Allen George Private Sept.20th 1861 3 Yrs. Mustered out July 20th 1864 expiration of term.

Anderson Patrick H Private Aug.28th 1861 3 Yrs. Captured Antietam 17th Sept 1862 Parrolled Richmond 6th Oct. 1862 Sick until 25th June 1863 Mustered in again but captured again Getysburg July 1st 1863. Escaped Feb 17th 1865. Mustered out June 15th 1865. About 1867 he joined the U.S. Army for 3 years and spent his time in the West fighting the Indians. He got married and had two children. His wife lived well into the 20th century. A labourer by trade 5ft 8ins tall blue eyes fair complexion. Aged 19 when he enlisted. At one stage after he re-enlisted and on his way to Gettysburg July 1st 1863 his train was stopped and he was captured by Confederate cavalry missed Gettysburg and did not escape until Feb 1865 as the war was ending. From West Chester Philadelphia. Buried in the Oak Woods Cemetery Chicago Ill.. @

Barr Hugh Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

Beers (Bears) David Richard Private Oct 4th 1864 3 Yrs. Drafted. Deserted from Co. K. 169th Regt P.V.I. note the 169th not the 69th Pa. He deserted in 1862 and was not found until 1965 when his paperwork then wrongly associated him with the 69th Pa. However for whatever reason his grave marker in the far off Indian Creek Cemetery in Swisshome Lane Co. Oregon states he was a member of Co. D of the 69th Pa. Born Philadelphia Aug 30th 1831 died Nov 4th 1905 Lane Co. Oregon. Not the 1st failure of the paperwork of the Civil War era.

Beatty John Emblem Private June 18th 1864 3 Yrs. Drafted. Born 25th Sept 1831 Died June 9th 1919 aged 87 at Newcastle Del. Buried 12th Sept 1919. Buried Green Hill Presbyterian Cemetery Wilmington Newcastle Co. Del Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Had been a pattern maker by trade. Note in some documentation his name spelt Beaty. Buried Greenhill Presbyterian Church Cemetery Wilmington Newcastle Co. Delaware. Spouse Jean Wood Beatty 1838-1908.

Beggs James Private Mar. 2nd 1864 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

Bennett Henry Private July 1st 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out Sept.26th Aug.16th 1864 expiration of term.

Berry Richard Private June 18th 1864 3 Yrs Drafted. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

Boyle John F. Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Ireland: History of

sickness. Discharged on Surgeons Cert Oct.27th 1863.

Boyle John M Private Oct. 31st 1862 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert Oct.12th 1862.Wounded Antietam.

*** * Bradley Hugh** (Co. TYRONE) Corp Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born in Co. Tyrone Ireland. Joined Co. as 28 year old immigrant. Back in Ireland his father died in 1841 leaving his mother and some 6 children in poverty. She upped and took the family to the States. Hugh and his brother Charles were old enough to support their mother and rest of family. However Charles took ill in 1860 and it was left to Hugh to support the family. He did so by joining the 69th and sent his army pay back to his mother in Philadelphia. The family were very poorly educated. Sadly Hugh was killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. He had been recruited by Capt. Harvey at Danville Pa. The story goes that he was last seen at Gettysburg swinging his musket as a club until a Confederate dispatched him. He is buried in St Mary of the Assumption Catholic cemetery Phoenixville Pa. Old section . Govt. grave. (See bio).

*** * Brady James** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co Kerry Ireland: Deserted Aug. 30th 1862 From Co. Kerry.

Buchter Henry E Private Sept 26th 1863 3 Yrs.Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.Born Nov 12th 1836 Died 19th Feb 1923. Buried Hess Mennonite Cemetery Lititz Lancaster Co. Pa.

*** * Buckley Michael** (Co. CORK)). Born 1830. Private Sept 17th 1862 3 Yrs. Enrolled 10.9.1861 Philadelphia Mustered in 31.10 1861 Camp Observation Md. Discharged June 14th 1863 for wounds received at Antietam Sept.17th 1862. Died July 12th 1888 Philadelphia. Buried in St Charles Borremo Cemetery Drexel Hill Del Co. Pa. Born Co. Cork Ireland 1832 Michael was killed in a fall at a quarry at Shurs Lane Manayunk. Sadly two of his sons John and Daniel had a confrontation about the ownership of their late fathers pension of some \$1,500 and also whose right it was to remove his remains . They had to be separated by the Coroners clerk a Mr Donal. In any case the jury returned a verdict of accidental death. Wife Mary Cahill who died 1805.

Buckley Thomas Musician July 1st 1861 3 Yrs Enrolled 1.7.1861 aged 17 at Philadelphia mustered in 1.7.1861 Discharged 1.7.1864.

Bucknight James E Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs. Substitute. Discharged Sept 28th 1865.

Burns James Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted March 7th 1862.

*** * Burns Patrick** (Co. MONAGHAN) Private Sept.10th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Monaghan Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg. Wounded at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Mustered out Sept 10th 1864 expiration of term.

Caffrey John Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs.Killed at Fredericksburg Dec.13th 1862.

*** * Carney Patrick** (Co. TYRONE) Corp Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Dunacavey - Fintona Co. Tyrone Ireland C. 1840. Emigrated with his father and mother Thomas Carney and mother Catherine McGrath and brothers and sisters Anne ,Hugh, Bernard, Roseanna Margaret, Joseph and Thomas. Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Died of wounds at Harrisburg 29th July 1863. Buried Old Cathedral Cemetery

Philadelphia. Note. Obituary notice in the P.H.I. Aug 3rd. 1863 has his name wrongly as Carvey. Buried Sec. C Range 5 Plot 53. He was aged 23 when he died. Patrick enrolled 2.9.1861 at Philadelphia. Mustered in Camp Observation Md. 31.10.1861 He was 23 years of age. It would appear Patrick had been in another unit or militia which allowed him enrol as Corporal. Grave positively identified in the Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia by a 69th Re-enactment unit member Sept 2007. Grave marker placed on his grave 11.11.2007 (See also obituary notice). Father named Thomas and mother Catherine. Killed by gunshot wounds. Buried from 812 Tasker St. Philadelphia where he lived with his mother. Be aware of name spelling of this name can be Carney or Kearney. Spelt Kearney in the P.A. civil War records card file.

