\* \* **Allen Joseph (Co. DERRY)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg. Had enlisted Philadelphia May 5th 1861. A labourer by trade. Hostler to Major Duffy. Mustered out Sept 3rd. 1864 at end of term. Buried in the National Cemetery Dayton Ohio. Plot M 20 37. Had joined aged 47. Had joined from the 27th Pa. Fought at Gettysburg. Name on National Monument at Gettysburg.

**Arnold Matthias** Private July 7th 1863 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Arrison William ( also noted as Anison)** Drafted soldier. Sergt. Mustered in Philadelphia 22<sup>nd</sup> July 1863 aged 25 to the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. Transferred to Co. G 69<sup>th</sup> Pa on the 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Stayed with the 69<sup>th</sup> and was promoted to Sergt. 28<sup>th</sup> Jan 1865. Mustered out 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865. Born 7<sup>th</sup> Jan 1839 in Pa. and died in Pa 4<sup>th</sup> March 1911. Buried in the North Cedar Hill Cem. In Philadelphia. Father was Peter Arrison and mother Eliz Gilbertson.

**Ashmore Joseph** Private Jan 6th 1864 3 Yrs Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House Va May 12th 1864. Discharged by G.O. Aug. 2<sup>nd</sup> 1865.

**Bartle John P** Private Oct 21st 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Captured at Wilderness May 6th 1864. Held at and survived Andersonville Va. Absent at muster out.

\* \* **Bell John (Co. DUBLIN)** Corp May 5th 1861 3Yrs Born Co. Dublin Ireland: Discharged Dec. 1863 for wounds received at Fredericksburg Dec 13th 1862.

\* \* **Bell R Joseph** (Co. DUBLIN) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Fought Glendale but later collapsed and died of consumption developed in prison but died in the process being brought back on the steamer Commodore. In his obituary dated Sept 20th 1862 in the PPL Page 2 he is said to be "lost" near Fortress Monroe. No further information on him except that his father applied for a pension in 1870. Died aged 29. It is probable he was buried somewhere along the river bank of the James river. No cemetery identified as at Feb 2011. Born Co Dublin.

**Bierwirth Francis V** Capt. May 5th 1861 3 Yrs German born in Heyberg Hannover. Killed at Antietam Md. Sept. 17th 1862. Buried at Antietam National Cem. Sharpsburg. Md. (Photo of headstone). Prior to enlisting in the army he was mayor of Egg Harbour N.J. left there May 31<sup>st</sup> 1861. He had moved to Egg Harbour from St. Louis Missouri. He was mayor of Egg Harbour N.J. 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 1861 until 31<sup>st</sup> May 1861 when he left to join the 27<sup>th</sup> Pa and then joined the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. His portrait

hung in the Mayors Parlour in Egg Harbour the placed in the Roundhouse Museum Egg Harbour where it still resides.

**\*\* Blair John (Co. DERRY)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Wounded at Fredericksburg Dec 13th 1862 shot in right leg. Fought Gettysburg. Mustered out May 5th 1864 expiration of term. Plasterer by trade. Had transferred from Co. G 27<sup>th</sup> Regt. 1<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861.Had been wounded at Fredericksburg 13<sup>th</sup> Dec 1862. A small man of 5ft 5 Ins tall brown hair and grey eyes. Member of Courtland Saunders Post GAR 21.Lived at 102 Fishers Ave Released due to bad health May 5<sup>th</sup> 1864 with numerous physical problems heart disease and continuing problems with his earlier leg wound. Had been in the 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. prior to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Died 21<sup>st</sup>. Feb 1898.Buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.Plot C-10-15.@

**\*\* Blakely Hugh (Blankely) (Co. TYRONE)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Mustered out May 5th 1864 expiration of term. Born 1841 Died Aug18<sup>th</sup> 1918.. Hugh was transferred from 27<sup>th</sup> Reg 1.10.1861Wounded Gettysburg 3<sup>rd</sup> July 1863. Buried Philadelphia Memorial Memorial Park Cemetery. Fraser, Chester Co. P. Plot HB 398 @

**\*\* Boyle Hugh (Co. ARMAGH)** Capt May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded with gunshot to right thigh at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Prom. from 1st Sergt. to 2nd Lieut Sept 18th 1862 and to Ist Lieut May 1st 1863 and to Capt. Feb 1st 1863. Court -martialed and discharged Feb 13th 1864. Upon the charge “conduct to the prejudice of good order and military discipline in behaving in a boisterous and unruly manner which under the influence of liquor and participating in a drunker brawl or spree in the presence of officers and men”. He died aged 50 20<sup>th</sup>. June 1892. Buried in the New Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia with wife Mary M Boyle (Nee McCoy). (Possibly name was Mary Magdalene.. Named as being a “gentleman” on his death certificate. His wife Mary died April 19<sup>th</sup> 1915. She was initially buried in the Holy Sepulchre cemetery but her remains re-interred after a short period with her husband in the New Cathedral cemetery., Brother to Stephen below who is buried in the same plot as Hugh and Mary. Hugh buried in plot C-8-17 with wife Mary and brother Stephen below. Mary died April 19<sup>th</sup> 1915. Was initially buried in Holy Sepulchre church but re interred to be with husband Hugh in New Cathedral cemetery. Lived 2246 Master St.. Plot C.8.17. @

**\*\* Boyle Stephen (Co. ARMAGH)** Private Aug.20th 1862 3 Yrs Wounded at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Discharged by G.O. June 9th 1865. Died aged 45 2<sup>nd</sup>.March 1883 Philadelphia. An inn keeper by trade and married. Died from delirium tremens A driver in the ambulance train from April 28<sup>th</sup> 1863 until the end of the was he was dismissed from the service June 8<sup>th</sup> 1865. Buried with his brother Hugh above and his sister in law. @

**Brankin James Francis** 2nd Lieut May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born in Philadelphia 1843 to Irish born father Edward who died 18.7.1869. James mustered in 5.5.1861 aged 22.Had transferred from Co. G. 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. Regt. 10.1.1861. Reenlisted Petersburg 2.1.1864. Prom to Sergt. July 1st 1864 to 2nd Lieut Nov 11th 1864 to 1st Lieut June 16th 1865 . Not mustered. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865 Height at enrolment

5ft 4Ins. Blue eyes and light complexion. James died in Philadelphia as a young man aged only 40 on 28.4.1883. Was a packer by trade. Died from liver disease. Lived with his two sisters Annie and Eliza at 1516N 2<sup>nd</sup> St 17<sup>th</sup> Ward. Initially buried in Old St Michaels cemetery Philly. However in 1891 he and his father Edward were moved from Old St. Michaels to the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. They are buried in position Section U Lot 5 Range 3 2<sup>nd</sup> from east. The name Brankin is not common in Ireland or the States. Edward died in Philadelphia July 18<sup>th</sup>. 1869 aged 70. The name Brankin is found in small numbers along the east coast of Lough Neagh near the town of Lisburn. He had also served in Co G 27<sup>th</sup> Regt. Buried New Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia. Plot Section U Range 3 Lot 5 2<sup>nd</sup> from East.

