**Abel Samuel V.** Private July 1st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged by G.O. July 1st 1865.

**Adams Adam** Private Oct.27th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged by G.O. June 14th 1865.

**Barnes William** Private Feb 9th 1864 3 Yrs Absent at muster out.

**Bentz Josiah** Sergt Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at Petersburg June 18th 1864.Prom .to Corp Nov 11th 1864 to Sergt March 1st 1865.Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. His final resting place was not forever! Notes below explain what happened his mortal remains as the City was "Improved".

Sergeant Josiah Bentz served during the Civil War in Company K, 69th Pennsylvania Infantry. He was wounded in action at Petersburg, Va., June 18, 1864.

"Desolate Cemetery to be Dismantled

Resting Place of Revolutionary Soldiers to Give Way to Improvements.

Will be filled in"

"Bones of Revolutionary soldiers and of men prominent in the affairs of Germantown will be disturbed soon by the progress of the improvements that will result in the destruction of the old graveyard adjoining the East Haines Street Methodist Episcopal Church, in Haines street, east of Germantown avenue.

"Desolation reigns in the little 'God's acre,' which has been abandoned for years. The tombstones are discolored and awry and the paths and graves are overgrown with weeds and bushes.

"Services have not been held in the church for a long time. The congregation now worships in the First Methodist Church of Germantown.

"It has been decided to fill in the graveyard and demolish the church. Descendants of those who are interred there are expected to arrange for the transfer of the bodies to another cemetery."

Many of the bodies were removed by the families. Bodies not removed by the families were removed by the church authorities to a plot in Section C, Ivy Hill Cemetery, Easton Road, Philadelphia.

**Black John** Private Sept 26th 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Black Robert** Private May 21st 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Blake Emanuel** Private 26.6.2011 3 Yrs Drafted. Captured June 22nd 1864 at Petersburg Va Died at Andersonsville Ga.18th Sept 1864.Grave 9,147.Death from Scorbutus. (Marker image)

**Boyd George** Private Feb 9th 1864 3 Yrs Wounded in action March 25th 1865 at Hatchers Run a leg wound. Mustered out Balls Cross Road Va. 1.7.1865. Absent at muster out.

**Boyle Henry** Private Feb 9th 1864 3 Yrs Absent at muster out.

**Bradley Dennis** Corp Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded Antietam Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863.Not on muster out roll.

**Brown Howard** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Nov.10th 1861.

**Brown Thomas H.** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Bruce David W.** Corp Oct.31st 1861 3 yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Born Philadelphia 1842 Died Philadelphia Nov 7<sup>th</sup> 1883. Buried Monument Cemetery (Defunct)

**Buckley John** Corp Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs His papers state born Manchester England emigrated to America in the 1850's. A Lithographer by trade, Enrolled 27.8.1861 at Philadelphia. Mustered in 31.10.1861 at Camp Observation Md. He was 21 years of age. He was 5ft 8 inches in height. Complexion fair, eyes hazel, hair brown. Lived at Bedford Mass. Wounded at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Promoted mail agent 2nd Div. 2nd Army Corps July 1864. Had reenlisted 9.2.1864 Stevensburg Va. Mustered out with the Co. July 1st 1865. He may well have been a brother to William below. Said to have married twice. John died 22. 4. 1908 from asphyxiation due to gas poisoning (accidental) aged 67. Buried 25th April 1908. Parents English Arnold Buckley and Mary Somerton. Buried Mount Moriah cemetery Philadelphia. Buried Lot 107.

**Buckley William** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Enrolled Philadelphia 26.8.1861 Mustered in 31.10.1861 at Camp Observation Md. Enrolled age 22 . Not on muster out roll.

**\* \* Burns Thomas (Co. TYRONE)** Private Sept.28th. 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Tyrone Ireland 1844. Emigrated with parents to America. Enlisted Philadelphia. Wounded Locust Graveyard Va 27.11.1863 upper right arm. Mustered in at Camp Observation. 31st Oct. 1861. Was a fireman all his life. Died Philadelphia 13th Jan 1905 aged 61. Buried in the Cathedral Cemetery 7.1.1905. Mustered out Sept 3rd 1864 expiration of term. (Photo)

**Butney Frank R.** Corp Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**Campbell Barnet** Private May 15th 1864 3 yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Carter Thomas** Private July 1st 1861 3Yrs Aged 22 came from Bordenstown N.J. Killed at Antietam. Buried Bordenstown Cemetery N.J. On some documents he is named as Cotter.

**Casey Joseph** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.Coachman by trade. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia Plot R-4-70. (R-7-40??)(Marker has multiple names.)

**Cavil Francis** Musician Oct 27th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Date unknown

**Chamberlin (Chambrlain) Whitney.** Drafted soldier .Drafted Scranton Pa. 6<sup>th</sup>. July 1864 and mustered out 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865 in Scranton Pa. Lived 1848-1919. Buried Harding Cemetery Susquehanna Co. Pa.