Carr John Wesley Drafted soldier. Private June 18th 1864 3 Yrs Born Dec 12th 1833. in Pa. Aged 30 on draft. Mustered out Munsons Hill with Co. July 1st 1865. Died at Old Soldiers Home at Hampton Va 12th Feb 1900. Buried in Hampton National Cemetery Va Plot C O 7781 or 7881?. Worked in the spinning mills of Pa. Probably never married. Had also been in the Pa. DVS home 16.4.1895. aged 60. Not a lot known of his war service as now. Was born in Southern State Georgia. (Photo)

Carr Timothy Shannon Musician Sept. 21st 1861 3 Yrs A native of Philadelphia. Born Feb 9th 1847 Pa. Enlisted at Philadelphia 21st Sept 1861 as boy drummer aged 16 into Co. D. He was 5ft 4ins tall fair complexion blue eyes. A labourer by trade. Born Philadelphia. Re-enlisted 1st Feb 1864 at Stevensburg. Prom. to principal musician/drum major Oct. 31st 1864. A married man Died Feb 18th 1915. Buried in the Greenwood Cemetery Philadelphia. His wife was Saraah A. Wilde with whom he had two daughters Mary E and Ida L. @ M

Cash Dennis Corp Oct 11th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out Oct 11th 1864 expiration of term.

Clark Owen Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Wounded and captured at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863.

**** Clark Thomas** (Co. LEITRIM). Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Leitrim Ireland: Wounded at Gettysburg July 2nd 1863. Mustered out Nov 11th 1864 expiration of term.

Coffin Ira Private .Ira seems to have had quite a mixed career. His paperwork seems to show that he initially enrolled in the 128 P.V.I. (possibly drafted?) and the went missing after the battle of Chancellorsville May 2nd 1863. However he is recorded as joining the 71st Pa in Sept of the same year 24th Sept. 1863. However when the remnants of the being disbanded 71st Pa joined the 69th Pa on June 12th 1864 Ira also transferred to them. A married man with wife Maria. He was born May 10th 1842 and died Aug 7th 1893. Buried Slatedale Cemetery Slatedale LeHigh Co Pa. Though both his headstone and the marker in front of his headstone mention the 128th P.V.I. the 69th is not mentioned though he spent some time as a soldier in Co. D.

**** Coniff Patrick** (Co. GALWAY) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Galway Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg. Deserted July 11th 1863.

Conley Michael Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**** Connelly Patrick (Connell)** (Co. LOUTH). Born 1836 Corp Aug.24th 1864 3 Yrs Wounded at Hatchers Run Feb 5th 1865. Discharged by Gen. Order June 12th 1865. Born Co Louth. Died Philadelphia Jan 4th 1897. Buried New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.

**** Connolly Francis** (Co. TYRONE) Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born in Co. Tyrone. Deserted March 27th 1862.

Connolly Jackson Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Jan 27th 1863..

**** Connolly Patrick (Co. TYRONE)** Sergt Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Wounded at Gettysburg July 2nd 1863. Prom. to Corp Feb 1st. to Sergt Oct. 31st 1864, 2nd Lieut June 16th 1865 not mustered. Mustered out July 1st 1865. Aged 29 on enlistment a carpenter by trade. Was also wounded at The Wilderness in the left hand. Buried New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.

Connolly Patrick Private Feb.1st 1864 3 Yrs. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Buried St. Josephs Church Cemetery Danville Pa.

Conlin Jackson. Pvte. Little known about. Had been a private in the 1st Del Inf. Then joined the 69th Pa. He had been born in Delaware. A labourer by trade. He was sick in hospital from the date he joined the 69th 31st Oct 1861 until he deserted 27th. Jan 1863.

Coyle Roger Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted June 10th 1863.

Craig Jacob C. Corp. July 12th 1861 3 Yrs. Mustered out July 1st 1864 expiration of term. Initially 71st Pa. Co's C and M. Died 23rg April 1900. Born and died Philadelphia. Buried in Fernwood cemetery Fernwood Del Co. Pa. Buried plot W. Side 324 43.

Culbert James Private Sept 23rd 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Absent sick at muster out.

**** Curran Francis** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Deserted July 6th 1862 Harrisons Landing.

Curran Owen Private Oct 31st 1863 Yrs. Not on muster out roll

Davis David Private Aug.2nd 1864 3 Yrs. Deserted Nov.6th 1864.

Devers John Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

**** Devlin Frank** (Co. TYRONE). Sergt. Mustered in aged 23 Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Joined up Oct 31st 1861. Fought at Gettysburg. Wounded at Fredericksburg Dec.13th 1862. Re-enlisted at Stevensburg Va, Deserted April 18th 1864 at Chester Pa, Dark complexion 5ft 9ins hazel eyes, brown hair and labourer by trade. Some rolls have his name as Francis.

**** Diamond Peter (Co. DERRY)** Private Enlisted Sept 18th 1861 3 Yrs Aged 33. Born Co. Derry Ireland circa 1830 probably in the Bellaghy area.. Killed at Mine Run-Locust Green Va. Nov. 27th 1863. Had brother Bernard in Co. K. Grave unknown as Sept 2017. Both he and his brother Bernard probably from around the Bellaghy town area of Co. Derry. Named as Dimond in P.A. Civil War card listings. Had fought at Gettysburg as did his brother Bernard. Was a married man wife Mary lived at Pine St. between Jefferson and Oxford Philadelphia.

**** Donahue James (Co. TYRONE)** Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg. Captured June 22nd 1864 Jerusalem Plank Road Petersburg . Sent to Andersonville but paroled to hospital care Savannah.

Then to College Green Barracks Annapolis Md but died same day. Buried National Cemetery Annapolis Md. Grave 1717 E-62- Pa. (Marker image)

* * **Donahue Patrick** (Co. TYRONE) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Spent time in hospital and was later discharged due health problems..

Donally James Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs.Deserted April 18th 1864.

Donnelly Thomas Private Sept. 1st 1861 3 yrs. Enlisted Philadelphia 1st.Sep.2nd. 1861 mustered in 31st Oct. Camp Observation. Not on muster out rolls.

* * **Donovan John** (Co. CORK) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs.Born in Co. Cork Ireland: Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Absent at Muster out.

Douglass William Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs.Not on muster out roll.

