1861 on 3 month enlistment Co. A. 24th Inf. Wounded at Fredericksburg Va. Dec.13th 1862..Shot in right hand .Prom. Corp. Aug.1st 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865 .Died 11.10.1905. In pension application later the late Capt of the 69th John McHugh signed an affidavit saying Bart was of good character, was physically fit when he enlisted and he knew him personally. He was also sick in hospital between Dec 21st 1862 until discharged back to duty March 20th 1863. Died aged 61 thus born 1843-44. Emigrated on the ship "Shanadoah" from Liverpool to Philadelphia with mother and older sisters Catherine and Mary. Father John may have gone to States earlier. Some of his papers name him as Bartly or Bartlette Conway. He was promoted Corp.1. 8.1864. His parents probably worked in the woolen mills in England prior emigrating to the States. Mustered out at Balls Cross Roads. He had been re-enlisted by Capt John McIlvane recruiting officer of the 69th on 9th Feb. 1864 at Stevensburg Va.. He had married twice. Firstly to Harriet Turpin who died in 1877. His 2nd wife was Anne McKeon also Irish born and much younger than Bart. Married 1 .5.1881. Anne was 51 in 1909. Buried Mount Calvary Cemetery Pleasantville N.J.

**Cooley Merrick D.** Private Mar. 30th 1864 3 Yrs. Wounded at Wilderness Va. May 6th 1864 Transferred to Vet. Res. Corps March 16th 1865. Born 1838 in Geaugu Co. Pa Died March 4<sup>th</sup> 1915. Buried in Lakeview Cemetery Clarkston Oakland Co. Mich

Cooley Lane in White Lake township Michigan is named after him. MERRICK D. COOLEY, who owns a fine farm of 80 acres of well improved land in section 3, White Lake township, Oakland County, has been a resident of Michigan since he was eight years old. He was born in 1838, in Geauga County, Ohio, and is a son of Zadoc and Susan (Patterson) Cooley, the former of whom was born in Massachusetts and the latter in Syracuse, New York. Zadoc Cooley moved to Ohio about 1825 and to Michigan in 1833. He was always engaged in agricultural pursuits and first settled the family in Genesee county, where he died in 1849 at the age of 56 years. In politics he was a Whig. Although he adopted no particular religious creed, he

was a man of integrity and moral worth. His widow survived until 1899, dying at the age of 93 years. She was a consistent member of the Methodist Church. A family of 11 children were born to them, as follows: Timothy, a member of one of the Ohio regiments in the Civil War, who was killed in battle at Resaca, May 14, 1864, at the age of 33 years; Levi, a resident of Iowa; Charles, deceased; Mary Ann, who married Festus Chase and lives in Genesee County, Michigan; Merrick D., of this sketch; Rebecca (Mrs. Sacs), of Iowa; Louisa E., who married Henry Chapman of Henry County, Ohio; Minerva, deceased; Alfred G., of Michigan; Augusta, who married Henry Coats of Michigan and with him moved to California; and Martha, deceased. Merrick D. Cooley was educated in the common schools, and was reared a farmer. In 1859 he came to Oakland County, Michigan, and settled first in Independence township, in 1881 removing to his present place in White Lake township, where he has successfully followed farming ever since. In 1868 Mr. Cooley was married to Mary Bird, who was born in Independence township, Oakland County, Michigan, in 1844, a daughter of Thomas Bird, a native of New Jersey and a pioneer of this State. One son has been born to this marriage,--Bird T., born November 12, 1875, at Waterford, who is conducting a produce business at Drayton Plains Oakland County. Mr. Cooley enlisted, for service in the Civil War, in Company F, 2nd Reg., Michigan Vol. Inf., at Flint, Michigan, in May, 1861, and was mustered out as a paroled prisoner May 29, 1862, by order of the Secretary of War. In March, 1864, he re-enlisted, at Meadville, Pennsylvania, in the 69th Reg., Veteran Vol. Inf., and was mustered out July 25, 1865. At the battle of the Wilderness he sustained a gunshot wound and a hernia injury at Brandy Station. He participated in the following important battles: First battle of Bull Run; Siege of Yorktown; Williamsburg, where he was captured and then sent to Libby Prison, where he remained 20 dreadful days before being paroled. Under his second enlistment, Mr. Cooley took part in the battle of the Wilderness where he was so seriously wounded that he was sent to the hospital and was later transferred to the Veteran Reserve at Point Lookout, Maryland, and remained with that organization until mustered out at Concord, New Hampshire. Mr. Cooley was one of the heroes of the Civil War and has a record to which he can point with pride. In politics Mr. Cooley is a Republican. Fraternally he belongs to the Masons, Knights of the Macaques, and Dick Richardson Post, G. A. R. at Pontiac.