**Brennan John** Private Aug 20th 1862 3 Yrs Killed at Fredericksburg Dec.13th 1862.

**Bronson George C.** Drafted soldier. Private Oct.21st 1863 3 Yrs Drafted soldier. Wounded at North Anna River Va. May 26th 1864. Discharged by G.O. June 5th 1865. Buried Hillside Cem. Susquehanna Co. Pa. Born 1834 Pa. Died 1908 Susquehanna Co. Pa. Wife Eliza Robinson. 1836-1891.

**Brush Richard** Private Jan 22nd 1864 3 Yrs Wounded and captured at Reams Station August 25th 1864. Died at Annapolis Sept. 15th 1864.

**Burke John** Private Jan 22nd 1864 3 Yrs Died Sept 14th of wounds received at Petersburg June 22nd 1864. Unknown burial place.

**Carr Bernard** Private May 5th 1861 aged 20 3 Yrs Killed at Savage Station June 29th 1862. Buried in National Cemetery Antietam Md. Section 26 Lot A Grave 81. (Photo headstone Antietam). Had transferred from the 27<sup>th</sup>. Regt.

**Casney Michael** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Nov. 16th 1862.

**Caulfield Alban B.** Musician May 28th 1861 3 Yrs Prom. to Principle Musician date unknown

**Cheeseman Edward** Private July 22nd 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864. Absent at muster out.

**\* \* Clay James (Co DONEGAL)** Private May 5th 1865 3 Yrs Born Co. Donegal Ireland: Enlisted May 5th 1861 aged 35. Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 accidentally by a caanister fired by the 1<sup>st</sup> New York .Wounded in head and died. Event took place early afternoon. Of 3<sup>rd</sup> July. Buried Gettysburg National Cemetery Pa section A-34.

**\* \* Coakley Cornelius (Co. CORK)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Cork Ireland : Fought Gettysburg. Wounded at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864. Transferred to Vet. Res. Corps. Discharged by General Ord. July 12th 1865. Appears in a Omaha Nebraska GAR Post 7 list. Assume after the war he went to Nebraska. Was as GAR post member in Omaha Neb. Buried in the Wood National Cemetery Milwaukee Wisconsin. Plot 24 231.

**Coakley John** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Cole Bernard** Private May 28th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded and captured at Spotsylvania

Court House May 12th 1864. Discharged Jan 25th 1865.

**\* \* Colgan Patrick (Co. TYRONE)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland 1837. Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Gun shot to left side and mouth. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Date unknown. He had also served in the 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. Died Philadelphia Sept. 15<sup>th</sup>. 1890. Buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia Section B Range 7 Lot 19 grave 2<sup>nd</sup> from West. @.

**Collins Alexander** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded Antietam. "Mustered out Sept 3rd 1864 expiration of term.

**Collins James** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Savage Station Va. June 29th 1862.

**Corcoran John** Private May 28th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded and captured at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864. Discharged Jan 25th 1865.

**\* \* Coyle James (Co. TYRONE)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Buried in the National Cemetery Pa. section A-35.

**\* \* Daly James (Co. Tyrone)** Born 1818. Initially joined the 27<sup>th</sup> Pa as Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs. Transferred to 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Co. G August 29<sup>th</sup> 1861. By March 1<sup>st</sup> 1862 was sick at Harpers Ferry April 1862 and hospitalised Md. Annapolis and discharged for "chronic ulcers from varicose veins" June 12<sup>th</sup> 1862 Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Died Sept 20<sup>th</sup> 1886. Buried in the Saint Elizabeth Hospital East Cemetery Anacostia D.C. Plot L2 Row 6 # 19. @.

**### Dennison Hugh** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland: Deserted Aug. 28th 1862.

**Denny James W** Private Oct. 22nd 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Wounded at Cold Harbour June 6th 1864. Absent at muster out. He was a drafted soldier drafted 22<sup>nd</sup> Oct 1863 at Scranton Pa and mustered in same day. Transferred to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. date unknown. Absent from date unknown since 6<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Had been wounded at Cold Harbour.

**Devine Peter** Musician April 14th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Date unknown.

**Devlin James** Private Enrolled 5<sup>th</sup> May 1861 for 3 Yrs as 17 year old musician. He had transferred from Co G. of the 27<sup>th</sup>. Reg 1<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861. (According Bates). Deserted April 8th 1863 at Falmouth Va. Light complexion 5ft 4ins blue eyes, fair hair and gave his occupation as a farmer.

**Dillon John** Private Jan 30th 1865 3 Yrs Deserted April 28th 1865.

**\* \* Donahue Hugh (Co. TYRONE)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland : Fought Gettysburg. Mustered out May 5th 1864 expiration of term.

**\* \* Dooner Michael (Co. TYRONE)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out May 5th 1864 expiration of term. Died 18<sup>th</sup> Feb. 1889. Buried Hampton National Cemetery Hampton City Va. Plot F11 6097 +.

**Dougherty Edward** Private drafted soldier on July 8th 1863 3 Yrs aged 39 at Philadelphia and mustered in same day Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Had been transferred from Co A 71<sup>st</sup> Pa.

**Dwyer Michael** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Sept

24th 1862.

**Etzel Christain** (Oetzel) Private. Mustered in 1864 as Oetzel. Note the name spelling varies. Mustered out 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865. Died 29<sup>th</sup> Aug 1928. Buried in the Soldiers circle at Shamokin cemetery Northumberland Co. Pa. Applied for pension 17<sup>th</sup> Jan 1868.

**Felker John** Private Feb 28th 1864 3 Yrs Captured at Jerusalem Plank Rd. Petersburg Va June 22nd 1864 Exchanged April 3rd 1865. Absent at muster out. Had joined Feb 1864. Was from Lancaster Co,

**Fie George** G Private Wounded at Hatchers Run Va 25.3.1865 Discharged by G.O. 21.7.1865. Born Barren Hill Pa 1830 died Nov 19<sup>th</sup> 1898. Married Elizabeth Thompson of Lower Roxborough in 1861 then enlisted in the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. Infantry and served throughout the war being twice wounded. Left a widow and 5 children. Was transferred to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa when the 71<sup>st</sup> was disbanded in June 1864. He was a drafted soldier. Buried in Leverington Cemetery Roxborough Philadelphia Co. Pa. Plot lot 6 Section 1 Div D.

