**Anderson Alexander** Private Sept 14th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. May 15th 1862.

**Anderson William** Private Initially joined Co. C 71<sup>st</sup> Pa at Philadelphia 1<sup>st</sup> July 1861 and later transferred to Co. E. 69<sup>th</sup>. Pa 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864.

**Anderson William** Private 9<sup>th</sup> Sept 1861 at Philadelphia aged 33. Discharged on Surg Cert. 6<sup>th</sup> Aug 1864.

\* \* **Barnes Anthony** (Co. SLIGO) Private Sept 11th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Sligo Ireland around 1835. Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 and at Cold Harbour June 9th 1864. Died aged 52 at Philadelphia 18th Jan. 1886. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia. At Gettysburg wounded right arm and left leg. At Cold Harbour by minnie ball to head spent long time hospital Annapolis Md and discharged from there Sept 28<sup>th</sup> 1864. Mustered out Oct 28<sup>th</sup>. 1864. Died at Kensington Pa.

**Black William** Private July 1st 1861 3 Yrs Absent on detached service at muster out.

**Brennan Michael** Private Dec.6th 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted date unknown.

**Burge John** Private Jan 7th 1864 3 Yrs Substitute captured at Petersburg Va June 22nd 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Butterworth Benjamin** Private Feb.1st 1864 3 Yrs Absent sick on muster out.

**Carberry Patrick** Corp Aug.28th 1861. 3 Yrs. Captured at Fredericksburg Dec. 13th 1862.

\* \* **Carr Owen** (Co. TYRONE) Private enlisted aged 35 Aug 28th 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg. Wounded at Antietam Sept.17th 1862. Mustered out Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>. 1864 expiration of term. Name possibly Kerr?. Enrolled at Philadelphia.

\* \* **Casey Francis H.** (Co. WESTMASTER) 1st Sergt Nov 1st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. April 17th 1863. Born Co. Westmeath.

**Causey John** Sometimes spelt Cawsey Sergt Aug.26th 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Cold Harbour June 3rd 1864. Buried Cold Harbour National Cemetery Mechanicsville Hanover Co. Va. Plot 680

\* \* **Clements John** (Co. DERRY) Enlisted as private aged 30 Oct.31st 1864 3 Yrs From Co. Derry. Fought at Gettysburg. at The Wall. Also Glendale, Antietam. Fredericksburg, Was a labourer by trade. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Died

11<sup>th</sup> June 1916 aged 87. Lived 2062 E. Dauphin St Philadelphia. After Gettysburg he enlisted in the 1<sup>st</sup> Pa. Artillery until end of war. Buried Greenmount Cemetery Philadelphia. Was probably on invalidity pension. Died Philadelphia 11<sup>th</sup> June 1916  
### **Collins Michael** Private Sept 19<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged on Surgeons cert. Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> 1863. Died aged 65 8.10. 1875 from kidney disease. Wife names as Honora.

Lived at 2036 Lawrence St Philadelphia ward 19, Wife Honora lived 1819 -Dec 27<sup>th</sup> 1891. She was born in Ireland died Philadelphia 27.12 1891. Both buried Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia in position J-7-11 2 from east. @/

**Collins William H.** Musician Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll. William enrolled into Co. E at Philadelphia 2<sup>nd</sup> Sept 1861 and mustered in at Camp Obs Md 31<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861 as boy musician aged 15. Bates records he was not on muster out roll. However in his record cards it records William H Collins as having been in both Co E of the 69<sup>th</sup> and the Federal U.S. Navy and refers to Navy Cert. 22424. Died at Charlevoix Co. Michigan April 23<sup>rd</sup> 1915.

**Concliff William** Private Enlisted date unknown 3 Yrs . Re-enlisted Stevensburg Va. 1<sup>st</sup> Feb 1864. Absent sick at muster out.

**Copp Frederick** Private Aug. 9<sup>th</sup> 1864 3 Yrs Substitute. Mustered out with Co. July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865.

**Corley William** Private Feb. 1<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

### **Cummings Henry** Private Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Died Sept 18<sup>th</sup> 1864 at Philadelphia when on furlough from Summit Hill General Hospital where he was being treated for bowel and chest ailments. He was possibly also carrying wounds received at Gettysburg. Born Ireland 1828 Buried "Old" St. Michaels Cemetery Philadelphia. Note there are no markers still existing for the 69<sup>th</sup> soldiers buried in this cemetery. Note this is the "Old" St. Michaels cemetery.

**Deacon James** Private Aug 20<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Jan 11<sup>th</sup> 1862.

\* \* **Devlin James** (Co. TYRONE) Private Aug 19<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs :Wounded and captured at Antietam Md. Sept 17<sup>th</sup> 1862. Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House Va. May 12<sup>th</sup> 1864. On enrolment said he was a weaver by trade, was 5ft 10 ins. Light complexion, blue eyes. Promoted to Sergt. 3<sup>rd</sup> Sept 1861. Discharged 16<sup>th</sup> Jan 3<sup>rd</sup> Dec. 1864. Died in Philadelphia 16<sup>th</sup> Jan 1889 aged 69 from general senility. Trade at death a manufacturer. Wife name Sarah. Lived at 999 N. 6<sup>th</sup>. St . Buried in the New Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia Section L Range 4 No 16 West Margin.

**Devlin John** Capt.. Enrolled 19<sup>th</sup> Aug. 1861 at Philadelphia. Mustered in 31<sup>st</sup> Oct. 1861 as Pvte. at Camp Obs. Md. aged 22 Wounded at New Market Cross Roads 30. Oct. 1862. Had been promoted to Sergt. 1<sup>st</sup>. Feb 1865 and to Capt. 17<sup>th</sup> May 1865 and mustered out 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865. NOTE. This may well be a mistaken entry in the Pa, Civil war files due to mixing him up with the soldier below who was at a time discharged from this Company reduced in rank, However he was re-instated and upgraded to his original rank. On the face of it it does look like a mess up in Pa. records and it is the same man as below.