* * **Duffy James** (Co. DONEGAL) Sergt. Aug 23rd 1861 3 Yrs Born Lettermacaward parish north of Glenties town west Co. Donegal Ireland 10th Aug 1839 probably in Dooey townland. Fought at Gettysburg. Transferred to Ambulance Corps Feb 29th 1864. Mustered out Aug. 19th 1864 expiration of term. Died Philadelphia July 7th 1916 aged 76. Was a marble polisher by trade though in last 20 years of his life worked in the Philadelphia Mint. Had a damaged left hand due to work accident though one descendant states was a wound from Gettysburg. He had also fought in the Peninsular Campaign, Antietam, and Fredericksburg. Active interest in Army affairs after the war. Was member of Gus Town Post No. 46 G.A.R.. Was a member of St. Patricks Church at 26th and Locust Street. Funeral from home of his son James Jnr. 2317 Christian St. He was survived by wife and two other sons Michael and George and daughters Mary Mehrman and Sara Gorman. Also a son an officer in the Philadelphia Police Sergt John J. Duffy of the 20th and Federal St. precinct. James wife named as Sarah (nee Martin of Malin Head Donegal) in Philadelphia. One source states James and his brother Patrick emigrated from Derry to Philadelphia in 1854 on the ship Libuina in 1854. James would have be aged about 15years. Joined 69th Pa Inf at Philadelphia 23rd. Aug. 1861. Mustered in Camp Observation Md. 31st Oct.1861. Date of prom. to Sergt. unknown. Had married Sarah Martin Malin Head Co. Donegal in Philadelphia. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetery along with wife Sarah. Sarah lived 1843-1925. Both buried Plot S-5-45-M.(See bio on another page). +.

* * **Elliott James** (Co. FERMANAGH) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded and captured at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Died at Andersonville Ga. of diarrhoea July 2nd 1864 aged 28 .Grave 2,794. From the town land of Connfanmoge near Maguiresbridge Co. Fermanagh. Born 1st May 1836 son of Alexander Elliott and Annie (Harte). Ammie died Feb. 1847. James and Annie the soldiers mother married in Maguires Bridge Co Fermanagh Church of Ireland 1833 . Was unmarried when he died at Andersonville . Marker erected to his memory there. Marker 2794.

Fay Michael Capt. Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Ireland. Prom. from Private Co to 2nd Lieut May 1st 1863, to 1st Lieut Oct. 4th 1864., to Capt May 22nd 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Died 18th Aug. 1906 aged 84. Buried in Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia. Was tailor by trade. Fathers name was Eugene. Michael was widower at his death. Buried Aug 22nd 1906. Wrote the song *The Gallant 69th*.

This tune set to the air of McKennys lament. Survived the war and is buried in the Old Cath. cemetery Philadelphia.

Fellows William J Private Aug.9th 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

Ferery Ernest Private Aug.9th 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

Finnigan Francis Private Aug 31st 1861 3 Yrs.Died at Camp Observation Md. Suffering same fate as Thomas McManus below. Finnegan left a wife Catherine in Philadelphia who died in 1863 leaving orphan son Franklin aged 5.

Flanely (Flannery) James Private Aug.23rd 1861 3 Yrs Named also as Flannery . Enlisted aged 21. Discharged 2nd Dec 1864 by order of Major Gilbert.

Fox John M Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Discharged by Gen. Order July 17th 1865. John M. Fox was born May 29th 1842. Initially joined Co H 71st Pa and then transferred to Co. D. the 69th Pa when the 71st disbanded in June 1864. Married twice. Firstly to Annie B Fitterer with whom he had a family. (1846-1877). Annie died young and he re-married Sarah Matterness (1846-1917). No children from 2nd marriage. John was plasterer by trade. John died Sept 19th 1919. He was buried from his sons home . He was a member of St Marks Reformed Church. He was buried in Mount Lebanon Cemetery Lebanon, Lebanon Co. Pa. Plot Section H. He had been a charter member of the Liberty Fire Co.

Freel Michael Private Mar.25th 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

Freese George Private Aug.9th 1861 3Yrs Mustered out Aug. 9th 1864 expiration of term.

Gallagher James 1st Lieut Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Ireland: Prom. from Private to Sergt. Feb 1st 1864. Wounded at Cold Harbour June 3rd and Reams Station Aug 25th 1864. Comm 1st Lieut June 16th. Not mustered. Mustered out July 1st 1865. Buried in Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. James was killed by a drunken attacker in a public house in Philadelphia in 1880. His death was noted in the Philadelphia Inquirer Feb. 9th 1880. He was as a morocco dresser in Philadelphia. Born 1838.*.

*** * Gallagher Jeremiah (Co. DONEGAL)** Sergt. Aug.1831 3 Yrs Born Co. Donegal Ireland 1838. Enlisted 6 .9.1861 at Philadelphia aged 23 mustered in as Corp. Camp Observation 31.10.1861 Killed Gettysburg 3rd July 1863 fighting alongside Capt Chas.McAnally. Mc Anally wrote a letter to Mrs Hand on the 5th of August two days after the battle. He mentions that Jeremiah Gallagher was killed in the skirmishing along with Sergt. Hand and several other soldiers in the group. Jeremiah left a wife Sarah whom he married in St Francis Xavier church Fairmount Philadelphia 1st Jan 1860 by Rev. Patrick Rafferty. Daughter Abigaile born 25th Dec 1860. received pension after mother died. His wife died Feb 5th 1862 . Jeremiah was killed at Gettysburg 3rd.July 1863 and Abigail left in the care of a John Boner probably a family friend if not a relative. Buried in National Cemetery Gettysburg Pa section D-12 . Information from a descendant states that Gallagher emigrated to the States from Donegal 1859.

Garvan Thomas Private Oct. 31st 1862 3 yrs. Enlisted Philadelphia 11.9.1861 aged 26 light complexion 5ft 5ins. Grey eyes, a brick maker by trade. Born Philadelphia. Deserted Harpers Ferry Oct.19th. 1862.

Gibson James Private Aug.9th 1861 3 Yrs. Mustered out Aug 9th 1864

expiration of term.

Gillen Emmanuel Corp Feb 16th 1864 3 Yrs. Wounded at Petersburg June 18th 1864. Prom. to Corp May 1st 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

*** * Glackin Peter (Co. TYRONE).** Private Aug. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland:

Gossert Henry J Private. Enrolled and mustered in at Spottsylvania Pa Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Received a \$6 pension due to what are described as Dis. Abd Viscera problems. Was a married man and a carpenter by trade. Had been discharged by Gen. Order June 14th 1865. Died 7th Aug. 1908. Buried in Mount Lebanon Cemetery Lebanon Pa. Plot Section H. Was buried from his home in 411 Lehman St. Lebanon. He pre-deceased his fellow Co. D soldier John M. Fox by 11 years Both buried in the same plot Section H.

Greene John Private Aug 31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Yorktown Va May 5th 1862.

Greene Patrick Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Feb 13th 1863.

Greenhelgh John Private July 9th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out July 1st 1864 expiration of term.

Haley Francis Private April 21st 1863 3 Yrs Deserted Feb. 2nd 1864.