**Fike Samuel** Private Oct 21st 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863.

**Fitzgerald John** Musician April 14th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged by Gen. Order. June 9th 1865.

**\*\* Fleming William** (Co. TYRONE) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Born Co Tyrone. Hospital steward.

**\*\* Flynn Thomas** (Co. DUBLIN) Private April 18th 1865 3 Yrs Born Co Dublin. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Foote Myron L** Drafted soldier. Private Oct. 21st 1863 3Yrs Transferred to Vet. Res. Corp date unknown. Mustered in Scranton Pa. 21<sup>st</sup> Oct 1863 aged 25. As fife major. Transferred to 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Later transferred on date unknown to the Invalid Reserve Corps. Born 1838 died 1897. Buried in the Newman Cem. Gt Bend Susquehanna Co. Pa. Married to Rachel who lived 1842-1940. Some times name as Foot. Age in 71<sup>st</sup> rolls at muster in as 34. Was originally from Susquehannah Co. Gt Bend Boro township.

**Friel James** Private May 1861 3 Yrs Died April 1st of wounds received at Hatchers Run March 25th 1865. He had received very bad leg wounds.

**Gallagher Andrew** An example of the number of "paper transfers" from the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa at the end of the war. He had enlisted in the 71<sup>st</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Aug 1861 to Corporal 1<sup>st</sup> March 1863 captured at Gettysburg 1<sup>st</sup> March 1863, He survived until he died in prison Richmond Va. where he died from dysentery 3<sup>rd</sup> April 1864 and name transferred to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa records. NOTE. There appears to be confusion between the records of an Andrew Gallagher of the 69<sup>th</sup> and one in the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. As transvers took place took place at the end of the war from the 71<sup>st</sup> to the 69<sup>th</sup> keep in mind that it may be duplicate paperwork or indeed two soldiers with the same name. See muster rolls.

**\*\* Garvin Patrick** (Co. TYRONE) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Killed at The Wilderness Va. May 6th 1864. He had enlisted 5.5.1861 aged

32 Had been transferred from Co. G. of the 27<sup>th</sup> Regt. 1.10. 1861. It is thought that his body was never found probably lost in the many fires associated with that campaign.

**Gerloff Frederick** Drafted soldier. Private Sept. 11<sup>th</sup> 1863 3 Yrs. Killed at Wilderness Va. May 6<sup>th</sup> 1864. Buried at the National Cemetery Arlington. Plot 13 Site 6452. Born 26<sup>th</sup> Sept 1833 and baptised Zion's Blue Mountain Strausstown Berks Co. Pa. 24<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1833. Parents Frederick and Catherine Gerloff. Married Malinda Sauervine born about 1834. Three children Isaac W Gerloff born 10<sup>th</sup> April 1854 Jackson Township Lebanon Co. Pa. Morris Gerloff born 15<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1856 Jackson Township and John Gerloff born 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1860 Jackson Township. Gerloff actually fought with the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. until he was wounded in the left thigh at the battle of the Wilderness in May 6<sup>th</sup> 1864. He never recovered and was transferred for administrative purposes in June 1864 and died June 26<sup>th</sup> 1864. Some handed down family history suggests that his grandfather Gottfried Karloff a British soldier was captured at the battle of Saratoga serving under General Burgoyne. He was of German stock.

**Gessinger Samuel aka Charles Dunbar** Private Died Feb 9<sup>th</sup> 1913. Buried National Cemetery Dayton Mont Co. Ohio. Plot 1 1149. As well as serving in the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. also served in Co. B 6<sup>th</sup> Ohio Cav.

**Gordon Robert** Private July 31<sup>st</sup> 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Captured at Petersburg June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1864. Died at Andersonville Ga. Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> 1864 of scorbutus. Grave 11,806

**Haley James** Private Feb 1<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Wounded and captured at Spotsylvania Court House Va. May 12<sup>th</sup> 1864. Held at Andersonville Prison Ga. Survived. Absent at muster out.

**Haley John** Private April 16<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Captured at Spotsylvania Court House Va May 12<sup>th</sup> 1864. Absent at muster out.

**Hall Robert** Private Born England. May 5<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out May 15<sup>th</sup> 1864 expiration of term. Fought at the Wall Gettysburg. Spent final days in Old Soldiers Home Va. A single man. Badly troubled by rheumatism Died aged 83 April 15<sup>th</sup> 1899. Buried in the Hampton National Cemetery, Hampton City Va. Plot Phoebus Section plot 7730. @ M.

**Hough Joseph** Sergt. Feb 2<sup>nd</sup> 1862 3 Yrs Prom. to Sergt. Jan 6<sup>th</sup> 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865.

**Jones Jerry H.** Private Sept. 25<sup>th</sup> 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Deserted April 28<sup>th</sup> 1864.

**Jones Joseph J** Private Aug. 31<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Jordan Thomas** Born 1835 .Sergt. May 5<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out May 5<sup>th</sup> 1864 expiration of term. A stevedore by trade. Wife Josephne Richardson . Thomas also served in the 27<sup>th</sup> Pa Co. G . Lived at 316 Oregon Ave, Southwark Philadelphia. Died March 7<sup>th</sup> 1895 aged 58. Wife Josephine. Buried Fernwood Cemetery Fernwood Del. Co. Pa. Lot 416 Section 45.

**Joslin Reuben** Private July 31<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Absent wounded at muster out.

**### Keefe Patrick** Private May 5<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland. Taken prisoner at

Savage Station Hospital and later paroled by the Confederates. Later deserted from hospital in Wash. D.C. Deserted Nov.5th 1862.

**Keen George W.** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at The Wilderness May 6th 1864. Absent at muster out. Teamster in the regiment.

**\* \* Kelly Hugh** (Co. TYRONE) Sergt May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland 1837 : Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Died 20.7.1863 aged 24. Buried Old St. Michaels Cemetery Philadelphia. Grave R-15.2

**Krock William** Private Sept.24th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Discharged by G.O. Aug.23rd 1865.

**\* \* Lacey James** (Co. DUBLIN) Corp May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Absent at muster out. Born Co. Dublin. Examination of papers associated with his death solicitors files on claims associated with subsequent pension claims by his son no doubt acting on behalf of his mother show that Michael had died in 1869. His widow herself never seemed to have staked a pension claim as she herself was dead by May 25<sup>th</sup> 1880. Probably a death date for Michael would be dead by 1869.