\* \* **Devlin John J** (Co. TYRONE) 1st Lieut. Aug. 19<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone

Ireland. Enlisted aged 19 Wounded and captured at Glendale Va. 30th June 1862. Treated by Confederate doctors and later exchanged., Wounded at Antietam Sept. 17th 1862. Prom. 2nd Lieut. April 10th 1863 to 1st Lieut June 5th 1863. Again wounded accidentally on Sept 25th 1863. Later during elections Devlin who was a staunch Democrat. was very concerned that perhaps though the votes were properly counted perhaps those who counted the votes could be a problem!!. With this in mind he accompanied the ballot boxes and kept a watching brief on the count. However politics apparently kicked in and he was later charged by the temporary commander Major Smith. He was found guilty and cashiered from the Army Nov 7th 1864. However he went back to Philadelphia and later rejoined the 69th as a private in the same Co. E. However though the war was nearing an end his fellow soldiers and a main body of officers petitioned Governor Curtin that his full rank be given back to him. This was done and he again 1st Lieut John J. Devlin. A tinsmith before the war in Philadelphia. John Joseph Devlin died in Philadelphia in June 6th 1869 aged just 32 from respiratory problems. . Buried June 9th 1869. His obituary in the P.I. June 9th 1869. An ardent Democratic Party supported all his life in both the army and civil life. Was an alderman in the 17th ward of the city. Weaver by trade. During Picketts charge at Gettysburg Devlin was the only officer in Co. E not killed or wounded. Devlin had initially been a member of the Irish militia company the Jackson Guards then the 69th Pa, He is buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia on position 0-2-17 2nd from west side @.

**\* \* Devlin Joseph** (Co. TYRONE) Private Aug. 26th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. May 9th 1865. Born Co. Tyrone. Labourer by trade. Enlisted aged 19.

**Donaldson Henry** Private Sept. 6th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. July 23rd 1863. Buried National cemetery Dayton Ohio.

**Donnelly Arthur** Private Aug 26th 1861 3 Yrs Enlisted Philadelphia 26th June 1861 mustered in 31st Oct. 1861. at Camp Observation. Aged 32. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Feb 28th 1863. Had served a three months enlistment.

**### Dougherty Hugh A** Private Enlisted aged 22 July 1st 1861 3 Yrs. Born Ireland 1842. Wounded Jerusalem Plank Road Petersburg 22.11. 1864. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. May 13th 1865. He had reenlisted at Stevensburg 22.11.1864. Died 17th April 1866 Buried plot Section 133 Lot 111 Row 2 Grave 9 Mt. Moriah Cemetery Philadelphia from the Old Soldiers Home 16th and Gilbert Philadelphia on 19th April 1866 aged 24. He had been admitted on April 17th and died the same day. Initially in the 71st Pa for three years. Lived in the 9th ward. Buried from Soldiers Home 16th and Gilbert.

**\* \* Dougherty James** (Co. DERRY) Private Sept 9th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland; 1836 Fought at Gettysburg. Enlisted Philadelphia Sept 10th 1861 aged 20 A blacksmith by trade. Mustered out Nov 2nd 1864 expiration of term. Born 1839 Died May 27th 1900. Height 5ft 6ins. Blue eyes hair sandy Buried in Holy Cross Cemetery Yeadon Del Co. Pa.

**\* \* Dougherty Patrick** (Co. Donegal) Private Mustered in Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs at Camp Observation Md. Aged 23 Deserted Oct. 16th 1862. Height 5ft 10ins. dark complexion blue eyes dark hair labourer by trade. Deserted 16.10.1862 near

Harpers Ferry Va.

**\*\* Dougherty William J.** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Fought Gettysburg. Wounded at Reams Station Va. Aug. 25th 1864. Arm and hand wounds. Hospitalised and later transferred to Vets Reserve Corps. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Sept. 6th 1865. Died aged only 42 in Philadelphia from peritonitis on 8th April 1889. Buried 11th April 1889 in the Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia. Buried from the home of his brother in law Michael Deveney 257 South 25th St. He was member of Post 2 GAR. Funeral service at St Patrick's church.

**\*\* Dowdell John** (Co. CLARE) Private Sept. 11th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Clare Ireland; Deserted the Regiment after a rest at Harpers Ferry.

**Doyle John** Sergt. Sept. 3rd 1861 3 Yrs. Captured at Snickers Gap. Va Nov 17th 1862, Wounded at Cold Harbour Va June 9th 1864. Promoted to Corp. Jan 29th 1865. To Sergt. June 15th 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Doyle John R.** Corp Jan 12th 1865 3 Yrs Prom. to Corp. June 1st 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865

**\*\* Driscoll Patrick** (Co. CORK) Private Sept. 3rd 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Cork Ireland: Died at Camp Observation Md. Dec. 16th. 1861. from disease Listed on the Monument at the Old Methodist Cemetery at Poolesville Md. where he was probably buried initially for a short period then final burial in the Old Cathedral Cemetery in Philadelphia. Aged 26. Buried Sec. L. Range 6 Plot 27W-M.

**\*\* Duff John** (Co. TYRONE) Private Sept. 11th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland. Deserted, Captured, returned and again deserted.

**Elben William Turpin** Corp Aug 19th 1861 3 Yrs Captured at Antietam Sept 17th 1862 . Prom. to Corporal April 15th 1864. Fought at Gettysburg Captured June 22nd 1864 Jerusalem Plank Road. Taken Andersonville and survived. Discharged by G.O. May 17th 1865. (Photo) Buried with wife in the Spring Hill Cemetery Easton Maryland. Born Sept 12th 1812. Died March 29th 1914. (Marker Image) (Photo Image). Was married twice, Firstly to Mary Ann Husted in 1860/61 in N.J. and secondly to Georgina Mann in Galena East Shore Md. William lived in various places Galena Kent Co. Md. In Talbot Co, Md. Baltimore City Md. East Talbot Co. Md. William was born 12.9.1842 in N.J. according to census of 1860. The Elben family were of German lineage.

**Eidel Franklin L** Private Aug 9<sup>th</sup> 1864 3 Yrs. Born 1844 died 12<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1923. Used several alias names Himmelbreck, Himmelbeck etc. Joined the 69<sup>th</sup> as Himmelreck. Mustered out 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865. Wife Amanda. German stock. Could speak English. Was a plasterer and odd job man. Died Monocasy Station. Buried Olney Cemetery Spangsville Pa. section B Lot 36.

**Ellenberger John.** Private. Drafted 24<sup>th</sup> Sept 1863 initially into Co. I. 71<sup>st</sup> Pa Inf. Wounded at Spottsylvania C.H. 12<sup>th</sup> April 1864. Transferred into Co. E 69<sup>th</sup> Pa Inf. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Mustered out 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865. Buried in Mount Lebanon Cemetery Lebanon Co. Pa. Soldiers block 192G. +.