Hammond John F. Private Aug. 28th. 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out Aug 24th 1864 expiration of term.

*** * Hand James (Co. LOUTH)** Sergt. Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co Louth Ireland: Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Initially buried George Herting farm and later National Cemetery Gettysburg but plot unknown (May 2014). The Hand family and McAnally family were well known to each other in Philadelphia pre war. So much that only two days after Gettysburg McAnally wrote a letter to Hands wife back in Philadelphia expressing his sorry and explaining what happened on that fateful day.

Haney John (Hancy James) This mans name has caused confusion due to errors in the paperwork and probably stonemason errors. There man is buried in plot 473 of the Cypress National Cemetery in Brooklyn N.Y. stating he was a member of Co. K of the 69th. Pa . died 13th Oct 1862. The only record that seems to exist is that for a marker invoice from a firm called Lee in Mass to the Q.M Office in Wash D.C. dated 15th March 1937 for what appears to be a replacement marker for Pvt. James Hancy Co F 69th Pa who died Oct 13th 1862 and for grave 473. Later checks show that the marker shown on FAG was in fact a replacement marker circa 1917 and his name had been wrongly spelt as Hancy. He had enlisted 31.10.1861 at Philadelphia. Wounded in the Peninsular Campaign. Hospitalised at Ft. Monroe. In the P.A. Civil War cards it is spelt John Haney which I think is the correct spelling. Also ties up with the fact that he was in the local military hospital at the time wounded. Hence his burial in Brooklyn with other colleagues from the 69th Pa who died around the same time.

Hanlon Thomas Nestor Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll. Buried Calvery Cemetery Allegheny Co. Pa. Died 29th. Jan 1913

Henry Michael (McElwee). Private Sept 12th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged by Gen. Ord.

June 12th 1865. Used the alias McElwee for whatever reason. Wife named Margaret. Died May 19th 1891. On his discharge notes he was noted as being “for insanity ” on 12th June 1865. Aged 25 on enrolment. (Probably for shell shock really not identified at the time)

**** Hennigen James (Henigen) (Co. FERMANAGH).** Corp Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out Sept 10th 1864. expiration of term. Born 1836 Died Sept 19th 1886 Oxford Warren N.J. A married man and a puddler by trade Buried St Rose of Lima Cemetery Oxford N.J. No marker known. Also known on records as Hannigan or Hinnigan. Born Co. Fermanagh Ireland.

**** Harvey James** (Co. DERRY) Capt.Oct.31st.1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Derry Ireland. Said to have come to America via Argentina then New Orleans to Philadelphia. He and Capt Charles McAnally did a train trip in Aug. 1861 between Philadelphia and Danville on a recruiting mission. Resigned Oct. 31st 1862. He had as a business established a shoe and leather business in the Port Richmond area of Philadelphia at 157 Willow St. Was heavily involved in the establishment of the 69th. One of his more notable recruits was Private Hugh Bradley from Co. Tyrone. Bradley lived in Phoenixville west of Philadelphia. Jams attended Col. Dennis O'Kanes funeral. Was married to Catherine Quigley. Died Philadelphia Feb. 7th 1887. Buried in family plot Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. (Photo)

**** Haughey John (Co. TYRONE)** Private Aug.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Wounded and captured at Petersburg June 22nd 1864. Had fought Gettysburg. Died Sept 27th 1864 of scorbutus. Buried at Andersonville Ga Sept.27th 1864.Grave No.9904. McDermott lists his death as Sept. 5th 1864

Hayes Thomas Corp. June 12th 1864 3 Yrs Born Wash D.C. circa 1845. Enlisted 71st Pa 9th March 1861. He was aged 22, . 5ft 3ins tall light hair fair complexion blue eyes. Transferred to Co. D 69th Pa 12th June 1864 . Prom. Corp. March 1st 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. He then joined Co I of the 5th. U.S. cavalry. Nothing as now known of his service in the 5th Cavalry but would appear to have lived in Latah Idaho and that an obituary notice exists for him. He died 8th Oct 1900 and is buried in Boise Barracks Military cemetery Boise Idaho. (Photo of marker).

Hayes William Private Aug.31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863.

Henerty John Private Jan 6th 1865 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co July 1st 1865.

Hopkins James W.A. Private Aug.13th 1863 3 Yrs Substitute. Discharged by Gen. Order Aug.16th 1865.Buried Hampton National Cemetery Hampton City Va. Plot 9301. Died April 5th 1907.

Hughes John Private April 25th 1864 3 Yrs. Born Ireland. Discharged by Gen. Order July 1st 1865.

Jacobs Christian Private Initially joined the 71st Pa. July 8th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out Jan 19th 1865. Died in Philadelphia 4th Nov 1912. Buried in the Mount Vernon Cemetery Philadelphia. Died aged 88. Son of Nicholas Jacobs 2833 8th St. 43rd Ward. Wife Anna E. Jacobs. He was a member of E. D. Baker Post No. 8 G.A.R. Lived at 2833 8th St. He was a tailor by trade. Born in Alsace France March 1st 1827. Spent basically the whole war in and out of hospital. Had transferred to the 69th Pa. June 12th 1864 left July 8th 1864. Died Nov 1912

Jeffries William Born Philadelphia 9th July 1819 son of English immigrant Robert Jeffries and Elizabeth Edgar from Ireland. Enlisted in Col. Bakers 71st Pa. Regt Co. D. 1st July 1861. Served as a wagoner Co. D of the 71st. Later transferred to Co D of the 69th Pa Infantry . He rose to the rank of wagon master in the regimental transport section. He had been promoted Sergt. after the battle of Petersburg . His enlistment papers state that he was 5ft 8ins tall with a dark complexion and trade as a rope maker. Mustered out June 30th 1864 at Petersburg Va. expiration of term. He had married Phoebe Haines 13th Jan 1842 the ceremony being conducted by the Rev. Charles Reese in Philadelphia. William and his family ended up living in Bristol Pa. where William became successful in property dealing and ownership. He died 10th Feb 10th 1895 and is buried with his wife and son Andrew and his wife in Bristol cemetery. Son Andrew (Jackson) Jeffries also served in the Civil war in Co. D of the 196th Regt.

Jenkins Charles H Private Aug. 31st. 1861 3 Yrs. Killed in action 3rd July 1863 Gettysburg. Stomach wound. From Minersville Pa. Buried Minersville Union Cemetery Minersville Pa. Born England April 5th 1823 ..

Jones Robert Private April 25th 1864 3 Yrs. Discharged by Gen. Order July 1st 1861.