**Lanaghan Jeremiah** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Died date unknown.

**\* \* Lane Jeremiah** (Co CORK) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Oct.6th 1862 as he had developed bad medical problems. He died in Philadelphia Nov 17<sup>th</sup> 1864 and is buried in the Old Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia plot S-3-67.@

**\* \* Loan Patrick (Lane).** (Co. TYRONE) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland: Enrolled 5th May 1861 aged 24. Born 29<sup>th</sup> Feb 1833 Fought Gettysburg. Mustered out May 5th 1864 expiration of. term. Transferred from 27th Regt. 10th Jan 1861 . Alive in Philadelphia April 1904. It is noted that by Dec 27<sup>th</sup> 1879 he was alive and in receipt on a pension. Wife Mary died 1896. Loan and his father Patrick, mother Mary son John and daughter Mary are all buried in Plot Q-6-11 .Two infant children Charles died 1885 and Catherine died 1886 are buried with grandparents.@ M.

**Langdon Israel C.** Corp. Feb 24th 1864 3 Yrs Prom. to Corp Jan 6th 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**\* \* Laracy James** (Co. DUBLIN) Corp Enlisted Philadelphia 5<sup>th</sup> May 1861. He had transferred from Co. G of the 27<sup>th</sup> Regt. Wounded 3<sup>rd</sup> July 1863 at Gettysburg. Brother to Michael below. Both born Dublin Ireland. Was a bricklayer before the war.

Wife Ann his widow died Aug 4<sup>th</sup> 1901 and is buried in nthe Hillside Cemetery. Wounded by “friendly fire” as was his brother by Cowens artillery at Gettysburg.

Buried Dayton National cemetery plot B-4-20. Enlisted initially in the 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. @ M

**\* \* Laracy Michael ( aka Larcey Larressy)** (Co. DUBLIN) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs . Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 by Cowens “friendly fire”. Initially in the 27<sup>th</sup> like his brother. A dyer by trade. Mustered out May 5th 1864 expiration of term. Michaels wife died aged 50 some years before Michael who died June 10<sup>th</sup> 1871. He is buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetetry Philly. in plot Section M Range

10, number 502 from east. She is buried in St Michaels cemetery in Philadelphia,  
**Loughran James** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Enlisted and M.I. Philadelphia aged 38. Absent sick since 5.4.1863 . Absent sick at muster out.

**Ley James** Private July 10th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out July 15th 1864 expiration of term.

**### Maddon James** Born Ireland as were his parents John Madden and Ann Watson. Enlisted as Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Nov.3rd 1862. Died 26<sup>th</sup> Sept 1910 and noted aged 79 and died from senile debility.. Buried Holy Sepulchre Cemetery Roslyn Mont Co Pa, Grave plot 8.32.5.2. From his records it states that was that of a sailor. Spent last years as invalid in Soldiers Home. Listed on GAR monument Market Sq. Germanstown Pa. 1910.

**Mallon Cornelius** Private May 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Oct.3rd 1862.

**Malone Charles** Private Sept 1st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Nov.28th 1863.

**\* \* McAleer Michael (Co. TYRONE)** Sergt. May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland Joined May 5th 1861 in Philadelphia and mustered in on same day as a Corporal. Fought at Gettysburg. Mustered out July 1st 1865 expiration of term. He had transferred from Co. G of the 27th Regt. Died Philadelphia 24<sup>th</sup> April 1911. Buried in the Holy Sepulchre Cemetery Philadelphia. Died aged 71. Was a married man. Born Ireland as was his parents Michael and Mary. Michael was a morocco leather worker. Lived at 45 Alleghany Ave Philadelphia. Buried April 28<sup>th</sup> 1911. Buried plot A.13.51.@ M.

**\* \* McAnally Charles (Co. DERRY)** M.O.H Capt. Aug.19th 1861 3 Yrs Born Glenviggan Sixtowns Co. Derry Ireland. Prom. from 1st Lieut to Capt. Oct. 4th 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. ( See web pages for extensive information)

**\* \* McCann Edward (Co. DERRY)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Magherafelt Co. Derry. Fought at Gettysburg. Died at Washington D.C. Sept 27th 1863. Buried in U.S Soldiers and Airmens Military Cemetery Washington D.C. Born 1831 Died Sept 27<sup>th</sup> 1863. Grave site D 5286. Had married in Magherafelt to Rose ? and very soon they left for America. Three children born there. After Edward died Rose remarried and had at least one child a son called Cornelius who died young and is buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.. Rose is buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery .Rose died Jan 12 1914. Edward died an horrific death in the Lincoln Hospital in Wash D.C Sept 27<sup>th</sup> 1863 per the report of a surgeons paper on his death. He died from chronic diarrhoea and hepatic abscess .The autopsy taken 14 hours after his death makes grim reading. (See bio).

**\* \* McCann Henry (Co. DERRY)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Enlisted Philadelphia 5.5.1861 and mustered in same day aged 28. Transferred from 27th Pa 1.10.1861 like Edward above. Henry had married Sarah O'Neill in St Michaels church Philadelphia 21<sup>st</sup> Oct 1847. Married by the Rev William Loughran and document later countersigned by the Rev Thomas Kiernon. In early 1862 Henry ended up in hospital at Camp Observation Md. with fatal lung and chest problems and Surgeon Bierwith left a note for the 71<sup>st</sup> Reg medical staff on 25 Feb 1862



basically informing them that Henry was dieing. He did died on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 1862. In his papers he referred to himself as a carpet weaver.. Not on muster out roll. Probably a brother to Edward McCann Co. B. (above) Interesting he referred to himself as a weaver a trade he could well have learnt back in Ireland especially along the shores of Lough Neagh close to Magherafelt Co. Derry an area well known for linen weaving in the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

**McCartney Henry** Corp May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged date unknown for wounds received at Antietam Sept 17th 1862.

\* \* **McCauley James** (Co. ANTRIM) Sergt. May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out May 5th expiration of term. Born Co. Antrim.

### **McCrea Michael** ( Co.Tyrone). Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out May 5th 1864 expiration of term. Worked in the ambulance corps. Sadly Michael ended up his life as a pauper living in the Blockley Alms House. In normal circumstances when he died he would be buried in its associated cemetery. However when he did die and his sister went to claim his body she was told the corpse was missing. It was obviously sold on or corpse passed on to corpse traders supplying corpses to hospitals for teaching purposes. Like Capt Charles McAnally his remains probably ended up as dissected body parts strewn in many places. A shocking end for a good man who probably gave compassionate ambulance service at Gettysburg. Said to have been a weaver by trade.

### **McCosker (McCusker) Bernard** (Co. DERRY) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland. Co. Derry. Died from typhoid fever contracted at Bolivar Heights Va Oct 1862. Died 28th Oct 1862 at 415 Front St Callowhill Philladelphia 11th. ward. Buried Old Cathedral cemetery 3rd Nov 1862. Plot V-1-30 approx. Was a single man aged 30.Note this name has various spellings such as McOscar, McCusker, McCoaker etc. A common name in south Co. Derry.