**\*\* Fee John** (Co. TYRONE) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland. Fought Gettysburg Captured at Antietam. Paroled after four months. Returned to Regiment

**Exlee John (Axley)** Enlisted Philadelphia 8<sup>th</sup> Oct. 1861 but discharged 13<sup>th</sup> June 1862 S.C. of D. Had enlisted aged 44. Buried in the Hampton National Cemetery Va. Plot Section B Site 3995.

**Finnan Owen** Enlisted as Sergt. Aug 28<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs aged 30 Wounded and captured at Fredericksburg Dec. 13<sup>th</sup> 1862. Discharged expiration of term

**### Fitzgerald Edward E (Richard?)** Born 1849. Musician Aug. 26<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. At Philadelphia and mustered in 31<sup>st</sup> Oct. 1861 as a boy musician. He was aged 12. He re-enlisted at Stevensburg Va. 1<sup>st</sup> Feb. 1864 and deserted at the battle of the Wilderness 6<sup>th</sup> May 1864. However his pension papers show he appeared to have joined the U.S. Navy and was attached to the Civil War ship the USS Potomac and associated supply assignments. He died in Philadelphia March 30<sup>th</sup> 1918 and was buried in the Holy Sepulchre cemetery Cheltenham Philadelphia. Plot C.7.46 @ M.

**\* \* Flynn Thomas (Co. LIMERICK)** Corp Sept 11<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Limerick. Fought Gettysburg. Discharged Sept 30<sup>th</sup> 1863 for shoulder wounds received at Gettysburg July 3<sup>rd</sup> 1863. Had also been wounded at Malvern Hill in 1862. Applied for GAR membership 6<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1894 aged 61. He was living at Nice Avenue Germanstown. Died in Philadelphia 25<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1914. Buried Holy Sepulchre Cemetery Cheltenham Mont Co. Pa. Plot H.I.15. Born May 5<sup>th</sup> 1835 Ireland. Died Philadelphia Dec 25<sup>th</sup> 1914. @ M/

**Ford Edward** Corp Sept 3<sup>rd</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Sept 25<sup>th</sup> 1862. Died Paulsboro N.J. Feb 14<sup>th</sup> 1915. After service at St Patricks Church Woodbury N.J. was buried in Old St. Mary's Cemetery Gloucester City N.J. He had also served in the 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. Inf. Born 1833 Philadelphia..+..

**Fricke Eastburn** Private Born Philadelphia 1843. Enlisted 71<sup>st</sup> Pa July 1<sup>st</sup> 1861. Died Philadelphia May 6<sup>th</sup> 1867 from T.B. His headstone probably long gone as it is reported that his was the first person buried there in what appears to be a family plot. Was a jeweller by trade. Started off his military career as quite a few did in the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. and later when his period of service ended was transferred to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Co E. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Ended his period of enlistment Nov 15<sup>th</sup> 1864. He was one of four brothers the others were Charles, Alphons and Franus all three were listed on the Pa. draft register as also being soldiers already. All were said to have been from Tennessee. Buried in Mount Peace Cemetery Philadelphia. Family grave plot Lot F-178- 4 grave west. @.

**\* \* Gallagher Charles** (Co. DONEGAL) Private Oct. 31<sup>st</sup>. 1861 3 Yrs. Born Glen Carrigart Letterkenny Co. Donegal Ireland 1836: Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Mar. 16<sup>th</sup> 1863. After having survived many medical problems in America made his way home to Carrigart not too long before he died. He died in Carrigart probably at his old home on Sept 28<sup>th</sup> 1907. He is buried in the old cemetery at Umlagh Carrigart Co. Donegal. No records seems to exist of his burial and there is no marker. It is highly unlikely that records were ever kept and being a very poor part of Donegal no marker or headstone erected to his memory. See bio. on him in website.

**Garret Henry** Private Sept. 25<sup>th</sup> 1863 3yr aged 21 Drafted at Pottsville. Had been transferred from the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa . unknown date. Survived the war and is buried in the Philadelphia National Cemetery Philadelphia. He died 7<sup>th</sup> April 1898. His headstone

has his name as Garret. Originally buried in the Greenmount Cemetery Philadelphia. Drafted soldier. Buried in plot F-204.

**Geyer Albert G.** Enlisted 3 Yrs Philadelphia 31.10.1861 and mustered in Camp Obs. Md. Aged 25. A weaver by trade and born in Montgomery Co. Pa. Nov. 24<sup>th</sup> 1833. A married man he deserted 12<sup>th</sup> March 1863 at Falmouth Va. Died 25<sup>th</sup> June 1912 Philadelphia Buried Ivy Hill Cemetery Philadelphia. Average height 5ft 8 ins, brown hair dark complexion. Born Nov 24<sup>th</sup> 1833.

**### Garvin Henry (Paul Henry Girvin/Garvan?)** Private Enlisted Philadelphia 5<sup>th</sup> Oct 1861 by Capt. Frost Aged 28. Discharged S.C. of D. 2<sup>nd</sup> March 1863. Born Ireland 1834. Wife Ann. Died of typhoid fever aged 30. Died March 4<sup>th</sup> 1864 Buried March 7<sup>th</sup> 1864 "Old" St Michaels cemetery Philadelphia. Name possibly spelt Girvan in some documents. Full name may have been Paul Henry Girvin or Garvan. It is noted that his burial was paid for by the Catholic Charity St. Vincent de Paul who paid \$3 for his interment. Note "Old" St Michaels still exist but no remains of the headstones or markers exist any longer for the 69<sup>th</sup> men buried there.

**Golcher John Titus** Sergt July 10th 1861 3 Yrs. Enrolled and mustered in to the 71st Pa Inf. 10.7.1861. He was transferred into the 69th Pa. Inf. 12.6.1864. Mustered out July 10th 1864 expiration of term. He was born Philadelphia 31.3.1842 and died there 13.11.1914. Buried in Mount Moriath Cemetery Philadelphia. Was a married man and a machinist by trade. Lived all his life at 5415 Sharwood St 17<sup>th</sup> Ward. Parents English born. Son of William Golcher. Obit. In Philadelphia Inquirer Nov. 17<sup>th</sup>. 1914.

**\* \* Gowen Thomas** ( Co. TYRONE) Private Unknown 3 Yrs Thought to have fought Frederickburg. From Co. Tyrone.

**Hamilton Columbus** Pvte. Enlisted Philadelphia 9.10.1861 Philadelphia aged 45. Discharged 26<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1862 S.C. of D. Had served about a year. Buried St. Johns Episcopal Church Norristown Montgomery Co. Pa. (behind the county courthouse) . M.