**Cooper Henry J.** Enlisted Philadelphia into Co E 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. Later transferred to Co. A 69<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> June 1854. Had re-enlisted Feb. 22<sup>nd</sup> 1864 3 Yrs. Absent wounded at muster out in hospital Philadelphia. Died Philadelphia April 23<sup>rd</sup> 1914 aged 73. Died from Brights disease. Was an elevator conductor U.S. Mint. Was born in Philadelphia. Buried in Mount Peace cemetery April 27<sup>th</sup> 1914.

**Corson Charles D** Private April 1<sup>st</sup>. 1864 3 Yrs. Aged 24. Not on muster out roll. 5ft 4ins tall blue eyes bricklayer by trade.

**Costello Bartholeum** Private Aug.23<sup>rd</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Sept.1<sup>st</sup> 1861.

**\*\* Courtney James** (Co. LONGFORD) Private Apl.12<sup>th</sup>. 1864 3 Yrs. Born Co. Longford Ireland: Absent sick at muster out.

**Crooks Robert** Private Oct.31<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Wounded at Fredericksburg Dec13<sup>th</sup> 1862. Transferred to Vet reserve Corps. Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>. 1863.

**### Crowley Daniel** Private Oct.31<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Born Ireland. Had general poor health and was in hospital at times. Fought at Glendale and the Peninsular campaign and Antietam and Fredericksburg. Missed Gettysburg but returned to the ranks after hospitalisation. Took ill again Sept 17<sup>th</sup> 1863. Accidentally killed near Germanstown Pa. Dec.1<sup>st</sup> 1863 in a civil accident. Aged about 50. Fell off bridge. Parents John and Mary Crowley. Buried from Chestnut Hill Hospital. Buried in the St. Stephens cemetery in Nicetown area of Philadelphia. Was transferred to hospital ill Sept.1<sup>st</sup> 1863 and took his rifle and 50 rounds of ammo with him!!!. Note that the cemetery above was attached to what was a chapel established in 1843. Graveyard

operated until 1891 when closed. It appears as now to be a small field . All gravestones are either laid flat or buried. No marker for Crowley exists there.

**\* \* Cullin John (Co. LAOIS)** Private Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted April 15th 1864. From Co. Laois.

**\* \* Curtin John (Co. LAOIS)** Private Mar. 11th 1864 3 Yrs. Born Co. Laois Ireland: Wounded at Spottsylvania Court House May 12th 1864. Transferred to Vet. Res. Corps Jan.1st 1865. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. March 20th 1865. A shoemaker by trade. Buried Old Cat. Cemetery Philadelphia Section S Range 6 grave 69.

**Daniels George** Private April 1st 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**\* \* Denney Daniel (Co. Cork)** Corp. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Jan. 1st 1863. Captured Fair Oaks 29th June 1862 paroled sick 13th Sept 1862. Discharged 1st July 1863 with heart problems. Buried in National cemetery Dayton Ohio. Plot F- 5 -2 Died July 6<sup>th</sup> 1886. Note name spelling varies some documents Denny. Born 1830.

**Devine James** Corp. Feb 25th 1864 3 Yrs. Transferred to Vet. Reserve Corp. Sept. 16th 1864.

**Dever John** Private Feb 9th 1864 3 Yrs. Enlisted aged 16 as musician at Philadelphia 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1861 and mustered in Camp Obs. Md 31<sup>st</sup> 10 1861 . Re-enlisted at Stevensburg Va. 15<sup>th</sup> April 1864 but deserted 15<sup>th</sup> April when on furlough. Was 5ft 5ins tall, blue eyes, fair. A printer by trade.

**Donahue Peter** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Nov.30th 1862.

**\* \* Donovan William (Co. CORK)** .Corp. April 19th 1861 3 Yrs Born c.1829 Co. Cork Ireland. Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 by gunshot wound. Lived for a while but died on or around 26th July. Was buried old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia on July 28th 1863. Lived in the 15th Ward Philadelphia. Was attended to by Wilson J. Jones Surgeon to the 69th Pa. at Gettysburg 2nd Army Corps hospital. Was aged 32 on enlistment 5ft. 4ins. in height.