**McDevitt Charles** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Sept. 24th 1863.

**McDevitt John** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs

McDonough Daniel Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Savage Station Va. June 29th 1862.

\* \* **McErlane Richard** (Co. DERRY) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Newbridge Creagh Magherafelt Co. Derry Ireland to Bernard Patrick McErlain and Ann McKindless. Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd. 1863. No known burial place. See more detail on pages on website about soldiers from south Co. Derry.

\* \* **McGinness Vasy** (Co. ANTRIM) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs born Co Antrim. Initially joined the 27th Pa. mid summer 1861 then transferred into the 69th and served until June 2nd 1862 when he was captured by Confederates when doing picket duty. Held in prison in Salisbury N.C. until paroled Sept 13th. 1862. On returning to Camp Baker during parole procedures he injured himself with a hatchet. He was discharged Jan 12th 1863 without ever returning to duty. Died 29th May 1901. Buried in the Hampton National Cemetery Hampton Va. Plot 8134. Section C. ( Headstone photo)

**McGinnis Andrew** Private May th 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

\* \* **McIntyre James** (Co. DONEGAL) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Donegal Ireland: Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Buried in National Cemetery Gettysburg Section A Grave 33.

**McKeever William** Private July 24th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted in July 24th 1863 aged 29 at Pottsville Pa. Mustered in on same day. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Dec. 4th 1864. Had transferred from Co. G. of the 71st. on 12.6.1864 Buried in the Alida Cemetery in Geary Co. Kansas.

**McKeown James** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Captured at Petersburg June 22nd 1864. Held at Andersonville Ga. Contracted scorbutus and died at Andersonville Ga 8th Nov. 1864. Possibly also known as McCune. Grave 11909

### **McKeown Samuel** 1st Lieut Nov.1st 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland 1818 to English parents. Had already been an officer in Co. G of the 10th Regt. U.S. Infantry stationed Ft. Bridger. Whilst at Ft. Bridget he and his English born wife Martha had two sons John and James. Prior to the outbreak of the Civil War the 10th Regt returned to its base at Carlisle Pa. McKeown then joined the 27th. Pa Volunteers Co. G. He and most of this Co. transferred to the 69th Pa.Vols. in Nov. 1861 at Camp Observation Md. Wounded at Glendale and Fredericksburg and disabled he was discharged from the Army March 20th. 1863. He then went to Wash D.C. and joined the Vet. Res. Corps and was a Capt in Batt. E. 5th Artillery until discharged in June 1866. Applied for and got a pension of \$7 dollars a month. He and wife lived on this in Philadelphia. Pension later cancelled and they moved to Kinney Co. Tx. Later they returned to Philadelphia. Prior to April 1873 McKeown obtained a position as superintendent at the Florence National Cemetery at Florence S.C. and took up his position there in April 1873. In his time there he made many improvements to the cemetery. McKeown died there Feb. 12th 1882 and buried in the cemetery in grave B2993. Samuel and wife Martha are listed in the 1870 census as living in Philadelphia's 19th ward 57th District with two sons John and James aged 11 and 9. (

Samuel had been employed at the graveyard superintendent from April 1873 until he died 12th Feb 1882. He lived in a house on the site and in his years there has made many improvements to the Civil War part of the cemetery. He was responsible for building the stout red brick surround wall and adjusting the grave markers. It is noted that he suffered quite a lot of problems in the 1870s after the withdrawal of Federal troops with some locals who still had Confederate tendencies. The Stars and Stripes on the flag pole caused them annoyance!. Some more layout adjustments also took place in the 1950's.

**McLane John** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**McLaughlin Frank** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Transferred to Vet Res. Corps Dec.14th 1863.

**McLaughlin Joseph** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Died at Windmill Point Va.Feb 1st 1863.

**McManus Bernard** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Enlisted 5th May 1861 in

Philadelphia and mustered in same date. Mustered out May 5th 1864 expiration of term. Transferred from Co. G 27th Regt. 1st Oct. 1861

**\* \* McManus Thomas** (Co. FERMANAGH) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. April 19th 1863 Born Co. Fermanagh 1834. A carpenter by trade. Wife Susahha also born Ireland. Buried St Michaels cemetery Philadelphia,

**McMullen William G.** Drafted Soldier. Private July 25th 1863 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Transferred from Co. G 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. 12.6.1864

**### McNamee Hugh** Corp May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Jan 12th 1863. Born 1833 Ireland Died Dec. 23<sup>rd</sup> 1874 aged 41. A carpenter by trade. Wife Susanna also born Ireland. Oldest child Mary A McNamee born in Philadelphia. Buried in Old St Michaels cemetery Philadelphia.

**McRanigan John** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged Nov. 30th 1862 to enlist in cavalry service.

**\* \* McReynolds Thomas** (Co. DERRY) Private Enlisted May 5th 1861 for 3 Yrs Discharged Feb 26<sup>th</sup> 1864 a period of 2 years, 9 months and 21 days. Apart from his war service Thomas worked all his life in the leather trade being noted in many publications as a dresser or leather worker. The dresser being a term used for someone who processes the animal skins prior to being processed as leather. A fairly awful job. Finally in the 1905 Directory he is listed as living at 209 Jefferson St having lived in various streets in the city. However things would appear to have gone bad for Thomas as he is listed in the Philadelphia Almshouse and Hospital in the 1910 Thirteenth Census of the U.S. He was aged 66 and had been married 42 years. Thomas died in the above institution Nov 3<sup>rd</sup> 1909. Thomas died in the institution 3<sup>rd</sup> Nov. 1912. His death cert states that he and his parents both born Ireland. Father William and mother Alice Heron. In the earlier 1870 51<sup>st</sup> District census of Philadelphia Germanstown Road Thomas is noted as living with his parents William and Alice and possibly a younger sister Kate possibly a sister or relative. Kate listed as being 13 and Thomas 26 Fought Gettysburg. Deserted April 28th 1864. At enlistment his PA Civil war cards record state he enlisted at Stevensburg 5<sup>th</sup> May 1861, He was of fair complexion 5ft 4 1/2 ins. Tall blue eyes dark hair and was a farmer. He had re-enlisted Stevensburg 1<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861, William Reynolds his father died 30<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1880 and his mother Alice died 30<sup>th</sup> Aug 1903. They are buried with Thomas in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia Section O Range 5 No 45 grave 1. Annie the wife of Thomas is buried in the Old Cathedral cemetery in plot J-7-26.@

**\* \* Middleton Alexander** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs From Co. Tyrone. Mustered out May 5th 1864. He would appear to have joined a cavalry unit and noted as mustering out at Fort Snelling Minn. in 1868.

**Miller Charles H.** Private June 13th 1864 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Miller John P.** Private June 23rd 1864 3 Yrs Absent without leave at muster out.

