Atmore (Attmore) Isaac. Drafted into the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Philadelphia Feb 24<sup>th</sup> 1864.aged 39. Mustered in 25<sup>th</sup> Sept 1864. Captured in his very first battle at The Wilderness and held as prisoner of war May 6<sup>th</sup> 1864. Held at the notorious Florence stockade and died there Sept 6<sup>th</sup> 1864. Buried in mass grave pit at the Florence National Cemetery Florence. Florence Co. S. Carolina.

### Baker Michael Private Mustered in Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Nov.15th 1862.Died aged 60 June 13<sup>th</sup> 1880. Labourer by trade. Wife Mary and daughter Annie both of whom died 1898. Annie died Jan 27<sup>th</sup> and Mary April 25<sup>th</sup>. Family lived 531 Gold St. All buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia plot K-7-40.June 15<sup>th</sup> 1880.

**Barr James** 2nd.Lieut. 31st.10th.1861 3 Yrs aged 32 Lived 1842-22.1-1907. Buried Hatboro Cem. Montgomery Co. Pa. Died 22<sup>nd</sup>. Jan. 1907.(Marker image)

**Bradley John** Private 16th Aug. 1861 3 Yrs Enlisted at Pottsville 16th Aug. 1861. Mustered in 31st Oct 1861 at Camp Observation. Aged 32.He was 5'4" grey eyes, fair complexion, lived in Philadelphia. Deserted at Bolivar Heights 31st Oct. 1862. A labourer by trade. Possibly born Ireland.

\* \* Campbell Mark (Co. TYRONE) Private Mar.18th 1864 3 Yrs. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.Born Co. Tyrone 1832 Died Philadelphia Nov 20<sup>th</sup> 1885. Probably buried communal grave at Holy Cross cemetery Yeadon Pa.

Carr James Private Mar.30th 1864 3 Yrs. Aged 34, Absent sick at muster out. Born 1829 in Pa and died 23<sup>rd</sup> May 1904 Dayton Soldiers Home Ohio Buried in Calvary Cemetery Kettering Mont Co. Pa. Grave 22-A-5-2. Had been wounded at the battle at Spotsylvania Va gunshot to right let and lost left eye.

\* \* Cassiday John (Co. MAYO). Pvte. Enrolled 2.9.1861 Philadelphia .M.I. 31.10.1861 Camp Observation Md. Aged 23. Lived in Philadelphia/ Died of gunshot wounds at Gettysburg 3.7.1863. Also name noted as Cassidy on some rolls. Buried Old St. Michaels cemetery Philadelphia .Possibly plot 55.

**Cavanaugh James** Private Enrolled 2<sup>nd</sup> July 1861 aged 19. Noted absent sick at U.S. Gen. Hospital 6<sup>th</sup> May 1864.Had been a member of the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa, Probably a pape transfer while still ill to the 69<sup>th</sup> towards end of hostilities. No other details.

**Clymer William M.** Private. Joined 71<sup>st</sup> Pa initially aged 23 on 14<sup>th</sup> July 1861 but on 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864 transferred to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Died 28<sup>th</sup> Jan 1882. Buried Leverington Cemetery Roxboro Pa. On Nov 29<sup>th</sup> 1862 his wife Elizabeth filed for a widows pension. She died in 1910. Buried Lot 11 Section 6 Div C.

**Collins Patrick** Private July 24th 1863 3 Yrs Discharged by G.O. June 12th 1865

\* \* Connor Peter (Co. TYRONE) Private 3rd. Sept 1862 3 Yrs. Fought at Gettysburg. Discharged by General Order June 9th 1865.

Convery Henry 1st Sergt. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom. from Private to 1st Sergt. Feb.5th 1864. Fought Gettysburg. Comm. 1st Lieut June 16th 1865.Initially joined the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa and transferred to the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864. Not mustered. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. There is a lot of confusion about Henry exactly "which" Henry he is in the records. There are records for a Henry Convery born 1837 or 1839 enlisted in the U.S. Army after the Civil War enlisting in Philadelphia. He served his time in the West having enlisted for a 2<sup>nd</sup> term at Ft Craig New Mexico on 5<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1870. He died of dysentery 11<sup>th</sup> March 1871. It is not known where he is buried. In action with the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Hr was wounded at Jerusalem Plank Road in Petersburg Va. June 1864.