Kelly Daniel Joined as a substitute Sergt. July 17th 1863 3 Yrs, Aged 22. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. One source states Daniel died 23.1.1909 Buried in Washington Soldiers Home Cemetery Orting Wash. Plot 2.1.2 Another source states Daniel entered the 71st. Pa. Inf. on July 17th 1863 and transferred to the 69th July 1864. Was member of Germanstown Ellis Post 6 GAR. Another source states he started in Co. H of the 71st Pa. then transferred to Co. D of the 69th in June 1864. After muster out he spent a year in the Marines then worked as labourer on railroad until blinded during rock blasting. Said to have spent the end of his life in Old Soldiers home in Elizabeth Va.

* * **Kelly Michael (Co. DERRY)** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co Derry Ireland: Wounded at Gettysburg July 2nd. 1863. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

* * **Kelly Patrick (Co. DONEGAL)** Sergt. Oct 31st 1861 3Yrs.Wounded at Fredericksburg Va Dec.13 1862. Prom. from Private to Sergt. Oct 31st 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. After four years with the 69th Pa. He then served 4 years in the U.S. Marines and at the end of his life in what was the Bay View nursing home in Baltimore Md. (today part of the John Hopkins Hospital Complex). When he was not in the hospital at Bay View he was living in a “flophouse” at Lombard and Concord down near the harbour an area then filled with these dwellings. William lived in a “flophouse” owned by a John Flynn who cashed Williams pension cheques to pay for his rent and board. When Parrick Kelly died 15th Oct. 1893 the Superintendent of the Asylum wrote to the Pension Bureau informing them of his death and that the man running the “flophouse” John J Flynn “keepes one of those --- dives in this city and boards an old man for his pension”. He goes on to ward the Pension Office that Mr Flynn may well try to keep collecting Kellys pension and that he would not be entitled to do so.. He then urges the Pension Office to ensure his name is dropped off the pension list. A sad ending for an old

man who had fought at Gettysburg, and Fredericksburg and carried the wounds to end up his days in extreme poverty in a Baltimore "flophouse". (Let us not judge him too harshly R.I.P Patrick).

*** * Kennedy James + (Co. SLIGO)** Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Sligo Ireland 27th Jan 1839 Died July 19th 1913. Discharged Jan. 1st 1863 for bad wounds received at Antietam Md. Sept.17th 1862. Buried in St Michaels Cemetery Bethelam Northampton Co. Pa. Sec 3 Range 1 18 S.W. Wife and he had family of 14 many of whom died very young. Was a labourer by trade.

Kolan George F. Private Aug.1st 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out Aug 7th 1864 expiration of term.

*** * Leary Dennis (Co. CORK)** Corp Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Cork Ireland: Health problems and eventually transferred to Vet. Res. Corps Nov 20th 1863. Entered the Pa. DVS home Pa. 16.10 1884 aged 52. Was in and out of this Home at the end of his life. No information as to where he and his wife are buried. On July 16th 1870 census of Scranton Pa. Shows Denis and his wife Honora aged 38 and 40 living in the city. Both shown born Ireland. A labourer by trade. In a census of 1880 they are living in Dunmore in Lakawanna Co Pa. One source states he died 20th May 1897 and had been a miner

Lelve Richard Private Aug.31st 1861 for 3 Yrs. Died at Fortress Monroe Va July 1862.

Loudenslager A Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

Lucy Cornelius Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Jan 11th 1863. Born 1817 Ireland. Died Philadelphia Feb 12th 1871. Discharged surgeons cert Jan 11th 1863. Buried Old St Michaels Cemetery Philadelphia Section 5 Row 200. Had died Feb 13th 1863.

Maely Daniel Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

Mair William Private July 1st 1863 3 Yrs. Substitute. Discharged by Gen. Ord July 13th 1865.

Mallon James Sergt Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged Jan 9th 1863 for wounds received at Antietam Sept.17th 1862.

*** * McAnally Charles (Co. DERRY)** Capt M.O.H. Aug.19th 1861 3 Yrs Born Glenviggan Draperstown Co. Derry Ireland: See extensive information on Web pages. Brother to Peter. M.O.H. winner and only one in the unit to do so. Was the original Orderly Sergt. (Photo) See webpage on him. Died in Wash. D.C, Asylum Hospital Aug 8th 1905 buried in Potters Field somewhere in the immediate area 10th Aug 1905. Names himself as Charles McNally in latter days of his life.

McAnally Patrick Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Promoted to Corp B Co. Date unknown.

*** * McAnally Peter (Co. DERRY)** Sergt. Mar. 6th 1863 3 Yrs. Born See extensive information on Web pages. Born Glenviggan townland Draperstown Co. Derry. Brother to Charles. M.O.H. Survived the war and buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia Plot Section M Range 11 Grave 2W. Family grave with wife Elizabeth Brother Edward and son Edward. Member of Germanstown Ellis Post 6 GAR. Peter died in Philadelphia 11th. Dec. 1917. He had been discharged along with brother Charles at Munsons Hill Va. 1st July 1865. His obituary notice dated

December 1817 states “ PETER MCANALLY BURIED. Midvale Steel Company Superintendent Succumbs to Pneumonia. The funeral of Peter McAnally who died of pneumonia was held on Saturday. Services were held at 10 o'clock in the Cathedral Church of St. Vincent de Paul and the interment was made in New Cathedral Cemetery. Mr McAnally is survived by four children. Mrs R. J. Graham of San Francisco Elanor, Regina and Joseph McAnally. Mr McAnally was one of the most expert steel men in the country was born in Ireland in 1845 and came to this country when 8 years old. For 50 years he was connected with the Midvale Steel Company rising to the position of superintendent of the crucible plant where the highest grade steel is turned out. He was a veteran of the Civil War having fought with the 69th Pennsylvania Volunteers. He was a sergeant in this company. Mr McNally was a member of Ellis Post No. 6 the sons of St Patrick the Knights of Columbus and the British Iron and Steel Institute. He was also prominent in several building and loan associations. His wife died 21 years ago In 1911 Mr. McAnally was one of the Republican nominees for Common Council but he was not elected. Died 11 Sec 1917

McAnany Daniel Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**** McAnany Peter** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born 1836 Co. Derry Ireland: Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864 having gunshot to right thigh. Missed Gettysburg but served until discharged for wound Oct. 3rd 1864. After the war he married Bridget Rice on Oct. 4th 1874 who had been married to another 69th soldier who had died a John McArlane (Note: Probably McErlane) and McAnany was another McAnally. Peter died March 30th 1892. Buried in New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.