**Moran Augustine** Private Sept 25th 1863. 3 Yrs Drafted. Mustered out with Co.

July 1st 1865.

**### Moran Patrick** Capt. May 5th 1861 3Yrs Born Ireland Prom. from 1st Lieut. Sept 18th 1862. Discharged for wounds received near Richmond June 26th 1862. Entered the Pa DVS 24.6.1890 aged 58. Died in California and is buried in Vets Memorial Grove Cemetery, Yountville Napa Co. Pa. Plot Sec A Row 13 Grave 15

**\* \* Mullen Michael (Co. DERRY)** Lieut May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co Derry Ireland Com. 2nd Lieut. Feb 21st 1863. Not mustered. Wounded Antietam. Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Died 2nd. Corps hospital aged 27 July 7th 1863. Buried at National Cemetery Gettysburg Pa section A-50

**### Murphy Patrick** Enlisted as Pvte Co G 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. Inf, May 5<sup>th</sup> 1861-Sept 1861 and then Co G 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Sept 1861 - June 4<sup>th</sup> 1864 a period of 3 years 1 month. Wounded right hand and shoulder at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Gun shot left leg at Pleasant Hill April 8th 1864. Lost sight right eye 1896. Mustered out May 5th 1864. Gave his next of kin as Mrs Margaret Smith of Germanstown Pa, Gave trade as labourer as trade. Last record of him as living in Soldiers Home in Milwaukee Wisconsin.

**Myers George** Private Aug 6th 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Nixon George** Private July 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Nixon John F.** Private Jan 1864 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. date unknown.

**\* \* Noonan Patrick** (Co. CORK) Sergt. May 5th 1865 3 Yrs Born Co. Cork Ireland: Wounded in chest at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 . Also wounded Savage Station. After Gettysburg spent a time in hospital Mustered out expiration of term May 5th 1864. Returned home to Philadelphia and worked in the rolling mills of James Rollins. However he would appear to have headed west into Ohio, Indiana, Missouri, Colorado and finally Arizona. He settled in Falstaff Az and worked for the firm of Mr J.F Hawk. He applied for a pension July 16<sup>th</sup> 1874 and received application No. 194602 and certificate No. 132,282. In Falstaff he joined the GAR society Falstaff's Ransom Post and was the first comrade to be buried by the Ransom Post. Obviously a very popular old soldier his comrades on his death Jan 2<sup>nd</sup> 1887 took over all his funeral arrangements to the Greenwood Cemetery Falstaff Az. Part of an entry in the Arizona Champion Sat Jan 15<sup>th</sup> 1887 states " that we members of the Ransom Post GAR unanimously express our profound grief at the decease of our worthy comrade and that this resolution be entered on the minutes of our proceedings " Noonan never married. Sadly the Greenwood cemetery became extinct and the transfer of all the identifiable remains was never completed and later what remained of the cemetery was tarred over and lost to history. Some remains were apparently removed to the Citizens Cemetery. The cemetery now in the Thorp Park area of the city of Falstaff and remainder of cemetery in area of the tennis courts!. Also he apparently spent some two years in St Louis Missouri where he had an uncle Edward A Noonan held many high positions in the city and was at a time a judge in the St Louis Court of

Correction. His uncle being born in Pa. This uncle buried in the Cavalry Cemetery St Louis Ms.

**\* \*O'Connor John (Co. TYRONE)** Sergt. May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Urney town land on the Tyrone -Donegal border near Strabane. Ireland; Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Buried Gettysburg Nat. Cem. Pa section B-68 .John had also served in Co. G of the 27th Pa. His parents John O'Connor and Margaret Boyle who married circa 1823 in Ireland. John was also born Ireland before family emigrated. After John was killed a Father James Connolly the priest in the parish of Urny corresponded with the Pension office in Wash. giving details of what he knew about Johns parents marriage. This cleric was heavily involved helping famine victims in the 1848 Irish famine. He himself was born and raised at Moyard Ballinascreen (Draperstown) Co. Derry. He most certainly have known of the numerous 69<sup>th</sup> soldiers whose families came from that area. He himself is buried in St Columbs church cemetery Castlefin Co. Donegal on the Tyrone Donegal border. Johns marker in the Natonal Cemetery at Gettysburg is wrongly transcribed but proven in Jan 2016 that it is indeed John O'Connors grave.

**O'Daniel Cyrus** Corp May 5th 1861 3 Yrs A descendant of a Daniel O'Daniel an indentured servant who emigrated from Co. Offaly Ireland in 1746. Was promoted to Corp. just before the battle of Gettysburg. Was wounded twice at The Wall by what was "friendly fire" from Cowan's cannon fire from a position just behind Co. G. Also shot through the arm and the bullet lodged in his chest and remained there the remainder of his life. After recuperation was in the Reserve Corps in Wash. D.C. where he served out his enlistment period. He later was a police man in Philadelphia's 15th district. Married Sarah (Rachel) and had two daughters. When he was 53 he took ill and moved into the the Southern Branch National Homes for D.V.S. at Hampton Va. Died there Feb. 28th 1895 and is buried in Grave 7064 in the National Cemetery , Cemetery Road. Marshall Ave. Hampton Section D Phoebus Section. He would have been born circa 1841. Absent at muster out.

**O'Neill Patrick** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Sept 13th 1862

**O'Neill Mark** Private. May 5<sup>th</sup> 1861. 3yrs.M.I.May5<sup>th</sup> 1861.He had been discharged from Co. G 27<sup>th</sup>. Regt. See M.O.R. Co. G 59<sup>th</sup>. Regt. Nothing else known about him as now.

**Oetzel Christian** Private Mar 27th 1864 3 Yrs Drafted. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. See Etzel above.

**Parkinson James** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Transferred from the 27th Pa to Co. G of the 69th. Took ill in Nov 1862 with dysentery and sent hospital in Fort Schuyler N.Y. Died there and is buried Cypress Hill Cemetery Long Island .

**Peart Andrew** Private July 15th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Missing in action. date unknown.

**Percell Fontaine W.** Sergt. July 20th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Prom. to Sergt. Feb 18th 1865.Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.Born 1831 Pa. Died Philadelphia Nov 5<sup>th</sup> 1889. Buried in the now defunct Monument Cemetery He may well have had a

government marker erected on his grave.. Monument cemetery was located at Broad and Berks Sr. Philadelphia. The remains were removed in 1953 to Lawnview Cemetery Rockledge Pa. Many headstones and markers from the cemetery and dumped in a local river. It is assumed that Percells remains were moved to Lawnview..

**Petersen George** Private July 30th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Deserted date unknown.

**Pfanders Frederick** Private April 30th 1864 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Pierce George** Private Aug 19th 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Quinn Mark** Private Enrolled May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded Antietam. Discharged on Surgeons Cert Dec. 2nd 1862. Enrolled aged 29.. Has transferred from Co G 27<sup>th</sup> Regt 1<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861.