**\* \* Hamilton Richard** (Co. DONEGL) Private. 19<sup>th</sup> June 1861 3 Yrs. Mustered in 31<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861. He was aged 31 5ft 7ins tall ruddy complexion, red hair and blue eyes .He was born in Donegal Ireland Served at Gettysburg as hospital orderly. He re-enlisted Stevensburg Va 1<sup>st</sup> Feb 1864. A married man. Died in Philadelphia June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1890. Initially buried in the Odd Fellows cemetery Philadelphia. However on Aug 3<sup>rd</sup> 1951 when the Odd Fellows cemetery was made defunct his remains along with others were taken to the Lawnview Cemetery Rockledge Mont Co. Pa and buried in location Susquehannah Section 19 Graves 73. Communal plot.

**\*\* Higgins Alexander A** (Co. DERRY) Born 1831 Private Sept 3rd 1861 3Yrs Developed remittent fever 23rd Nov. 1862. Transferred to General Hospital Nr.10 Baltimore 28th Feb 1 1863 then to Gen hospital No 1 Baltimore 18th April 1863. Discharged Surgeons Cert. June 3rd 1863. Given pension on May 14 1864. Buried New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.

**\* \* Hinphey (Hemphey) Edward** (Co. DERRY) Sergt. Aug.26th 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Derry. Probably from around Toomebridge area. Fought Gettysburg. Prom. from Private to Sergt. Feb 1st 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1865. Enlisted Philadelphia Aug 26th 1861 aged 31. Was demoted to private for alleged

cowardice at Fredericksburg 13<sup>th</sup> Dec 1862. Then reinstated to Sergt Rank Feb 1864. Gave his trade as boatman. I would be fairly sure that he was Lough Neagh fisherman from around the Toomebridge area in the N.W. area of the lough where the name appears. Also named as Hemphay. Wifes name Anna. Edward died Dec 15<sup>th</sup> 1893 at Erie Pa. Was wounded at Hatchers Run 25<sup>th</sup> Feb 1865 where he broke ribs in battlefield accident. Ended the war in hospital in Philadelphia. Lived at 512 Jefferson St Philadelphia at a time. Later buried from his residence 3049 Potter Street 25<sup>th</sup> Ward. Mass at Church of the Visitation. Edward Hemphy is buried in St. Dominics Cemetery Torresdale Phil Co. Plot Section K. Range 10 Lot 30. @ M.

**Jamison Hugh** Private Jan 17<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865.

**Johnson Edward** Private June 6<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865.

**Johnson Edward** Private June 6<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Absent sick at muster out.

**Kane John A.** Private Aug.28<sup>th</sup> 1863 3 Yrs Deserted March 25<sup>th</sup> 1862,

**\* \* Kane Michael (Co. DERRY)** Private Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Sept 24<sup>th</sup> 1862. Died Philadelphia from disease contracted at the battle of Richmond. Aged 42. Buried at St. Mary's cemetery after service at the Church of the Assumption. Sadly his sister Bridget Devine died the same day aged 45 wife of John Devine. Both buried same day. Born Co. Derry.

**Kearns Patrick** Private July 17<sup>th</sup> 1864 3 Yrs Discharged on Gen. Order July 5<sup>th</sup> 1865.

**King Samuel** Sergt. Sept.1<sup>st</sup> 1864 3 Yrs. Prom. to Corp. Feb 1<sup>st</sup> 1864, to sergt. June 12<sup>th</sup> 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865. Buried Leadsville Lake Co. Col. Born Dec 1836 Mass Died Nov 3<sup>rd</sup> 1900.

**\* \* Kinsella James (Co. WICKLOW)** Private 1<sup>st</sup> June 1861`3 Yrs Born Co. Wicklow Ireland. March 15<sup>th</sup> 1839. Left for America aged about 10 circa 1849 shortly after the 1847 famine probably in family group sailing from Dublin. James initially joined Co. M. of the Cal. Regt. aged 22 .This unit later transposed into the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa Inf. He was wounded at Sharpesville/Antietam 17<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1862. He was wounded at the battle of Antietam recovered and then fought at the battle of Gettysburg where he was taken prisoner at the famous "Angle" 3<sup>rd</sup> July 1863. He was then held as prisoner in Belle Isle prison at Richmond Va. until sent to hospital then to Camp Parole Md. Until he returned to the 71<sup>st</sup> in June 1874. On 30<sup>th</sup> June 1864 he was assigned to Co. E. of the 69<sup>th</sup>. He remained in the 69<sup>th</sup> for a short period of about three months as an orderly nurse after his enlistment with the 71<sup>st</sup> ended. Was honourably discharged Oct 26<sup>th</sup> 1864 at end of his enlistment. Became a naturalised American citizen in Nov 8<sup>th</sup> 1864. He became a police officer in Baltimore and probably retired from that force. There is some indication that he may have worked for the Baltimore and Ohio rail Co. at a time. On Sept 25<sup>th</sup> 1900 some 36 years after leaving the army he was admitted to the Southern Branch of the National Home for Disabled soldiers at Hampton/Elizabeth City Va. He was discharged from the home March 19<sup>th</sup> 1921 and went back to Baltimore. Died at home 27<sup>th</sup> March 1914 and was buried in Loudon Park National Cemetery New Section grave 481. After the war he had married in 1867 and settled in Baltimore Md. (Photo marker)

**Kinsler Matthew** Private Jan 17th 1865 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Knox Robert** Private. Enlisted into the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa at Philadelphia 1<sup>st</sup> July 1861. Later transferred to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Born Jane 16<sup>th</sup> 1838 Illinois Died Oct 20<sup>th</sup> 1912 Philadelphia. Buried Fernwood Cemetery Del Co. Pa.

\* \* **Lawn Edward** (Co. DONEGAL) Private Sept. 2nd 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Donegal Ireland. Deserted Oct.20th 1862.

\* \* **Lovett Alexander** (Co. TYRONE) 1<sup>st</sup> St. Lieut Aug 19th 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Tyrone .Wounded at New Market Cross Roads Va. June 30th 1862. Spent time at Fort McHenry Baltimore for treatment. Discharged Surgeons Cert . April 19th 1863. Alex Lovett was originally a tavern keeper. He was then mustered into the VRC as a 1st Lieut. Lovett arrested Dr. Samuel Mudd who had set J.W. Booth's leg after Booth had killed Lincoln. Buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. Died March 19th 1887. Buried Plot X.12.3. After the war he was a veterinarian / horse dealer in Philadelphia. Had married for a second time Minerva H. Dorscheimer and had family of four.(see write -up).