McAnespay Dennis. Private. Enrolled aged 45 at Philadelphia 5.9.1861. Mustered in 21.10.1861. Various and wrongly named as either Mc Nasby or McNasky in P.A. Civil war cards and other Civil war publications. This error only corrected recently by direct reference to his official war papers. Dennis a married man with three children Catharine born 1849, Susan born 1851 and Michael born 1854. From Philadelphia he was shot and died instantly when on scouting patrol in woods near Great Bethel near Cold Harbour Va April 6th 1862. Road between Fort Monroe and Yorktown. His grave whereabouts is unknown as now. Spelling of names varies. Name found mainly Co. Tyrone. (See bio)

McAvoy James Private July 1st 1863 3 Yrs. Never joined Co.

McCabe James Sergt. Enlisted Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia. Had married Nov. 26th 1862 Eliza Buckley in the Church of the Redemption Philadelphia. Eliza died April 8th 1902. No family.

**** McCann James** (Co. TYRONE). Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland. Enlisted Philadelphia 24.8.1861. Killed aged 23 at Gettysburg. Buried Gettysburg National Cemetery. Plot Pa. D-10. Note there seems to be confusion about this. Some sources state that though his marker says James McManus it is in fact the grave of James McCann.

McCarnby John Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

McCarter Warren B. Corp July 12th 1861 3 Yrs. Enlisted at Philadelphia.

Mustered out July 1st 1864 expiration of term. Born April 6th 1840 Died March 7th 1891. Buried Norris City Cem Norristown Mont Co. Pa. Section K. Single man and a butcher by trade. Died aged 50 from T.B. Would appear to have been initially in the 71st Pa and maybe a drafted soldier.

McCartney Peter Private April 19th 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

*** * McCarty James (Co. SLIGO)** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Sligo Ireland: Enlisted Philadelphia aged 21 23rd. Aug 1861 Re-enlisted 1.2.1864. Wounded on left hand 12.5.1864 at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864. Fought at Gettysburg. Discharged and pensioned off due to wounds.

McClaine William. Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Died May 26th 1864 of wounds received at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864 Buried in the National Cemetery Arlington Va. Plot 27 Site 264. Born in Scotland in 1820 (name possibly was McLean) Hospitalised in Wash. D.C. but died there. Lost right leg.

McCleran John Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

*** * McCloskey James (Co. SLIGO)** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born in Co. Tyrone Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Had enlisted Philadelphia aged 32 in 1861.

McCulligan George Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

*** * McErlane Charles (Co. DERRY)** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Derry Ireland: Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Was shell shocked. Mustered out Aug. 27th 1864. It was later reported he had died in the Brazilian jungle when in S. America..

McGinley James 2nd Lieut. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at North Anna River Va. May 26th 1864. Prom.2nd Lieut. Nov.11th 1864. Killed at Hatchers Run Feb.5th 1865. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. Section O Range 6 Grave 729 2nd from left. Born 1941 Ireland. Had been wounded N. Anna River Va Feb 5th 1865

*** * McHugh Joseph Henry (Co. TYRONE).** 1st Lieut Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Drumnabey near Castlederg Co. Tyrone Ireland: Killed aged 23 at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Only son of William and Anne McHugh. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia. Grave marked .Plot F-4-60-M.

*** * McKee Francis (Co. ARMAGH)** Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born in Co. Armagh Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg. Mustered out Aug.24th 1864 expiration of term. Buried New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.. Died Philadelphia Aug 28th 1892

McKeever Patrick Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Enlisted Philadelphia 31.8 1861 and mustered in same day at Camp Observation Md . Aged 30. Not on muster out roll.

McKenna James Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Mar 2nd 1865 from lung disease. Fought throughout the war including Gettysburg. Wife Ann and was a labourer by trad.

McKenna William Private July 1st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged by Gen. Ord. date unknown. Died in Philadelphia by fall from scaffolding. Was a bricklayer. Wife name Theresa. Died May 15th 1884. Buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. Was born in Philadelphia. Started off in the 71st Pa. but later re-

enlisted in the 69th. Pa in 1864. Born 1834 Philadelphia. Lived 216 Mifflin St. Buried plot Section J Range 3 Lot 32 2nd from West. @.

McManus Thomas Private 27th. Aug. 1861 3 Yrs. Mustered in 31st. Oct. 1861 Aged 21. Died at Camp Observation Md. Feb. 21st 1862. A rather tragic death due to the consumption of poisoned alcohol bought at nearby Poolesville on an agreed evening furlough along with colleagues Finnegan and Stokes who also suffered the same tragic end to their young lives. They had in civilian life worked at the iron mills at Danville.

McNasby Dennis (See McAnespy)

* * **McPeak James** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born in the townland of Derrygarve near Toomebridge Co. Derry Ireland. He joined the regiment in Philadelphia Oct 31st 1861. Transferred to Reserve Corp Sept. 12th 1863. It is not known if he fought at Gettysburg as he was ill around the beginning of July 1863. He was hospitalised for a time at Frederick Md. James survived the war returned home married and died in old age. Buried in the McPeake family grave St Trea's church Newbridge Co. Derry. He applied for a pension when he was home and was given \$12 per month in 1904. James died aged 83 Feb 20th 1913. Headstone erected to him on family grave Nov. 2009. He is at this date Nov 2009 the only soldier of the 69th who is positively known to have returned home to Ireland. Another soldier in the Regiment a Martin McPeak may well have been a relative. The Stinson and Henfy soldiers also noted in the Regiment would have been his immediate neighbours in Ireland. Research shows that he served at Elmira Prison Camp after he joined the VRC.

McQuade Michael Private Mar. 26th 1864 3 Yrs Wounded and captured at Boydton Rd. Va. Oct. 27th 1864. Absent at muster out.

McSeaman Hugh Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 yrs. Died June 15th of wounds received at Fair Oaks Va. May 31st. 1862.

McVay James Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at the Wilderness Va May 5th 1864.

* * **McWilliams John** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Had joined aged 36.

* * **Mellon James** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged Mar. 7th 1863 for wounds received at Antietam Sept 7th 1862. Born Co. Derry

Merchant James Private July 27th 1861 3 Yrs. Mustered out Aug. 26th 1864 expiration of term. Initially served in the 71st Pa Co's M and C. Transferred to 69th Pa June 12th 1864 until Aug 23rd 1864 then mustered out. Born Philadelphia Jan 16th 1842 and died in Philadelphia June 17th 1918 buried Hillside Cem. Roslyn Mont Co. Pa. Married man wife Nellie. 1856-1932

Miller Lawrence Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

Minor Andrew Private July 1st 1861 3 Yrs Substitute. Never joined Co.