**Dever James** Pvt. Enlisted 31<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861 aged 23 A horse and cart driver. Wounded at battle of Glendale in right foot. Died in hospital July 28<sup>th</sup> 1862. Buried in the Old Cath. Cemetery Philadelphia plot K-3-36.

### Devine Thomas Sergt. 31st.10th. 1861 3 Yrs. Born Ireland: Fought Gettysburg. Killed Spotsylvania Court House May 10th 1864.

**Donahue James** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Enlisted Philadelphia 16th Aug. 1861 and mustered in at Camp Observation Md. 31st Oct.1861. aged 23. Wounded at Glendale Va. 6th March 1862. Transferred to Kirbys Battery 1st U.S. Art. 26th Oct. 1862 per A.G.O.154 Buried Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia Position Q-3-54.

Buried in Owens family plot near the crypts. @

Ecker Charles Private. Was drafted into 71<sup>st</sup> and then transferred into the 69<sup>th</sup>. Pa.. Fought in many battles but was badly wounded Reams Station 24<sup>th</sup> Aug 1964 and died 6<sup>th</sup> Nov 1864 and is buried in the City Point Cemetery Va. Plot 556. @ M. **Gordon Chalkey** Private enlisted Philadelphia 2,9,1861 Philadelphia aged 35. Discharged 16.9.1864. Teamster in the Regt. Native of Philadelphia. Ateamster in the regt. Died 19.10.1888. Buried Mount Peace Cemetery Philadelphia, Lot 17 Section 5 Div A.@

Harp John Private Sept 16th 1861 3 Yrs Was a teamster throughout the war. Born 18.5,1834 died 24.10.1890. A gardener by profession. Mustered out with honourable discharge Sept 16th 1864. expiration of term. He had been a teamster. John married Anne E. Duffy in Philadelphia 13.12.1868 she was 22 and he 34. Two others buried in plot 154 Anna 1870-1902 and Ellis 1871-1923.these probably his children. He born Chestnut Hill Philadelphia on his marriage cert. He was recorded as Episcopalian as also his wife. She born in Ireland and he at Chestnut Hill. Married by the Rev. J. A. Harris. Prior marriage Anna lived at Jackinstown Philadelphia. Anne died Dec. 17th. 1917. He had another daughter named Dhusilla (Mrs Dohler) Buried in the graveyard of the Church of the Redeemer at Bryn Mawy Pa. Plot 154.. (Photo of headstone). Anne had applied for a pension 27th Dec. 1891. Died from diabetes

### Hart Bartholomew Private Sept 16th 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland 1830. Enlisted at

Philadelphia Co H. 1861. 2.9.1861 and Mustered in 31.10.1861. Camp Obs. Md. Fought at Gettysburg. Mustered out Sept 16th 1864 expiration of term. He was working as a gardener in Philadelphia in 1880 He and his wife had seven children. He died in 1887 and is buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery along with his wife and several children.

Hughes (Hughs) Robert S. Boy musician aged 16. Enlisted 28<sup>th</sup> March 1864. Discharged 26<sup>th</sup> May 1865. Died Oct.26<sup>th</sup> 1925. Buried Old Cath. Cemetery Philadelphia. He had been born 1849 Philadelphia. Was discharged S.C.of D.

### Kelly Charles F 2nd Lieut. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Gettysburg July 2nd 1863. Buried Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia. Buried beside brother Thomas Kelly below) Plot J-9-45/47-M @ M.

### Kelly Thomas Capt. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Died May 15th 1864 of wounds received at Spotsylvaina Court House Va May 12th 1861. Aged 34. Buried Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia beside brother Charles above. Plot J-9-45/47-M @ M.

### Loughery Denis Capt.31st.10th. 1861 3 Yrs. Born Ireland probably Co. Derry or Tyrone; Prom. to Corp. Mar.1st 1863.To Sergt. May 1st. 1863. Fought Gettysburg. Prom to Capt. Dec.30th 1864. Wounded Reams Station Aug. 26th 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Died young aged just 28 Oct. 28th 1869 Philadelphia of debility probably from war wounds. Buried Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia.10th Oct 1869.