**Donnelly Peter** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted July 1st 1862

**\* \* Dooley Stephen (Co. LAOIS)**. Sergt. Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Laois (Queens Co.) Ireland: Prom. to Sergt. May 5th 1863. Fought at Gettysburg. Wounded at the Wilderness Va. May 5th 1864 mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Buried at Old Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia plot A.2.40E. Aged 35 at death. Died 8.3.1874 in Philadelphia.

**Doyle Patrick J.** Corp. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Died at Camp Observation Md. March 15th 1862. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. Section J Range 4 Grave 6. West Margin. Patrick died of Typhoid pneumonia. Born 1836. Note; In some records he is mistakenly said to be buried in the Poolesville Methodist Episcopalian Church cemetery..

**### Duffy James** Major Sept.2nd 1861 3 Yrs. Born Ireland: Promoted from Capt. to Major May 1st 1863 and to Lieut Col. July 4th 1863. Owned Duffys hotel in Philadelphia. Suffered sunstroke at Gettysburg but fought on. Lived 2043 Waverley St. Philadelphia. Died aged 76. He was a marble polisher by trade . However in his latter life he worked for the Philadelphia Mint. His funeral was from the home of his son James at 2317 Christian St. He is buried Holy Cross Cemetery Yeadon Del Co.

Plot Section 12 Range 4 Lot 23 Grave 3. Had died June 1869.

**Dunn James** 2nd Lieut. Sept. 1st 1861 3 Yrs. Killed at Antietam Md. Sept. 17th 1862 aged 22. Buried Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia. plot H.4.53

\* \* **Dunn John** (Co. WATERFORD) Corp. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Waterford Ireland: Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 absent sick at muster out.

**Eckhart John (Acord)** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Captured at Reams Station Aug. 25th 1864. Died at Salisbury N.C. Oct. 28th 1864. Buried in the P.O.W. Section of Salisbury Nat. Cemetery Salisbury N.C. No grave allocation. Buried trench grave.

**Edmonston William** Private Oct.31st. 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Feb.26th 1862

**Ellis John** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Oct 3rd 1862

**Farley Henry** Private Mar. 28th 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll

**Fay Michael** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Promoted 2nd Lieut. Co.D May 1st 1863

**Fenton Allgerd** Private 22nd July 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Absent sick at muster out.

**Fisher John** Private Sept.9th 1861 3 Yrs. Absent on detached service at muster out.

\* \* **Flannigan James** (Co.GALWAY) Private Aug.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co Galway Ireland: Plagued by poor health during the war. Died at Alexandria Va April 26th 1862 aged 44. Grave 1122 National Graveyard Alexandria. Va.

\* \* **Flood John** (Co. TYRONE) Sergt. Aug.23rd.1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Wounded at Wilderness Va May 6th 1864 absent in hospital at muster out.

**Foley Thomas** Private Mar.31st 1864 3 Yrs. Born New York. Lived in Bethel Pa. A butcher by trade. Not on muster out roll.

\* \* **Forbes William** (Co. DERRY) (Also in some documents as Forbis). Born Ireland at Drummenagh Ballyronan near Toomebridge. Co. Derry Oct. 10<sup>th</sup> 1824. Was a weaver by trade. Joined the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. as private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Date unknown. Army Invalid certificate No. 926464. Died 2<sup>nd</sup> Sept 1908. There was a reimbursement made Aug 31<sup>st</sup> 1910 for \$59.33 payable to a John Keighley of Ballyronan Co. Derry Ireland. This man was appointed to receive the outstanding pension due Forbes after he died. He was a neighbouring farmer. William had enlisted at Philadelphia 12<sup>th</sup> Oct.1861 aged 32 and mustered in at Camp Observation Md.31<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861. He was 5ft 8 inches tall with blue eyes. He had married a Sarah Scott at Woods church before going to the States. A daughter Alice was born August 1861 in Philadelphia. Was wounded by grapeshot in the left leg at Manassas Va. while on picket duty Sept 1<sup>st</sup> 1862 and sent to the White Pines tent hospital initially then to Fort McHenry Baltimore where he was discharged as disabled 13<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1862 still carrying wounds and back problems. His wife Sarah died July 27<sup>th</sup>. 1863. Daughter died sometime before 1908. Forbes returned to Ireland and settled in Larne

Co. Antrim. He applied for a pension July 15<sup>th</sup>.1895.and granted what was equivalent to £7 pounds a quarter. By 1905 had settled in Larne Co. Antrim. On July 10<sup>th</sup> 1905 robbed of money and his pension certificate by three men when he was walking to Ballyclare.. In 1906 he moved to Magherafelt and by 1908 he was living in Ballyronan. Here he became ill and was cared for by Mr and Mrs John Keightley

also of Ballyronan . Died Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> 1908. The Keightlys wrote to the Pension Office in Wash for pension due and cost of his burial expenses. On. Dec. 29<sup>th</sup> 1908 they received expenses of \$70.99 and pension cert for \$ 59.33.