Monaghan John J. Private Mar. 20th 1864 3 Yrs. Promoted to Q.M. Sergt. Jan 8th 1865.

Morris Francis Private July 27th 1861 3 Yrs. Initially in the 71st Regt, He had enrolled Co. C. of the 71st in Philadelphia 1st July 1861 and mustered in 18th 9. 1861 at Iron Bridge Va. He was aged 20. He then transferred to Co. D of the 69th

Pa 12.6.1864 and served as a waggoner for remainder of the ward. Died in Indiana 18th 3.1891. Buried in the Marion Cemetery Grant Co. Ind. Buried Section 1. Row 3. Plot 321/R3. He had mustered out Sept. 10th 1864 expiration of term.

*** * Mullen Charles (McMullen)** (Co. ANTRIM). Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Enlisted aged 25. Born Co. Antrim Ireland probably around the Toomebridge area at the N.W. corner of Lough Neagh on the Co.'s Derry-Tyrone interface. circa 1834. Arrived in America in 1851 aged about 17 years of age. Lived in Pottsville Pa where he worked as a puddler in a steel mill. Enlisted at Poolsville Pa. into Co. D. of the 69th Pa. Charles was hit on the skull by a shell fragment at the battle of Antietam Md. 17.9.1862 and left with paralysed right arm and facial sensory problems On Jan 2nd 1863 he was transferred to Hospital No 1 Frederick Md. His condition never really changed and he was discharged from the service June 8th 1863 on \$8 per month pension. He was re examined on Sept 4th 1867 by the pension surgeon who reported his condition was still the same and he would probably never recover, However he went on to marry and raise three children. He died in Danville Pa 12th Nov 1899. He is buried with his wife Sarah in the Odd Fellows Cemetery Danville Section D. Lot 296. His wife was from Columbia Co. Pa. (See marker image).

Murray Dennis Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland circa 1832. Was in the States by 1853. Married Mary ? in Gloucester City N.J. Had two children Catherina and Bernard . Joined the 69th Pa. in Philadelphia aged 33 on Oct. 31st 1861. Fought at the battles of Savage Station, Glendale. Became sick on march from Harrisons Landing to Newport News Va. Hospitalised and returned to Regt Oct 1862. Hospitalised again during march to Gettysburg June 15th 1863. Transferred to the Columbine Hospital Wash. D.C. Transferred to the Invalid Coprs June 16th 1863 10th Co. 2nd Batt. Mustered out but where unknown. His wife endeavoured to get pension post war but was refused. Appears that he may well not have returned home and became untraceable. The family initially lived at Filbert St (Philadelphia 1860 census).

*** * Murray John (Co. CAVAN)** Corp Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co Cavan Ireland: Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864. Fought Gettysburg. Mustered out Sept.10th 1864 expiration of term.

*** * Nellis John (Co. DERRY)** Private Oct.10th 1862 3 Yrs. Born Co. Derry Wounded at Fredericksburg Dec 13th 1862. Discharged by Gen. Order June 12th 1865.

Nestor John Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded in leg at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Wounded in abdomen, left leg and left thigh at the battle of The Wilderness Discharged Dec 1st 1864 expiration of term.

Nicholas Albert Boy musician July 1st 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out July 1st 1864. Born March 25th 1846 died March 5th 1882. Buried Old Eden Lake Cemetery Eden Valley Stearns Co. Minn.

*** * O'Connor Patrick (Co. CORK)** Corp Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Wounded at Gettysburg July 2nd 1863. Deserted Oct. 4th 1863.. Was listed in the Old Soldiers Home Dunmore Pa 1890. Buried in the Cathedral Cemetery Scranton Lakawanna Co Pa Section CW lot 2. Born Co. Cork Ireland 1840 died 1892. A single man an a labourer by trade. 5ft 9 ins tall. Mustered in 23.8.1861. Made Corporal July

1862. Wounded in right angle at Gettysburg by shrapnel. Deserted from hospital 4th Oct 1863. On March 6th 1899 was noted as living at Dunmore Pa. Wife Mary and two children Timothy and Cecelia..

O'Connor Timothy 1st Lieut Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Promoted from 2nd Lieut Sept 18th 1882. Discharged Jan 11th 1863. Capt Charles McAnally M.O.H. gave O'Connors name on an affidavit for a pension claim by McAnally made from Germanstown Philadelphia in Jan 1864.

O'Neill Terrence Private enrolled Philadelphia aged 34 on Sept 9th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded in arm at Fredericksburg Dec. 13th 1862. Absent at muster out.

Owen Hugh Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

Patton Charles Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Oct. 19th 1864.

Paugh William Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Sick throughout the war . Absent sick at muster out. Died April 27th 1890. Buried Odd Fellows cemetery Danville Montour Co. Pa.

Riley Hugh Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Not on muster out roll.

Roach Levi Private July 15th 1863 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

Roach Michael Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged Oct. 28th for wounds received at Antietam Md Sept 17th 1862. Died March 16th 1895 aged 72. His wife was Margaret Coleman who died Jan 26th 1899 aged 65. Both buried in St Alphonsus Catholic Cemetery Hopewell Mercer Co. N.J.

Robinson Barney Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll

*** * Rodgers Charles (Born Gortin Co. TYRONE 1835)** Enlisted as. Oct. 31st 1861 for 3 Yrs.: Fought at Gettysburg. Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864. and Hatcher's Run March 15th 1865. Also wounded by rifle shot hitting his left foot while engaged in tearing up the Weldon railroad at Weldon Va. At Fort Davis Va 1st. Oct. 1st 1864 he was hit on the upper right hand side of his head . He was promoted Sergt. Oct. 31s 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. He returned to Ireland and married a Rose Gillen on April 20th 1879 he being aged 44 and she 20. They went back to America and settled in Danville Pa. until he died there May 9th 1892 Buried St Josephs Church Cemetery Danville Pa. Lot 44. Wife applied for pension July 9th 1892. Charles and his wife were married April 20th 1879 at Gortin. By Father Hagarty and the two witnesses were Simon and Jane Morris. Note name spelling may vary either Rogers or Rodgers. They had a son called Dominic C Rogers 1885-1950. Dominic fought in WW1 as a Pvlte in the 103rd Engineers. Buried in same cemetery as his parents. Perhaps same grave. @ M.

Rogers Edward Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

Rodgers James (Co DONEGAL) Private Enrolled aged 30 at Philadelphia 7.9.1861. M.I. Camp observation Md. 31.10.1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Sept 8th 1863. Muster out roll shows age as 42. Note name spelling may vary either Rogers or Rodgers.