### Lynch James Little known on this man Joined aged either as 42 or 52 year old. Suffered heart attach and died in Phladelphia in 1864. Trade was a whaleman. (not in Bates listing).

\*\* Lyndon Patrick H, (Co. GALWAY) From Born 1847. Lived at Pittston Pa. Enlisted Philadelphia as substitute soldier 1864 under the usual bounty agreement. Active service until the end of the war in 1865 mustering out at Munsons Hill Va. Then enlisted in the new Regular Army 30<sup>th</sup> Reg Co B and served in the forts of the western plains protecting the railroad construction workers and forts primarily in Wyoming. At the end of his service having attained Corp rank returned back home to Pittston. Died aged 82 in Old Soldiers Home in Wash. D.C. March 2<sup>nd</sup> .1928. Was married to Winifded Maretin a widow. Patrick as a substitute aged 18 year ols who received \$100 for a Mr. Charles Foster of Wi;kes Barre Pa. Died aged 81. Buried in St. John the Evangelist Cemetery Market St. Pittstown Lucerne Co. Pa.

**Mallon (Mellon) Robert** Pvte..Enlisted in the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. 31<sup>st</sup> Dec. 1861 as an assigned recruit under Capt. Frost then sent to Camp Observation and assigned to Co H. He was wounded May 10<sup>th</sup> 1862 at Kent Courthouse Va. And sent to Chesapeake General Hospital at Fort Monroe then St Josephs General Hopital Philadelphia. Returned to duty July 1<sup>st</sup> 1862 at Harrisons Landing. Served with the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Antietam Fredericksburg and Chancellorsville and at the Wall at Gettysburg after which he was hospitalised until the 23<sup>rd</sup> Dec 1863. He was dismissed for rheumatic pains and eye troubles March 26<sup>th</sup> 1864.Robert was born in England .Name spelling varies. Is Melon on the monument at Gettysburg. Died at Hampton Old Soldiers Home Va. Nov 12<sup>th</sup> 1891. Some documents have him in the 69<sup>th</sup> N. Y. But should be P.A. He had enlisted aged 40 Died Nov 12<sup>th</sup> 1892 aged A labourer by trade. Buried

in the Hampton National Cemetery Hampton City. Plot 6550 @ M

**Maroney John** .Initially joined the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. A transferred soldier 71<sup>st</sup> to Pa 69<sup>th</sup>. Was wounded in shoulder whilst with the 71<sup>st</sup>. Pa. Re -enlisted Stevensburg Va. 5<sup>th</sup> Jan 1864. MIA Jersualem Plank Road 22.June 1864. Returned and hospitalised. To VRC 4<sup>th</sup> Feb 1865.Was a labourer by trade. Lived at Old soldiers home in Va. (Sussex Home)

**Miles Daniel** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born 1838 Died Nov. 9th 1864 aged just 25 from wounds received at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863.He had enlisted aged 23 and was from Mountour Co. Pa. Daniel is buried in the Odd Fellows Cemetery Danville Montour Co. Pa. He may well have been buried in an earlier place and a reinterment date of May 15<sup>th</sup> 1886. In the Odd Fellows cemetery. Danville Montour Co. Pa.@.

**McCall James** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Cmp Observation Md. Deserted Fair Oaks Va. June 4th 1862

\* \* McCoy John (Co. ARMAGH) Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Enlisted aged 35 at Philadelphia 2nd Sept. 1861 and mustered in 31st Oct 1861 He was aged 35. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Mar 31st 1863. Died Sept 3<sup>rd</sup> 1876. Spent his last days in the Dayton National Home for Vets. Dayton Ohio. Buried Dayton National Cemetery Dayton Ohio plot A-3-61. Had also served in the U.S Navy. Born Co. Armagh Ireland

## McGrath Thomas Private Sept 4th 1861 3 Yrs Born 1832. Died 27.2.1899 aged 68.Labourer by trade. Widower when he died.. Partially blinded by explosion during the war. Mustered out Sept 4th 1864 expiration of term. Buried Holy Cross Cemetery Yeadon Pa. Plot 13-4-57 grave 4. Having died 27<sup>th</sup>.Feb.1899 aged 67 though record dates vary. Shell wound left leg Gettysburg.