**Foster Thomas A.** Private Mar.31st 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll

**Fray George** Private Mar.21st 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Frazier Daniel** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert May 21st 1863

\* \* **Fyans Thomas** (Co. DUBLIN) Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Dublin Ireland 1830. Only engagement was at Glendale June 1862. Subsequently he was in hospital through the fall of 1862 and into 1863 . Deserted from a hospital in Alexandria Va May 1st.1863

**Geary Michael** Private Sept. 15th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged by Gen. Order June 13th 1865.

**Gillette Charles** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Aug. 28th 1862.

**Gilligan Patrick** Private Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Dec.9th. 1861.

**Gornman Milton** Private July 22nd 1863 3 Yrs Killed at Cold Harbour Va.June 12th 1864.

**\* \* O'Neill James** (Co. TYRONE) Private M. I. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Tyrone Ireland. Discharged on Surgeons Cert.Nov.29th 1862. He had previously been reported as a deserter. Said to be 44. Note there was another James O'Neill in Co. B. killed Gettysburg 3rd July 1863..

**\* \*O'Neill Henry** (Co. CAVAN) Private Mar.13th 1864 3 Yrs Born Co Cavan Enlisted Philadelphia 13th Feb 1864 Mustered in same day. Wounded at Cold Harbour Va. June 4th 1864. Absent at muster out sick in hospital Philadelphia. Born 1813 died 4.10.1888. Buried St. Marys R.C. graveyard Phoenixville Pa. New Plot Range 4, A Henry O'Neill carried the flag at the battle of Cold Harbour. Maybe this soldier (Photo).

**Payton James** Private Mar.25th 1864 3 Yrs. Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864 .Deserted July 11th 1864.

**Potts John** Private Jan 19th 1865 3 Yrs. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Quigley John** Private Enlisted on Oct.31st 1861 for 3 Yrs. Wounded at Antietam Md.Sept.17th 1862.Hospitalised in Wash D.C. after recovery he transferred to Vet. Res Corp. Nov. 15th 1863. Had initially served in the 24<sup>th</sup> Pa. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. Wife name Sarah. They lived at John's death at 2501 Meridith St. Funeral Mass at St Xaviers Church. Died Nov 13<sup>th</sup> 1899. Buried plot Z--1-53-54 North margin. Missed Gettysburg.

**Ream Christopher** Private July 11th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Captured June 22nd 1864. Petersburg Va. Held but survived Andersonville Ga. Absent sick at muster out.

**Reiley Thomas** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Jan 4th 1861.

**Reynolds Richard** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted July 17th 1863.

**\* \* Rickaby Ralph** (Co. LAOIS) Sergt. Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs. From Co Laois Ireland: Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 Discharged Aug. 26th 1864 at end of term. Born 1833 .Died Hampton City Va. Sept 16<sup>th</sup> 1897. Buried Fernwood Cemetery Fernwood Del. Co. Pa. Plot lot 320.

**Ross John** Private Sept.24th 1863 3 Yrs. Substitute. Absent sick at muster out.

**Rittmaier William** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Died of disease in hospital at Point Lookout Nov 4th 1862.Had enlisted at Philadelphia 9.8.1861 and Mustered in Camp Obs. Md 31.10.1861 aged 23. As with many "Germanic" sounding names the spelling varies.

**Rummell Gottlieb** Private April 1st 1864 3 Yrs. Born in Germany Was a farmer by occupation. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865 Buried Philadelphia National Cemetery Philadelphia. Plot F 105

**Ryan Daniel** Private Feb.2nd 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**Rylie John M.** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert.Dec.24th 1861.

**Sanders George Calwalader** "The Infant Drummer". Musician Aug 19th 1861 3 Yrs. Died at Camp Observation Md. Jan 21st. 1862.This young boy joined the 69th on August 19th 1861 for three years. He was the leading drummer and musician in the 69th and taught the other musicians. He was himself taught by his father also a musician and soldier who had joined the 69th on the same day.. Sadly he died probably of typhoid at Camp Observation near Poolesville Md. Jan 22nd 1862 aged

just 14 years of age. He was known as the "The Infant Drummer". He was given a public funeral in Philadelphia. Buried in the Hillside Cemetery Roslyn Montgomery Co. Pa. His Father Thomas was a drum major also in the Regt. On his coffin was displayed a flag that had passed through the Mexican war and also his drum. It is said that his grandfather had also been a soldier in the Revolutionary war.