**Quinn Matthew** Private Enrolled May 5th 1863 3 Yrs aged 27. Discharged May 14th 1863 . Had transferred from Co. G 27<sup>th</sup> Reg 1<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861. Wounded 13<sup>th</sup> Dec 1862 at Fredericksburg Va.

**Renner John** Private Oct.14th 1863. 3 Yrs Drafted. Absent sick at muster out.

**Rice James** Private Dec.17th 1862. 3 Yrs Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Buried in National Cemetery Gettysburg Pa section A-36. Had enlisted aged 18.

**Rough David** Private July 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Captured at Petersburg Va. June 22nd 1864. Held Andersonville Va. Died at Camp Millen Ga. on date unknown. Not buried Andersonville.

**Rowe J** Private May 5th. 1861 3 Yrs Captured and held in Andersonville. Moved to Millen Ga. Died there (This record taken off the Andersonville file)

**### Ryan Thomas** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland 1840. Killed on picket duty Fair Oaks Va. June 21st. 1862 aged 22. with gunshot to the head. Buried 1st July 1862 St. Annes Cathedral Corner of Le High-Aramingo St Philadelphia. A single man. Lived at Coral above Huntington Philadelphia.

**Schmalswicks Christian** Private. Enlisted in the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa Co H 26<sup>th</sup> June 1861 aged 18 at Pottsville Pa. Transferred to Co G 69<sup>th</sup> Pa June 12<sup>th</sup> 1864. There will probably be various spellings of name eg Schmalzriedt.etc. In the 69<sup>th</sup> P.A. Card file he is named as Christian Schmalswicks Co H 71<sup>st</sup> who transferred to Co. G of the 69<sup>th</sup> on 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Rolls also show middle initial as H. Also enlisted aged 18. Buried Woodmere Cemetery Detroit Mich Plot A2 196. @. M.

**Schwartz Henry** Private Dec.15th 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Aug 20th 1867.

**\*\* Scott Thomas (Co. DERRY)** Private May 5th 1863 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Wounded at Glendale: Fought at Gettysburg. Transferred to Vet. Res, Corps Nov. 10th 1863. Enlisted Philadelphia 5.5.1861 aged 44 Fair hair blue eyes weaver by trade. Had transferred from Co G 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. on 1.10.1861 Invalided out 20.11.1863 having been wounded at Fair Oaks but served until Antietam when he was transferred to the ambulance corps serving at Fredericksburg, Chancellorville, Gettysburg, but deserted from here July 8<sup>th</sup> 1863. Later reported to hospital Philadelphia but discharged as invalid Nov. 11<sup>th</sup> 1863.

**Scully Martin** Born 1844 England Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded in the arm at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Absent at muster out. Died April. 23<sup>rd</sup> 1913

Philadelphia. Buried New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.

**Serfass Linford** Private Sept 28th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Mustered out with Co. July 14th 1865. Born Aug 7<sup>th</sup> 1825. Chestnut Hill Northampton Pa. Died Sept 29<sup>th</sup> 1902 Carbon Co. Pa. Also served in the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. Buried Jerusalem Union Cemetery Trachsville Carbon Co. Pa.

**### Shea Timothy** Private Sept 1st 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland; "Deserted July 1st 1862.

**Sherry Bernard** Born Philadelphia 1841. 1st Lieut. May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Prom. from Sergt. to 2nd Lieut. March 31st 1863 and to 1st Lieut May 1st 1863. Discharged May 16th 1864 for absence without leave. Bernard had fought valiantly for the 69th and probably a head wound from earlier in the war at Savage Station may have left its effects. A single man and was a labourer by trade. Commanded Co. G at Gettysburg. After the war he went to Urbana Ill 1866-1884 but returned to Philadelphia and died there 29.11.1896. He lived at 247 Master St . Philadelphia. Buried New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.

**Shuler John** Private June 23rd 1864 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Buried in Christ Lutheran Cemetery Barnesville Schuylkill Co. Pa. Born 24<sup>th</sup> Feb. 1844 died 5<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1929

**\*\* Skinneder James (Co. MONAGHAN)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Monaghan Ireland 1827. He was in Philadelphia by 1851. He married Elizabeth Quinn in St Malachy's Catholic church Philadelphia 2nd Nov. 1851. Their daughter was baptised in St. Malachy's church in 1855 by a Fr. Kelly. He joined the 27th Pa. May 5th 1861 into Co. G. This Co. by Sept. the same year transferred into the 69th. He was fatally wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. However his body was not recovered and no trace exists. Truly Missing in Action. In 1866 Lieut Sherry obviously an honourable man signed testimonial papers on behalf of James' widow Elizabeth Quinn enabling her to obtain a pension of \$8 dollars a month. He stated "Skinneder was mortally wounded and carried from the line". He is probably buried in an unmarked grave somewhere close to Gettysburg. Note this name is unique to Co. Monaghan though there is no mention of where he is from in Ireland he is most certainly from that county.

**Smallgriet Christain** Private Sept 26th 1863. 3 Yrs Substitute. Absent wounded at muster out.

**\*\* Smiley William (Co. DERRY)** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Enlisted May 3rd 1861 Philadelphia. Wounded at the battle of Glendale. Discharged Aug 18th 1864 Germanstown Pa. for wounds to left leg received at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. After the war worked as a dyer in Campbells Mills Monyahunk Pa. At time of his death Dec 17th 1903 he was a widower. Named a John Dunken as next of kin. Dayton Mont. Co. Ohio. Initial pension \$7 then \$12 as from May 18th 1887. On his records his sister in law named as Mary J. Buoris 622 Weston Ave. Dayton Ohio. at death he had \$5.35 on his person and pension due \$108.00 and his personal effects worth zero. Total worth \$119.99. On death records it states that his sister in law named above was notified by telegraph. Buried

National Cemetery Dayton Ohio. Grave N-20-33 (Marker Photo).

**Smith John** Private Sept. 24th 1863 3 Yrs Substitute. Absent wounded at muster out.

**Snow Clinton D** Drafted soldier. Private Oct. 22nd 1863 3 Yrs Scranton Pa. Transferred 71<sup>st</sup> Pa Co. G to Co. G 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Discharged by G.O. June 9th 1865. Born in Pa and lived in New York after the war in Binghamton Broome Co. New York. Was married twice and a possible third time. Firstly to Maria Preston and had two children Maria and Cornelia Snow. Secondly married to Lucinda Clink and had five children Etta, Frederick Glen, Lavinnia B, Clayton Dewitt and Clinton. A possible third wife is named as Jenette Smith and child Mary. He and his family would appear to have lived at times in Pa and sometimes New York. Clinton died Nov 24<sup>th</sup> 1905 aged 68 at his home at 1. Ostego St. Binghamton Broome Co. New York. His body was taken back to Franklin Forks Susquehanna Co. Pa a week later. Funeral held in the M. E. Church ceremony by Rev .M.E. Marsland. Reports of his death carried by The Binghamton Press and Leader Nov 24<sup>th</sup> 1905 and the Montrose Democrat 7<sup>th</sup> Dec 1905. Buried Brookside Cem Franklin Forks Susquehanna Co. Pa. Grave on right hand side of old section. His trade would appear to have been that of a labourer.