\*\* McHenry James (Co. ANTRIM) Enrolled 6.9.1862. At Philadelphia. Mustered out 16.5.1863 certificate of discharge. Joined aged 36. Buried Holy Sepulchre Cemetery Cheltenham Pa.

**McNamara Timothy** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs aged 31 .Killed at Charles City Cross Roads Va June 30th 1862.John had married Susan Kane at St. Peter and Paul cathedral Philadelphia 2.2.1853 witnessed by John and Margaret Farrell. A daughter Catherine was born to them 5.9.1854. Sadly Susan died aged only 28 on the 16.3.1859 aged just 28 in a alms house in Philly. Timothy cared for the child until he joined the army and daughter was raised by an Ann McDevitt who became her guardian. Probably Timothy's body was left on the battlefield as probably no claimant. Ann was 31 when she became Catherine's guardian

**McVey Henry** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert April 23rd 1863. He died 11<sup>th</sup> June 1863 aged 20. His mother applied for a pension by Aug. 1863. He had died 14<sup>th</sup>. June 1863. Has stated his occupation as mechanic. A single man. He is buried in the Old Cathedral cemetery Philadelphia. in lot P-9-62 2<sup>nd</sup> from west. .@.

**Magee Hugh** Boy Musician 2nd. Sept 1861 3yrs Hugh aged just 14 enlisted at the start of the ward. He mustered in at Camp Observation Md 31st Oct.1861. Was 5ft 7ins tall with a dark complexion, grey eyes. He reenlisted 17th Oct.1864. However his record notes that he was "sick in hospital since 4th March 1865". However lived

to 1920 and is buried in he National Cemetery at Arlington Va. Grave plot site 19738.

**Mullen Francis** Private Enlisted 15.8.1861 Philadelphia Deserted at Fair Oaks Va 5.6.1862 (Note may be being confused with a Daniel McMullin Co.G)

- \* \* Murphy James (Co. Dublin). Enlisted as Pvte Sept 16<sup>th</sup> 1861 for 3 Yrs. brother to Frederick below. James was a teamster in the Regt. And spent all his time as a teamster some three years. He did not re enlist. A poor man he ended up his life in an alms house in Germanstown Pa. Died aged 72 of pneumonia 8<sup>th</sup> Oct 1907. He did not marry. Parents both Irish born father Thomas and mother Annie Riley. Buried in the Philadelphia National Cemetery Philadelphia Plot 484 Mechanics Lot. @ M.
- \* \*Murphy Frederick (Co. DUBLIN) Corp. 31st.10th.1861 3 Yrs. Born Co. Dublin Ireland. Fought Gettysburg. Killed Spotsylvania Court House Va May 10th 1864.
- \* \* O'Brien Edward (CO.MAYO) Enrolled 25<sup>th</sup> March 1863 at Danville. M.I. 10<sup>th</sup>. April 1863 Harrisburg aged 39. Dark Comp. Height 5ft 9ins. grey eyes dark hair. Occupation miner. Came to Phila via New Brunswich Canada. Was absent sick from 15<sup>th</sup> April 1864 in hospital Phila.
- \* \* O'Hara J. Michael (Co.Antrim). Enlisted 31st Oct 1861. Prom corporal May 1st 1864. Captured and taken prisoner Jerusalem Plank Road Petersburg Va June 22nd 1864. Held Andersonville Exchanged April 1st 1865. Released April 29th 1865. Discharged by G.O. June 8th 1865. Died West Chester Pa.22.3. 1914 aged 72. Wife Sarah McFadden Buried in the New Cath. Cemetery Philadelphia. March 25th 1914. Plot Section N. Range 10 Lot 23 3 2W/New. Was a boatman before the war. Fought at The Wall at Gettysburg.
- \* \* O'Neill James Enrolled Phladelphia 4<sup>th</sup> Sept 1861. Aged 19 light complexion, height 5ft 41/4ins. Grey eyes auburn hair. Occupation shoemaker. Wounded at Antietam 18<sup>th</sup> Sept 1862 and spent time in hospital and subsequently discharged 26<sup>th</sup> June 1863. No pension records found.
- ### Reilly John E. Pvte. Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland. 1842 Wounded June 20th 1862 at White Oak Swamp wounded elbow. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Nov 9th 1862. Reilly had joined from another unit the 187th Pa Vols. and got Capt's commission. Buried Holy Cross cemetery Yeadon Pa, in plot Section 17 Range 3, Lot 2-4 middle of lots. He had died 1st Dec. 1911 aged 69. A salesman by profession and son of Irish emigrants Daniel and Bridget Reilly both born Ireland. His body exhumed 1912 and moved to Holy Cross cemetery. Buried from his residence 5349 Pulaski Ave. Germantown after Mass at St Vincent de Pauls church. His wife Susan survived him and died May 31st 1919 and was buried in the Holy Cross Cemetery from the house of her nephew John Gregg (probably the son of Sergt John G Gregg Co F her brother). Mass at the Church of Our Lady of the Rosary. Capt John E Reilly was probably the man who gave the oration at the dedication of the 69th monument at the Angle after the war. Was active in the Phila. Brigade Assoc. and post war gave talks at the Gettysburg 69th memorial dedication and re-dedication.