**Sanders Joseph** Drafted soldier. From N. Anneville Pa. Private 3 Yrs. Initially enlisted in Co. E 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. He was aged 25. Enlisted and mustered in at Pootsville Pa 24<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1863. On 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864 he was transferred along with many other 71<sup>st</sup> Pa soldiers to Co. A of the 69<sup>th</sup>. Pa. He was aged 5ft 6ins in height light complexion light hair and grey eyes. Wounded at the battle of the Wilderness Va. 6<sup>th</sup> May 1864 being shot in the left leg hip area. He would carry the bullet until he died. However some five months in hospital Fredericksburg Va. He appeared to have taken up his post again and on April 7<sup>th</sup> 1865 at the battle of High Bridge Va developed liver disease from having to cross the Appotomax river under fire in a heated condition. Subsequently throughout life he was in a very poor health state in addition to his war wounds now with arthritis and side effects from his earlier wounds. Looking at his list of pension applications he certainly was not well treated by the system. Was unmarried. He mustered out 1<sup>st</sup>. July 1865. Buried in Mount Annville cemetery, Anneville Lebanon Co. Pa.

**Seymour Joseph** Private 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**Shadfold Abraham** Private Mar. 21<sup>st</sup> 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**Shand Cyrus** Private Sept. 26<sup>th</sup> 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Died at Washington D.C. June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1864 Buried National Cemetery Arlington Va. Plot Section 27 site 730. Marker photo.

**Simpson Hugh** Drafted soldier Private Oct 31<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Died at Washington D.C. June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1864. Buried Arlington Nat. Cemetery Arlington Va. Section 13 Site 11432.

**Smith Robert M.** Drafted soldier. Private April 14<sup>th</sup> 1864 3 Yrs. Absent on detached service at muster out.

**Spotts Francis** Private Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Absent sick at muster out.

**Standing Thomas** Enlisted Aug. 23<sup>rd</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Had been prom. to Corp. Aug. 1<sup>st</sup> 1864, to Sergt. May 1<sup>st</sup> 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865. Died in California and is buried in the Los Angeles National Cemetery Section 25. Row K Site 4. Died 15.1.1915. He had been born in Frankfort Pa 1842. He had enlisted at Philadelphia aged 19. He fought at and survived Gettysburg though wounded He re-enlisted at Stevensburg Va. 9<sup>th</sup> Feb 1864. Survived the war and mustered out 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865. He had been a carpenter by trade.

**Stapp Robert M.** Private. Enlisted Co. A. 6<sup>th</sup> Ind. Inf. on April 19<sup>th</sup> 1861 at Hanover Ind. as musician aged 48. A small man 5ft 5ins fair complexion, grey eyes, grey hair, Protestant faith. and was able to read and write. Not married. His trade was noted as a telegraph operator. However he was discharged Aug 26<sup>th</sup> 1861 at Indianapolis with dislocation of left shoulder. He was later drafted into Co A 69<sup>th</sup> Pa Infantry 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1865 at Ridgeway Pa. In the P.A. Civil war records it is noted that he was "Unattached at US Military Telegraphy at Wash. D.C since 3<sup>rd</sup> April 1865. Discharged as per Ord. CO 384 of 20<sup>th</sup> July 1865". It was very likely that he

was drafted for his skill as a telegraph operator as the communication system for the Army was being massively upgraded around this time with much more use being made of the telegraphy system and use of morse code. It is unlikely he even met his comrades in the 69<sup>th</sup> but was simply assigned to the regiment should the war progress and there be need for field assignment or assignment to communicate with the 69<sup>th</sup> from Wash. D.C. I would be of the opinion that when he was in Wash. He would have been active in the developing communications networks of the time.