**Stilwell Paul O** Drafted soldier. Corp Oct. 22nd 1863 3 Yrs Drafted 22nd Oct 1863. Originally in 71st Pa. Prom. to Corp Jan 6th 1865. Mustered out with Co. at Munsons Hill Va. July 1st 1865. Wages due 200 dollars paid in full at Camp Cadwallader West Philadelphia Was being paid 18 dollars per month. Died 1931 aged 88. Buried Vaughn Mehoopany Cemetery Wyoming Co. Pa. Plot 172. Born June 20th 1843. Wounded at battle of The Wilderness May 7th 1864. In the 1850 and 1860 census was living in Auburn Sesquehanna Co. After the war he was listed in the 1900 and 1910 census along with his wife Rachel (E Champion) living in Mehoopany Wyoming Co. Along with wife Rachel who died in 1921 buried in family plot with their daughter Ida and husband Peter Stayment who was born 18th May 1865 and died 17th June 1940. Also Ida and Peter's son Howard and wife Anna buried in same plot. Ida died 20th Aug 1945. Howard was a private in the U.S. army in WW1. Anna was born 1901 and died 6th Sept 1977. Howard had a brother Sinton who was born in 1877.

**\* \* Stinson Thomas (Co. DERRY)** Private Enlisted 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. May 5<sup>th</sup> 1861 initially 3 Yrs. Then transferred 69<sup>th</sup> Pa as 1<sup>st</sup>. Sergt July 1864. Wounded at Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania. Promoted to brevet 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant June 16<sup>th</sup> 1865 Born Anahorish Newbridge Co. Derry Ireland. Joined same day as James. Brother to James Mustered out July 1st 1865. Burial place and date of death unknown as at 10<sup>th</sup> March 2017. Brother to John and Robert below.

**\* \* Stinson (Stenson) John** (Co. DERRY) Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Anahorish Newbridge Co. Derry Ireland 1829. Fought Gettysburg. Transferred to Vet. Res. Corps Nov 10th 1863. Died in Philadelphia March 15<sup>th</sup> 1864. aged 35 Buried March 18<sup>th</sup> 1864 in the "Old" St Michaels cemetery Philadelphia..

**\* \* Stinson Robert (Co. DERRY)** Sergt. Enlisted 27<sup>th</sup> Pa.. May 5th 1861 aged 22



for 3 Yrs Transferred to 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Born Newbridge Co. Derry Ireland 30. 4. 1840: Fought at Antietam, wounded in hip by shell fragment that penetrated his canteen. Was in hospital at the 4th. and George St hospital Philadelphia for four months 30.9.1862 until 27.1.1863 .Also fought at Gettysburg. Wounded in head and captured at Petersburg Va June 22nd 1864. Sent to Andersonville prison Ga. 31st. Oct 1864. Sent to Camp Lawton Millen Ga. 31st.Oct 1864. Exchanged Vicksburg Miss. April 12th 1865 after having survived near a year in captivity in Andersonville. Suffered greatly from ill health throughout his post wars especially with eye trouble. Two other soldiers friends of his James Milligan of Co. I and James Noon Co. K also incarcerated with Robert during their captivity. Discharged by Gen. Order. June 22nd 1865. As a released prisoner he ended up at Mt. Jackson Miss. 19.4.1865 and at Vicksburg 23. 4. 1865. Was a married man Jane with children Robert, Regina, Cornelius, and Jane all alive in 1897. He was 5ft. 8ins, dark complexion, black hair and grey eyes. Lived initially 822 E. Huntington later to be called 2351 E. Huntington by the mid 1880's (same house). Both Noon and Milligan testified for him in post war pension applications. Buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia 25th March 1897 from his home at 2351 East Huntington St. Buried along with wife Jane Brady Stinson and sons William, Thomas and Cornelius. Died March 25<sup>th</sup> 1897. Buried New Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia. Position M-10-9. @ M.

**Stubbs William C.** Private July 20th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Discharged by G.O. June 15th 1865. Before being drafted in July 1863 he had served in Co. I 19<sup>th</sup> Pa. Co. D and Co K. of the 8<sup>th</sup> Cav. and finally Co G of the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa.

**Sydner Monroe** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Died Nov 5th 1864 of wounds received in action Oct 27th 1864. Buried in National Cemetery Arlington Va

**Tierman Richard** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Mustered out July 14th 1864 expiration of term. Born 1840 Pa. Died June 13<sup>th</sup> 1885. Was wounded at Antietam 17<sup>th</sup> Sept 1862. Buried St Michaels Roman Catholic Cemetery Edgeworth Ave Chester Del Co. Pa. (Note: Not the "Old St Michaels)" where other 69<sup>th</sup> soldiers buried) @ M.

**Toner Michael** Private May 5th 1861 3 yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. May 14th 1863 Born 1834 Died May 4th 1914. Buried New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. Plot S-4-34 @.

**Toy Robert S.** Born 1824 Philadelphia. Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Initially into the 27<sup>th</sup> Pa. then into the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Discharged March 21st 1863 for wounds received at Antietam. Sept 17th 1862. Buried Greenwood Cemetery Philadelphia.

**Vetter Charles** Private July 14th 1864 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Wagner Charles** Private July 19th 1864 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Walrath Herman** Private Jan 19th 1865 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**\*\* Walsh James** (Co. DUBLIN) 1st Sergt. June 1st 1861. 3 Yrs Born Co. Dublin Ireland: Fought at Gettysburg. Wounded at Boydon Road Va. Oct. 27th 1864. Prom to 1st Lieut. Co. F Feb 13th 1865.

**Welsh Patrick** Private Jan 19th 1865 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

\* \* **Wogan John (Co..DUBLIN)** Corp May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Dublin Ireland: Killed at Gettysburg. July 3rd 1863. Buried in National Cemetery Gettysburg Pa section A-32.

**Zane Joseph** Private May 5th 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at North Anna River May 26th 1864. Discharged on Surgeons Cert June 1st 1865. Born Philadelphia 1831 and died Philadelphia 1<sup>st</sup> Feb 1886 .Buried in the Monument Cemetery.