\* \* **Mahoney Daniel** (Co. CORK) Enlisted aged 40 as a private Aug 19<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Cork Ireland; Had very mixed career. One researcher states that he went missing during the battle at Glendale or just prior . He was said to have been taken prisoner by the Confederates in July 1<sup>st</sup> 1862 near White Oak Swamp in the retreat from Savage Station to Glendale, The report card for July-August of that year states he was a prisoner in Richmond Va. Was then said to have been parolled by the Confederates August 8<sup>th</sup> 1862. Then reported "sick in hospital in Georgetown from Aug 30<sup>th</sup> to Dec 31 1862. He was then reported as a deserted April 29<sup>th</sup> 1863 suggesting he had returned to the ranks for at least a while. However it looks like he never fought at Gettysburg as stated by a sergeants report which also stated he had never taken part in any engagement since enlistment. Reports during the Gettysburg period of the war states he was transferred to the Invalid Corps in Dec 1863.. Sent to work in the Draft rendezvous office in New Haven Conn. He was then for a period employed as a hospital aide at David's Island Hospital NYC until June 1864 then back to the Invalid Corps . He was finally discharged Aug 31<sup>st</sup> 1866 and was by that date back in Philadelphia. He filed for a pension on June 8<sup>th</sup> 1866. This was refused as the pension office could not find any proof of his being either Glendale or Gettysburg. A small man 5ft 4ins. Tall with blue eyes. Daniel died July 1<sup>st</sup> 1866 and as far as is known buried in an unmarked grave in the Old Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia. This guy would appear to have been the man "who never was" in he 69<sup>th</sup>!!.

\* \* **Maloney Patrick** ( Co. DUBLIN) Private Sept 7th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Dublin Ireland: Captured at New Market Cross Roads Va June 20th 1862.Deserted Oct.20th 1862.

**Manley Lawrence** Corp Nov 5th 1864 3 Yrs Substitute. Prom to Corporal June 1st 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.Died 13<sup>th</sup> April 1890. Buried Leavensworth Nat. Cemetery Leavensworth Kansas. Plot 4 R2 G10

**Maroney Stephen** Private Sept 17th 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Oct.8th 1861.

\* \* **McAfee Hugh** (Co. DERRY) Private Sept 7th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland 1838. Aged 26 at enlistment. Fought Gettysburg and wounded there Absent



sick at muster out. Was baker by trade. Enlisted Philadelphia Sept 7th 1861. Married man wife Rachel and lived at 1802. N.22<sup>nd</sup> St Philadelphia .Died aged 62 on 8<sup>th</sup> March 1900. Buried Mount Moriah Cemetery Philadelphia.

**McBride Alexander** Private Oct.7th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Sept 29th 1862.

**### McCarron (McCarson) Edward** Private Sept 18th 1861 3 Yrs Accidentally killed on railroad near Philadelphia Oct 8th 1863.Born 1819 Ireland Buried "Old" St Michael Cemetery Philadelphia. AKA Edward McCarson.. No headstone or markers on the 69<sup>th</sup> soldiers buried in this old cemetery. See listing. Accident near Chestnut Hill Philadelphia.

**\* \* McClarnan Patrick (Co. TYRONE)** Private Aug 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Deserted July 1st 1862.from battle of Glendale. No further trace but a grave listed in St. Ambrose Cemetery Schuylkill Haven Pa lists a Patrick McClernand 69th PV.

**McCormick Emmanuel .B.** Corp July 10th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out July 10th 1864 expiration of term. Born Philadelphia 1842 Died Philadelphia Feb 20<sup>th</sup> 1882.from T.B. aged 40. A moulder by trade and a single man he lived at 1912 15<sup>th</sup> Buttonwood St. Philadelphia, Buried Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia in location Section I, Range 9 plot 48 2<sup>nd</sup> from West. @.

**McCullough William** Private Sept 1st 1861 3 Yrs Absent on detached service at muster out.

**McDonald Terrence** Private Sept 19th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Mar 1st 1863.Wounded Fredericksburg.

**McElroy John** Corp Aug.26th 1861 3 Yrs. Killed at Fredericksburg Dec.13th 1862 aged 28.

**\* \* McErlane John (Co. DERRY)** Private Sept 10th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: . Sick most of his army enlistment and died Aug 15th 1864. Buried in Catholic Cemetery York Pa. Enlisted Camp Observation Md. Aged 45 Noted as being a small man at 5ft 6ins tall hazel eyes black hair and a labourer by trade.

**McGarvey Hugh** Private Sept 11th 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Oct.8th 1861.

**\* \* McGarvey Joseph** (Co. DONEGAL) 1st Sergt. Feb 1st 1864 3 Yrs Born Co. Donegal Ireland: Prom. from Private to Sergt. Feb 1st 1864, fought at Gettysburg. Prom to 1st Sergt. May 15th 1865. Comm. 1st Lieut June 16th 1865 but not mustered. Wounded at Cold Harbour June 9th 1864. Survived the war mustered out July 1st 1865 and lived until 30.5.1893. Buried in the Hampton National Cemetery Hampton Va. Plot 8664 Section C. (Photo headstone)

**McGarvey Patrick** Private Sept 3rd 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Jan 17th 1863.

**McGeynn John (McGlynen in P,A,Civil War Card system)** Private Sept 26th 1863 3 Yrs. Drafted. Captured near Petersburg Va. June 22nd 1864 Drafted aged 19 at Pottsville Pa.Had transferred from the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Captured neat Petersburg Va. .

**\* \* McGinley Joseph (Co. DONEGAL)** Private Sept 3rd 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Donegal Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg and many battles and re-enlisted Feb 1864 went home on furlough after getting his sign on bonus and disappeared Dec. 6th 1864. Born 1843 Co. Donegal died March 15 1922 in Tarentum Alleghany Co. Pa.

Buried in St Josephs Parish Cemetery Natrona Heights, Allegheny Co. Pa. Grave A-12.+.

**McGowan Alexander** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Discharged on Surgeons Cert Oct. 18th 1864. Born March 9 1831 died April 11<sup>th</sup> 1894. Buried Mount Lebanon Cemetery Lebanon Lebanon Co. Pa..