### Reardon (Riordan) Michael Private. Records show he enlisted in the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa in 1864 aged 22. after having served in what from his paperwork to have been Co. H

42 U.S. Inf. Discharged 5<sup>th</sup> Sept 1865.Also at a time in a V.R.C. unit. Died on Sept 17<sup>th</sup> 1915 in Soldiers Home in Kearney N.J. Buried in the Holy Cross Cemetery East Orange New Jersey Grave in soldiers plot H-130-38 (Marker photo). Born Ireland. Brunette complexion. Height 5ft 8ins. Blue eyes dark hair. A moulder by trade. Transferred to V.R.C. 16<sup>th</sup> Jan 1865.Mustered out by G.O. W.D. 304402.Born Le High township Philadlphia. Died aged 72.He had returned to Philadelphia after the war but in 1891 he was living in an old soldiers home in New York city. He had by March 1914 started living in a New Jersey home for disabled soldiers.

**Riley Terrence** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs Enlisted Philadelphia 24th Aug 1861 and mustered in 31st Oct. 1861. Not on muster out roll. Died 12th Sept.1878. Buried Dayton National cemetery. Plot A-15-13.

Rittemhouse Jacob Private. Enlisted 2<sup>nd</sup> Sept `1861. 3 years. Aged 27 A naïve of Philadelphia Discharged 6<sup>th</sup> Sept 1864. Employed as chief teamster..

- \* \* Sandford Charles (Co. TYRONE) Private Unknown 3 Yrs Died Andersonsville Ga 28th Sept.1864 of Anascara. Grave 9912 Born Co. Tyrone Shane (Shehan) David P. Enlisted Philadelphia 10<sup>th</sup> Aug. 1861 aged 24, Promoted
- Corp and to Sergt. dates unknown. Discharged on surgeons cert of discharge .Had been wounded Gettysburg. Burial date 23<sup>rd</sup> Jan. 1866. Buried Old Cath. Cemetery Philadelphia Section O Range 6 grave No. 20 east margin. Had fought Gettysburg.
- **Sheridan Owen** Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Initially Q.M. Sergt then to Sergt Major then 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieut Prom. July 1st 1862.Court marshalled and discharged May 15th 1863.Wife Clara or Clarra B. Miller Sheridan 1845-1925.Owen lived 1837-Oct 18<sup>th</sup> 1870.Both buried together Laurel Hill Cem Philadelphia Section B Lot 81..Died aged just 33, S
- \* \* Stinson James (Co. DERRY) Born Anahorish Newbridge Co. Derry Ireland circa 1820 Enlisted as private 71<sup>st</sup> New York Vol. Inf May 1st 1861 for 3 YrS. Transferred into Co H. 69<sup>th</sup>. Pa. He had served in the 71<sup>st</sup> New York Inf for 2 years 9 months and in the 69<sup>th</sup> for 1 year. James died at the Home for Disabled Volunteers at Hampton Va. Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> 1904. He died aged 65 from general debility. Buried "Old" St Michaels cemetery Philadelphia.
- \* \* Stinson Thomas (Co. DERRY) Born Anahorish Newbridge Enlisted 3 Yrs. Aged 38 April 7<sup>th</sup> 1864. A labourer by trade. Seems to have collected bounties. \$25 April, \$25 May, and \$25 July. Probably fought at Cold Harbour and Petersburg. Got sick and deserted Dec 23<sup>rd</sup> 1864 from hospital in Philadelphia. Captured and fined \$30 back to hospital .Dismissed July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865. In a statement witnessed by a 1<sup>st</sup> Lieut John D, Moore of the 12<sup>th</sup> Regt VRC he states the following.