**Streets Geary** Private April 14th 1864 3 Yrs. Absent sick at muster out.

**Sullivan Thomas** Private Feb.2nd 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**Syler Leonard** Drafted soldier. Private Sept.26th 1863 3 Yrs. Born Hermaringen Wurttemberg Germany Sept. 21st 1834. Drafted initially into the 71st Pa. Inf. Co E at Pootsville Pa. Captured at Reams Station Aug. 25th 1864. Wounded at battle of Cold Harbour. After recovery he was transferred to Co A in the 69th Pa. to finish off his enlistment period. Captured at Reams Station Aug 25th 1864 and sent to Belle Isle prison. Exchanged in prisoner swap at Varina Va. went back to the 69th and fought until end of war. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Died Aug. 11th 1916. Buried in the Oak Hill Cemetery Hammond. Lake Co. Indiana. Original German name was probably Leonhardt Sailer. Came to America 1850 aged 16 and Anglified name. Farmer by trade settled Annville Pa. Married in 1856 Mustered out with honourable discharge July 1st 1865 family moved to Hyde Park -Coldhour which was then a village south of Chicago later East Chicago. Worked all his working life in the steel industry and retired from Iroquois Steel in 1901. Died aged 82. (See webpage for more detail and photos).

**Templing John** Private Sept.24th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Absent sick at muster out.

**Thompson George D.** Private Mar.15th 1864 3 Yrs. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Titus William** Private Sept.25th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Captured. Died at Andersonville Ga. July 14th 1864. Grave 3329.

**Twomey Thomas** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Dec.18th 1862.

**Udell George** Private Feb.12th 1864 3 Yrs. Killed at Hatchers Run Va.Mar.25th 1865.Though not mentioned by name Sergt. Stephen Dooley mentioned in a letter home to his wife in Philadelphia on the 26th that they lost one killed (it was Udall) in a skirmish close to Hatchers Run the previous day.( See Soldiers Letter on Dooley page). Enlisted Philadelphia 12th.Feb 1864 aged 31 and mustered in same day. Transferred from 71st Reg. P.V. 12th June 1864. He was born in Manchester England and a dyer by trade. Wounded Spotsylvania C.H. 12th May 1864.

**Walsh John W** (Co. KILDARE) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Oct.23rd 1862. At Harpers Ferry. After the Antietam confrontation.Note some of his paperwork state Co. Tipperary. Was a loom fixer before the war.

**Walton William** Corp. Oct.31st.1861 3 Yrs. Deserted July 11th 1863.

**Waters Brian** Private April 8th 1864 3 Yrs. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Watson James** Private Jan.19th 1865 3 Yrs. Mustered out with Co

**Weiler A William** Private Sept.24th 1863 3 Yrs Enrolled Co. E Pa 71st Inf. 26.9.1863 at Pottsville. He was aged 22. Then transferred to the 69th Pa Inf 12. 6.



1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. William lived 1834-1898. Wife Nancy Weiler lived 1833-1916. Buried in the Evergreen Cemetery Annville Lebanon Co. Pa. Native of Schuylkill Philadelphia. William was a member of the Knights of Pythias Lodge. Died aged 74. He left behind his wife and son Nathaniel who lived near Annville. William was living in Steelstown Annville when he died. His death was reported in the Lebanon Daily News Jan 8th .1908. He had died 7th Jan the day previous.

**Welsh John** Private Mar.31st 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**White James** Sergt. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Transferred to Vet Reserve Corps Nov 15<sup>th</sup> 1863

**Whitney David E.** Private Oct.19th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Williams Frederick** Private Sept.26th 1863 3 Yrs. Substitute. Absent sick at muster out.

**Williams George B.** Private Sept.26th 1863 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. June 18th 1865.

**Williams John H** Corp. Feb.25th 1864 3 Yrs. Transferred to Co. I Feb.27th 1865.

**Wilson James** Private Sept.26th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Absent sick at muster out.

**Wilson James** Private Sept.26th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Absent sick at muster out.

**Wilson John** Private May 28th 1861 3 Yrs Was court-martialled No details.

**Wilson John** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Promoted to Hospital Steward Feb.15th 1865.

**Wilt Charles** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Nov.1st.1862.

**Winer Joseph** Private April 7th 1862 3 Yrs. Absent wounded at muster out.

**Wray Moses** Joined 71<sup>st</sup> Pa Infantry Co F as bugler at Philadelphia 28<sup>th</sup> June 1861 aged 27. Transferred to Co. A 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864.Died in Philadelphia from alcohol related disease Dec 10<sup>th</sup> 1890 aged 56. Buried in the now defunct Monument cemetery Philadelphia 12<sup>th</sup> Dec 1890. A married man and a horse clipper by trade. Wife name Ann. Lived at 145 Dana St Philadelphia. Note Monument cemetery now defunct and remains in 1956 removed to Lawnview Cemetery.Philadelphia communal grave,