**McGrugan Dennis** Private Nov 7th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Sept.21st 1862.

**McGuire Francis** Born Philadelphia enlisted aged 18 as Private Aug.26<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs . At one stage he captured in the Jerusalem Plank Road near Petersburg June 22nd 1864. He had fought at Glendale and Antietam but missed Gettysbug. At one stage he deserted but was fined and arrested Nov 2<sup>nd</sup>. 1863 and was returned to the ranks where he then fought at The Wilderness and Cold Harbour but captured as above at Jerusalem Plank Road. Captured he was imprisoned at Lynchburg Va. He took ill and was sent to Savannah Ga. and exchanged. He ended up at Camp Parole until end of war. He was 5ft. 7“ in height light complexion, hazel eyes, light hair, and had worked as labourer. He is buried in the Holy Cross cemetery Yeadon Pa. plot U-3-35.N8 Died 26<sup>th</sup> July 1910.

**McIlwee Michael** Private Sept 12th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged 1865.

**\*\* McKeever Hugh (Co/ DERRY)** Sergt February 3 Yrs Born Co Derry. Ireland Enlisted Philadelphia 17.8. 1862 aged 20 and mustered in same day as Sergt. Fought Gettysburg. Survived the war and was mustered out 9.6.1865. Hugh took part in many battles and was outstanding in his ability at Gettysburg. Died May 30th 1894. Buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. After the war used the Christian name Joseph.

**McKeever James** Private Sept 2nd 1861 3 yrs Enlisted at Philadelphia 2.9.1861 and mustered in at Camp Observation Md. 31.10.1861 aged 20. Not on muster out roll.

**McKeever Patrick** Sergt. July 17th 1862 3 Yrs. Mustered out June 12th 1865 expiration of term.

**### McManus Andrew** Capt Aug.19th 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland: Involved in the initial army regiment development. Had a long standing dispute with a Capt. McMahan of the 71st Regt P.V. and was murdered by McMahan near Falmouth Va. May 27th 1863. He was aged 36. Enlisted 19th. Aug.1861: Buried Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia initially but later along with family re-interred in the Holy Sepulchre cemetery at Cheltenham Philadelphia with other family members on 16. 7. 1942 Plot 16.3.76.. Re-interrment documents suggest he was 29 when killed. Death notices in the local Philadelphia newspapers do not mention his murder but that he had been fighting the rebels. In The Press Philadelphia June 2nd 1863 described the circumstances of McMahons death. Apparently McManus called McMahan ( a native of San Francisco) a coward and the latter McMahan got to hear of this. He went to McManus tent and asked him if it were true and on being told it was promptly shot McManus. McManus embalmed body was sent back from the Potomac Army H.Q. on 31st May 1863 to Philadelphia. @ M.

**McNamee Bernard** Private July 16th 1862 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert June 19th 1863. (Another source states killed at Fredericksburg)

**\*\* McNamee James (Co. TYRONE)** Private Enlisted 1<sup>st</sup>. Sept 1861 3 Yrs and mustered in 11<sup>th</sup>. Oct 1861 at Camp Observation Ms. Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Promoted Sergt. Co E April 20<sup>th</sup> 1863. Probably fought at Gettysburg as recorded present June- July 1863. After Gettysburg he re-enlisted and fought at the Wilderness / Spotsylvania Court House and Petersburg. Granted leave on Feb 15<sup>th</sup> 1865 he went back to Philadelphia never to be seen again. For whatever reason his comrades erased his name off the Pa. monument. Not on muster out roll. He ended up his days in the City Hospital St Louis Missouri by June 1890 James died in the City Hospital Jan 10<sup>th</sup> 1895. Buried in Calvary Cemetery St Louis Missouri Ref 315758 Section 009 Lot 0560. James would appear to have been badly affected by his involvement at Gettysburg. He was noted as being absent sick after Gettysburg Aug. 1863. Resigned his sergeant rank and dropped to private Sept 7<sup>th</sup> 1863. Noted sick in Wash Oct 30<sup>th</sup> 1863 but returned to the ranks on Jan 4<sup>th</sup> 1864. Was granted a 30 day furlough and worked in the Draftee Rendevous Station until ordered by the War Department to return to the ranks at Petersburg June 1865. However he never did return and headed off for St Louis. (See above) James was a small man 5ft 5ins. tall blue eyes and a labourer by trade @.

**\*\* McQuade Daniel** ( Co. TYRONE) Private Sept 21st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged for wounds received at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Born 1818. Died Feb 11<sup>th</sup> 1868 aged 50 Buried "Old" St. Michaels Cemetery Philadelphia 13.2.1868. He was a married man his wife's name being Letitia Devlin. At his death they had four children under the age of 16 and two over the age of 16. He had been wounded to his left elbow by a mini ball and due to medical complications to his body as mini ball had never been extracted caused him life long health issues leading to his early death at just 50. Medical notes state he died from consumption of lungs stated by Doctor Philip Boyle M.D.

**\*\* Meade John (CO. ROSCOMMON)** Private Sept.9th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Roscommon Ireland: Had a history of poor health and was hospitalised and deserted from hospital. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. April 23rd.1864

**Mooney Daniel** Private Sept 18th 1861 3 Yrs. Captured at New Market Cross Va June 30th 1862. Transferred to V.R.C. Dec.2nd 1864.

**### Mooney James** Private Sept.1st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded Fredericksburg Dec.13th 1862, Captured near Petersburg June 22nd 1864 Imprisoned Andersonville Sent to Camp Lawrton Millen Ga 31st Oct.1864. Survived Andersonville. Discharged on Gen. Order. June 21st 1865. Born Ireland. Buried Dayton National Cemetery Dayton Mont. Co. Ohio. Section K Row 11 Site 19.

**Mooney John** Private Aug.19th 1862. 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Sept 25th 1862.

**\*\* Mooney Thomas** (Co. Donegal) Private Aug.31st 1861 3 yrs Killed at Cold Harbour June 10th 1864. Buried Cold Harbour Cemetery Cold Harbour Va. Section D. Grave 707 Born Co. Derry.

**Moore William** Corp July 1st 1861 3 Yrs. Discharged March 22nd 1865.

**Moothart John M** Private Sept 13th 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Oct.8th 1861.

**### Murphy Michael J** Private Sept 16th 1861 3 Yrs. Deserted but returned Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Wounded Antietam. Died Sept 14<sup>th</sup> 1914

Philadelphia. He had also served in the 20<sup>th</sup> Pa Inf. Co C. Buried in Holy Cross Cemetery Cheltenham Mont. Co. Pa. Section 3 range 4 lot 19. His papers say he had light complexion, 5ft 7 1/2 ins tall, hazel eyes, fair hair and was by trade a labourer. However in his later army paperwork he is recorded as a horseshoer ie a blacksmith. Perhaps a trade learned in the Army..His parents John Murphy and his mother Nancy Joyce also born Ireland. Died in a National Soldiers Home in Va.