I enlisted at Phila Pa. On the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1864 for three years and received \$300 bounty. I joined my regiment at Brandy Station Va. And served with it until sometime in Sept 1864when I was taken sick on the Weldon RR.I was then sent to a hospital on Davids Island New York harbour. I remained there until I received a furlough on the 20<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1864 for 30 daysto go to my home in Phila Pa.When my furlough expired I reported to he medical director at Phila who sent me to report to the medical director at Phila where I remained overnight. I was then sent tp Alberton hospital where I stayed ntil 8<sup>th</sup> Feb 1865 when I left the hospital without permission and went to my home for the purpose of seeing my familyas they were in a bad

condition. I started to report to the hospital but was arrested by the city police 8<sup>th</sup> Feb and taken to the Prov.Marshal who sent me to Prince St. Military prison in Alexandria Va. Signed Thoms X Stinson.

From the dates he furnished he possibly fought at the battles of Wilderness, Spotsylvania Cold Harbour and Petersburg.

**Tanner Charles B.** Born in Philadelphia 25<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1842 and died in Floral Park Nassua Co. New York Dec. 16<sup>th</sup> 1911. His links with the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa are based on the fact that Charles initially joined Co. H. of the 1st Delaware Regiment rising through the ranks and in a major confrontation during active service earned an M.O.H. Dec.13<sup>th</sup>. 1889. In December 1864 his good friend and long time commander Thomas Smyth became commander of the third brigade (which included both the 69th and the 1st Del) Smyth wanted Tanner to be on his brigade staff (as aide de camp) but because there were no vacancies in the 1st Del ranks for a position Smyth saw an opening in Company H of the 69th and had Tanner transferred to it. His muster record reads for the months of Jan-Feb-March-April " aide - de camp General Smyth". Thomas Smyth was killed in the last days of the war and Tanner resigned afterward. After the war Tanner he moved to Washington D.C. and became a clerk in the War Dept. He also served ss the Postmaster of Kennett Square. He is buried in the Glenfield Cemetery Uniondale Nassau Co. Wack John Mulford . Enlisted initially in the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. and served until transferred to Co H of the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. on the 12<sup>th</sup> June 1864 until discharged on the 16<sup>th</sup> Nov 1864 about four months service. He had enlisted into the 71<sup>st</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> July 1861 in Wash D.C. aged 25. He died 22<sup>nd</sup>.Sept 1909 aged 68 and is buried in the West Laurel Hill Cemetery Bala Cnywyn Mont Co Pa. Plot 324. This is the plot of the Hollingsworth family though his name not on headstone. Parents Philip Wack and Elizabeth Abbot. Both American born.. He was living at 1939 Master St Philadelphia when he died. His funeral expenses according to bill documents were sent about a month after his death to a Mrs Hollingsworth for \$100 dollars The name Hollingsworth comes up several times on his paperwork but no proof he was related to them .The size of their stone suggests they were people of means.

Died of fever complications at hospital Baltimore Ms. 18<sup>th</sup> March 1865. Buried in the Louded Park National Cemetery Baltimore Ms, Plot 1525 (Marker image).

**William Charles** Sergt. Dec.1st 1861 3 Yrs aged 22 A carpenter by trade. Promoted 5<sup>th</sup> Sergt. May 1863. Fought at Gettysburg and promoted 2<sup>nd</sup> Sergt after

Gettysburg. Re-enlisted Feb 17<sup>th</sup> 1864 and promoted 1<sup>st</sup> Sergt Feb 18<sup>th</sup>. 1864 mortally wounded 17<sup>th</sup> June 1864 at Petersburg Va.. Buried at J. Ruffians property Meade Station Va. Later buried City Point National Cemetery Hopewell Va. Plot Section D 2569 @ M