*** * Shaw James (Co. ANTRIM)** Private. Enlisted in 9.9.1861. Philadelphia aged 21. Discharged 4.9.1864. Died young aged 29 from pneumonia . Watchman by trade. Buried Mount Moriah cemetery Philadelphia. May 22nd 1868. His wife Margaret also born Ireland died aged 60 May 30th 1900 aged 60 from same disease as late husband.. Buried Section 127 Lot 63. One note in possession gives plot No. Section

116 Row 204 plot 3. @

Sex Michael (Saxe) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Mar 23rd 1863. Admitted to Soldiers Home on 8/2/1875. Injury to his left leg, ulcer and rheumatism. Born in Ireland in 1823. Died at the age of 75 on 12th Oct. 1898 at the Soldiers Home hospital from menigo-encephalitis. He was single, a labourer by trade and of the Catholic religion. Last resided in Chicago, IL. Next of kin: Brother, William Sex of Fox Lake, WI. Source: Old Soldiers Home book citing deaths 1864-1900 by Dr. Jeanette L. Jerger and Historical Registers of Nat'l. Homes for Disabled Vol. Soldiers 1866-1938. Born Ireland 1825 and died Oct 12th 1898. Buried in the Calvary Cemetery and Mausoleum Milwaukee Milwaukee Co. Missouri. The unusual name is probably a corrupt Anglicised version of the Irish name O'Seasnain also known as Sexton. Name on his grave marker is Saxe. Buried Block 5E Row 519N. He had been discharged on the surgeons certificate March 23rd 1863.

Shields Charles Corp Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom Corp. Oct.31st 1864.Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

* * **Shields Christopher** (Co. TYRONE) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Deserted at Glendale June 29th 1862. Paroled and later deserted.

* * **Smith William** (Co. CORK) Corp Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Cork Ireland: Deserted April 18th 1864.

Spence William Private July 15th 1864 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

Stewart Charles Private Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs Prom. Corp Co. E date unknown.

Stewart James B. Corp Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Nov.1st 1862.

Stokes Alexander (aka Patrick) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs Died at Poolesville Md. April 3rd 1862.On the monument at Poolesville Old Methodist Cemetery he is listed as Patrick. He is in fact buried the Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia .Section D (single grave). He was 37 .Buried March 7th. 1862. Death due to same cause as McManus and Finnegan also listed on this file. Born 1825 .Correct death March 3rd 1862 at Poolesville Md.

* * **Sullivan Stephen** (Co. CORK) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs Born Co. Cork Ireland 1827. Wounded at Gettysburg July 2nd 1863. Deserted Oct.24th 1863 survived the war and received a pension. Stephen was recruited by Capt. Charles McAnally during the "Danville" trip with Harvey. He went to Le Mars Iowa and raised 6 children Died there 27th Aug 1900 and buried in the Cavalry Cemetery Le Mars Plymouth Iowa. Worked for 40 year for the I.C.R.R.G. railways. Also known as John Sullivan.

* * **Street Dennis** (Co. CLARE) Private Mar.31st 1864 3 Yrs. Discharged Mar.16th 1865 for wounds received in action May 30th 1864. Born Co Clare. Enlisted aged 27 dark complexion, 5ft 4 ½" grey eyes .Weaver by trade. Transferred from Co. F 71st Pa, 31.3.1864 at Stevensburg.

Tage James M. Private Feb 4th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged by Gen. Ord. May 16th 1865. Buried in the Evergreen Cemetery, Lambertton Burlington Co. N.J. Recorded as having black hair, hazel eyes dark complexion and machinist by trade. P.A. Civil war cards show hi also linked to 71st Pa on same enlistment day. Looks like he was

transferred from 69th to 71st. However not in the general transfer of 71st soldiers which took place later when the 71sts was disbanded.

*** * Tenerty Patrick (Co. LOUTH)** Enlisted Danville aged 26 as private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yr. Born 1838 .Discharged March 2nd 1864 due war wounds. Lost sight of left eye at the Peach Orchard Va. 29th June 1862. Later badly wounded losing four fingers right hand 13th Dec 1862 Fredericksburg. His name had various spellings. Enlisted at Danville 10th Sept 1861 and mustered in Camp Observation Md 31st Oct 1861.. He is buried probably under the name Fenanty in the Old Greencastle Cemetery Dayton Ohio. Wife name Margaret. Lived in Shamokin Pa. Was a miner probably before and after the war. The spelling of his surname seems to vary in different documents. Named as Tenerty in the P.A. Civil War card listings.

Thomas James Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Oct.19th 1863.

Tibben Isaac E. Born 1846 Sergt. July 12th 1861 3 Yrs. Mustered out July 12th 1864 expiration of term. Initially in the 71st Pa where he reached Lieut rank. Born 1840 died April 29th 1921 at Fairford Pa aged 82. Buried East Cedar Hill Cemetery Philadelphia. Transferred to the 69th Pa June 12th 1864 as Sergt mustering out 12th July 1864. Member Ashworth G.A.R. Name varies Tibben Tibbens Tibbons.Had served in Co's C and M of the 71st Pa.

*** *Tinen Patrick S.** (Co. DERRY).Capt Sept 2nd 1861 3 Yrs. Tinen was the commander of D Co. Prom. from 1st Lieut. to Capt. Dec 7th 1862 before the battle of Fredericksburg. Prom to Major Oct.1st 1864. He also fought at Chancellorsville and Gettysburg. In civilian life was a paperhanger machinist and bartender in Philadelphia before the war. Noted as being from Ireland Co. Derry or Cork perhaps.

Trace Francis Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Oct.19th 1863.

Tracy Barney Private Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs Not on muster out roll.

Tye John Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted Aug.21st 1862.

Waters Michael Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Fredericksburg Dec 13th 1862.

Wilson William W. Private July 15ht 1864 3 Yrs Substitute. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. This man also served in Co. M 3rd U.S.Art. Co K U.S. Inf Co D 4th U.S. Cav and Co A and Co. C 18th U.S. Cav. According to his paperwork. Buried in plot J6417 U.S. Soldiers and Airmens Home Wash D.C.. Died Dec 19th 1893 at the home. He was from West Chester Pa. he had signed up as a substitute for \$125.00 on July 15th 1864. Deserted soon after getting bonus but returned under Presidents proclamation . Died 3rd Dec.1893.

Wood John Private Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs Deserted Sept. 1st 1862.(Same man as Co. I ?)