**### Murrow Edmund** Private Sept 1st 1861 3 Yrs Born 1863 .This man noted as being the benefactor of one of the largest payouts in a law case that was settled in Philadelphia in early Sept 1887. The sum of \$12,963 was awarded to him in claims that went back to Dec. 25<sup>th</sup>.1862 for \$6 dollars a month from that time until June 6<sup>th</sup> 1866, then \$25 dollars a month from that until June 4<sup>th</sup> 1872, then \$31.50 dollars a month to June 4<sup>th</sup> 1874 , then \$50 dollars a month to June 17<sup>th</sup> 1878, and \$72 from then on. Murrow was badly wounded by an exploding shell which exploded in front of him at the battle of Glendale. Captured there he spent two months in prison developed dementia and later developed mental problems. After being discharged from the service took up his former business to support his family. However his health worsened and he gradually became totally disabled and his wife had him declared insane and he spent some time in an asylum. He later lived with his son Robert in Philadelphia who looked after him. His son was also given \$28,000 for the proper management of his fathers estate. His other son William had served in Co. B of the 72<sup>nd</sup> Pa. but was killed at Antietam.Edward or Edmund died Feb 1895. He is buried Mount Peace cemetery Philadelphia. Section L Lot 307.@ M.

**Neafie Theodore** Private July 16th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out July 10th 1864 expiration of muster out.

**O'Donnell Patrick** Private July 17th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Absent at muster out.

**\* \* O'Neill Charles (Co. TYRONE)** Corp Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864. Fought Gettysburg. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. May 9th 1865.Wounded Antietam. Charles was a lawyer by profession.Enlisted aged 33 at Philadelphia.Fair complexion, height 5ft 8ins hazel eyes brown hair.

**O'Neill John** Private Aug.31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. June 19th 1863.Had enrolled aged 33. Some rolls have his name as O'Neil

**Owens Henry** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Was an ambulance driver in the regiment. Born 1843 died 1919. Buried at the Odd Fellows Cemetery Shenandoah Heights Schuylkill Co. Pa. Plot Section 19 Row 25..@ M.

**Price Owen** Private Aug.26th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert.Dec.31st 1861.Teamster.

**\* \* Reilly Martin** (Co. ROSCOMMON) Private Sept 6th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Roscommon Ireland: Fought at Fredericksburg and Antietam. Hospitalisation and treatment failed and he was discharged April 9th.1864.Not on muster out roll.

**Restine John** Initially like many soldiers linked into the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa John served in Co. I of the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa having joined as a private July 10th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out July 10th 1864 expiration of term. He had been transferred on to the paperwork of the

69<sup>th</sup>.Pa. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864.Had been promoted Corporal 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 1863.After the war John became a physician. He had been born in France 26<sup>th</sup> Jan 1843 and died in Philadelphia 27<sup>th</sup> April 1905. Name spelling varies in different records..Buried North Cedar Hill Cemetery Philadelphia plot Section 5.

**Rohrer Andrew H.** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Captured at Petersburg June 22nd 1864.Held at Andersonville Ga. Survived Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.Born 1842. Died Jan 25<sup>th</sup> 1908.Initially 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. Buried Vinestreet Cemetery Hazleton Lucerne Co. Pa.

**Rowley Edward** Sergt. Jan 19th 1863 3 Yrs Prom. from Private to Sergt.Feb 1st 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Schofield Richard** Private Sept 14th 1861 3 Yrs Promoted to Hospital Steward. Date unknown. Born c1809. Died June 29<sup>th</sup> 1884.Buried Mount Moriah cemetery Philadelphia. Section 205 lot 1 grave 4 from S.W. Section. @

**Schuchart George** Born Germany 1834. Private Feb 1st 1864 3ys Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Died Sept 15<sup>th</sup> 1892. Buried Kensington Burial Grounds Philadelphia.

**Sheehan Humphrey** Private Sept 17th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Mar.19th 1863.

**Slaugh Richard** Born 1822 Philadelphia Private Sept 7th 1861 3 Yrs Transferred to Vet Res. Corps Dec 2nd 1863. Buried Kensington Burial Ground Philadelphia. Died Philadelphia 25<sup>th</sup> Aug 1892. Buied Kensington Burial Ground.

**Smith George S** Private Sept 16th 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Smith John** Private Aug.27th 1861 3 Yrs Transferred to Vet Res. Corps Nov.20th 1863.

**Stewart Charles** Corp. Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom. from Private Co. D. to Corp. on unknown date. Absent sick at muster out.

**Stiffy (Steffey) Christian** Private Aug 6th 1864 3 Yrs Mustered in into Co. I at Reading Pa.6<sup>th</sup> July 1864 aged 24 and discharged by G..O. No. 26 with no date. Died July 4<sup>th</sup> 1910 aged 75. Buried Mohnsville Cemetery Mohnston Berks Co. Pa..

**Sullivan Daniel** Private Jan 5th 1864 3Yrs Substitute. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Sullivan John** Private May 6th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged by Gen. Order July 1st 1865.

**\* \* Sullivan Patrick** (WATERFORD). Enlisted as private Oct 31st 1861 at Philadelphia for 3 Yrs .Fought in the battles of the Peninsular Campaign. Fell from exhaustion in the march to Antietam. Dropped out of march Feb 14<sup>th</sup> 1863 at Fredericksburg Md.. Hospitalised until Dec. 1863 in Philadelphia then duties in the D.C. area. It should be noted than his grave marker shows him to have served in Co A. This should read Co. E. Born Waterford Oct 1<sup>st</sup> 1833 died Oct 23<sup>rd</sup> 1898. Buried in the St Johns Cemetery. Altona, Blair Co. Pa. He had served with his brother Michael in the initial 3 month muster of the 24<sup>th</sup> Pa. Wife named as Bridget who died 25<sup>th</sup> Aug 1910.He and his wife lived at 905- 16<sup>th</sup> Ave. Altona. M

**Sweeny John** Private Enlisted Sept 11<sup>th</sup> 1861 Philadelphia 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.Buried Covenant Presbyterian Church Fraser Chester Co. Pa. during the war he served from to time as a servant for both Lt.John Devlin Co E.

and Capt Thomas Woods Co. E. his papers state that pre war he was a "skin dresser" ie a person who prepares animal skins for use as animal skin coats, leather gloves etc. He had re-enlisted in March 1864 and served out the war. Post war he was plagued by poor health and got a pension for poor eyesight and rheumatism . He lived to a very old age at a town known then as Duffyn Mawr in Chester Co. Born 1825 died May 18<sup>th</sup> 1904. Had fought Gettysburg. (Image marker).

Swede John (Sweedee). Pvte. Born Philadelphia 1834. Initially enlisted in Co K of the 27<sup>th</sup> Regt. in June 1861. He transferred to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa aged 29 on the 5<sup>th</sup>. Oct. 1861. He was placed in Co E under Capt. McManus. From Feb 1861 Swedes served until June 1861 some four months. He was sent to Fort Monroe hospital but was discharged from there 28<sup>th</sup> Jan 1863 with eyesight problems. He may well have been in the U.S. General hospital at Wash D.C. for a period. After being discharged from the 60<sup>th</sup> Pa. and the Army he went back to Philadelphia. However on Nov. 25<sup>th</sup>. 1863 he joined the 2<sup>nd</sup> Pa. Heavy Artillery Co. E. He served in this Regt. the 2<sup>nd</sup> Pa. Heavy Artillery (112<sup>th</sup> Pa. Regt) and was mustered out June 17<sup>th</sup> 1865. After the war he married Sarah Dougherty and had six children born between, 1870 and 1882. The family probably moved to north central Pa. He died May 28<sup>th</sup> 1913 and is buried in the Wildwood Cemetery in Williamsport Pa. Section C. Lot 1792 Grave 12.

**Swire Elias** Private Sept 13<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Oct. 8<sup>th</sup> 1861.

**\* \* Taggart Hugh** (Co. DOWN) Private Enrolled at Philadelphia Aug. 26<sup>th</sup> 1861 aged 40 3 yrs Born Co. Down Ireland. Died of disease at Harrisons Landing Va. Aug. 16<sup>th</sup> 1862. Brother to John J Taggart and Patrick in next two entries.

**\* \* Taggart John J (Co. DOWN)** Enlisted as 1<sup>st</sup> Sergt aged 22 at Philadelphia Aug 19<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Down Ireland: Prom. to 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieut 20<sup>th</sup> Nov 1863 Wounded at Antietam Sept. 17<sup>th</sup> 1862, at Gettysburg July 2<sup>nd</sup> 1863 at Mine Run Va Nov. 27<sup>th</sup> 1863. At one stage he deserted his regiment but due to being recorded with wrong initials in his records etc he seems to have got lucky and was discharged April 19<sup>th</sup> 1864 Attended Col. Dennis O'Kanes funeral in Philadelphia. He had a mixed military career. At the end of his life he lived in the National Soldiers Home in Hampton V. May 22<sup>nd</sup> 1900 until Nov 8<sup>th</sup> 1918. He always failed to mention his colourful career in the 69<sup>th</sup> in his pension applications!! He ended his days in the Old Soldiers Home in Johnson City Tennessee dieing there Dec 9<sup>th</sup> 1919. His sister was married to Capt Thomas Woods. Served with Thomas Woods below initially in the Meagher Guards and the 24<sup>th</sup> Pa. Woods and Taggart would appera to have been colour fl characters.

**\* \* Taggart Patrick** (Co. DOWN) Enrolled Philadelphia Aug. 19<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Down. Ireland: Promoted Sergt. date unknown Wounded at Gettysburg July 3<sup>rd</sup> 1863 mustered out Aug. 27<sup>th</sup> 1864 expiration of term. These three brothers said to be from Co. Down.

**Thornton Thomas** Private Aug. 26<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> 1862.

**Tight Patrick** Private Aug. 15<sup>th</sup> 1864 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865

**\* \* Toner Hugh** (Co. DONEGAL) Private Sept 11<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Donegal Ireland: Discharged on surgeons cert. Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> 1864.

**Vaughan Bev.** Private Aug 19<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Antietam Sept 17<sup>th</sup> 1862.

Buried in National Cemetery Antietam Md. Initially in the 24<sup>th</sup> Pa. Co. K. then to 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 19.8.1861.Promoted sergt. 19.8.1861.

**Vaughan William** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Absent sick in Philadelphia at muster out. Enrolled 25.9.1863 Pottsville Pa. aged 24.

**Wilson Ralph M.** Private Aug.27th 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Wiltner James W** Private Sept 17th 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Oct.8th 1861.

**\* \* Woods Thomas** (Co. CAVAN) Capt.Aug.19th 1861 3 Yrs Born Cootehill Co. Cavan Ireland Dec. 8th 1831. Emigrated to Philadelphia and in 1859 married a Catherine Taggart the sister of a John J. Taggart a future soldier also in the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa.. They were to have three children. Thomas was initially an orderly sergeant in the Meagher Guards. He initially joined the 24th Pa on a three month enlistment in April 1861. Discharged in August 10th 1861. Enlisted as 2nd Lieut Co. E in the Cal. Regt. Baker Guards 69th Pa. Aug 1861 and this unit became the 69th Pa Regt Irish Volunteers. Was wounded at the battle of Antietam Sept 17th. 1862. Thomas went AWOL 30th Nov.1862 until 8th Jan. 1863. Charged but charges dropped. Prom. from 2nd to 1st Lieut 10th April 1863 and to Capt 5th June 1863. At Gettysburg July 2nd 1863 received shell wounds and sent to hospital in Philadelphia. Returned to Regiment Sept 1863. In Oct. 29th 1863 mustered in as Captain in Co. E at Turkey Run. In Jan and Feb 1864 was on recruitment duty in Philadelphia but on April 15th of that year again went AWOL. It would appear that Thomas was affected by his war experiences and for whatever reason enlisted as a private in Co. D of the 3rd Regt. Pa cavalry Aug. 20th 1864. He was discharged from the 3rd Pa Cav. unit in May 1865. Was promoted when on April 10th. 1863 after 1st Lieut Alex Lovett resigned. Thomas attended Col. Dennis O'Kane's funeral in Philadelphia. Was the soldier John Woods mentioned as being in Co's I and D a brother perhaps?. John lived in Wash D.C. from 1865 until 1884 and married twice. The family then lived in Newport News Va 1888- 1890. He was in a soldiers home in Hampton Va 1900-1907. Is noted as dieing in Philadelphia Feb.25th 1911. Buried New Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia Section F/2 Lot 43-46 grave south 44.