**Clarke Michael** Private May 17th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged by G.O. July 1st 1865.**Clemens Peter** Enrolled aged 47 as private Oct 9th 1864 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Born Snyder Co. Pa, He was of dark complexion, grey eyes, dark hair 5ft 7 1/2 ins tall. Lived at Livrpool Pa, Survived the war and M.O. 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865. Born May 22 1819 Union Co. Pa, Died Oct 12<sup>th</sup> 1898 buried Newton Hamilton Memorial Cemetery Newton Hamilton. Mifflin Co. Pa. It is of interest to note that prior to his service in the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa, he had served in the 173<sup>rd</sup> Pa Inf. Co. E. between Nov 2<sup>nd</sup> 1862 and mustered out Aug 1863. About a year later he joined the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa.

**Cole James** Sergt. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom. to Sergt Major Nov 9th 1862.

**Colebaugh William** Private Sept 23rd 1861 3 Yrs Captured June 22nd 1864 at Petersburg Va. Died at Andersonville Ga Nov. 5th 1864. Grave 11,826 Died from Scorbutus..

**Carter (Cotter) Thomas** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 yrs Killed at Antietam Sept 15th 1862. Buried Bowdenstown Cem. Bodenstown Bulington Co. N.J..

**Crossin Thomas** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Dec 30th 1862. Later re-enlisted in Co. C 1<sup>st</sup>. N.J. Cavalry Buried in Hampton National Cemetery Hampton Va. Grave 8224.Thomas died Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> 1901.Initially served in Co. D 24<sup>th</sup> Pa .His marker has him designated as N.J. though he did initially fight for the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa.

**Crout William B.** Sergt Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted July 25th 1863.after Gettysburg

**\* \* Davis Willam (Co. CORK)** Lt. Col. Sept.11th 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Cork Ireland 1833. A key figure and organiser in the Regiment. Initially lived in NYC where he became a Capt. in the 69th NYNG. However prior to the war he moved to Philadelphia and there joined the 19th Pa Vols during the 90 period in 1861. He then joined the 69th Pa Vols as a Capt. He was commissioned as Capt in the 69th 26th Aug. 1861 in Co. K. Prom from Capt. Co. K to Major 11th Feb.1864 and then to Lt. Col. July 4th 1864. Wounded Reams Station. Va. Aug. 25th 1864. Did two spells of garrison duty. After Gettysburg he spent most of 1865 in Philadelphia serving on court-martial duties. Mustered out with Regt. July 1st 1865. He was born in 1833 and died aged 50 in Dec. 18th 1883 ( another source says 22nd July 1683). Davis married Mary Flannigan in St. Augustines Catholic church Philadelphia 22nd Sept 1864. She Catholic he Protestant. He was heavily involved in Fenian activity prior and during the war and held officer rank (Lieut Colonel) in the organisation. He was a hatter by trade and his obituary suggests that was his business in Philadelphia after the war. He lived at 950 E. York St where he was buried from. He was also a member of Orient Lodge No. 289 F and A M. Excelsior Lodge No.216. Philadelphia Lodge No.2 K of B. Post 2 GAR, the Silk Hat Finishers Assoc. and other societies. Buried in Mount Peace cemetery Philadelphia Section P Lot 165. Known to the family as Bill. Capt. Charles McAnally M.O.H. used Davis's name on a pension claim he McAnally made from Germanstown Philadelphia Jan 1894. McAnally's 2nd pension application. Several affidavits for Davis on his pension file are signed by James J Reville a very active Fenian in Philadelphia at the time. Reville helped obtain money for the 2nd Irish flag for the 69th. presented in 1864. Buried in the Mount Peace Cemetery Philadelphia. (Photo marker) Plot Section P Lot 165.

**Dewson John W.V.** Private Aug 26th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out Aug 27th 1864 expiration of term.

**\* \* Diamond Bernard (Co. DERRY)** Private Oct 31st. 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland circa 1833. Fought Gettysburg. Died Philadelphia Oct 23 rd 1877 aged 44. Born probably Bellaghy area of Co. Derry. Was a metal worked by trade. Died from consumption related disease. Buried New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia. 25<sup>th</sup> Oct 1877. Section O Range 2 Number 36. G3. Bernard was wounded at the battle of Gettysburg 3<sup>rd</sup> July 1863 fighting at the Wall. He and his brother both

fought at Gettysburg. At the time of his death he was living with wife Ann Masterson and father at 2630 North Front St. Philadelphia. He would appear to have various occupations labourer, moulder, blacksmith. Named as Dimond in P.A. Civil war card system. It of interest to note that Bernard is listed on his P.A. Civil war card as having a place of residence Bedford Mass in 1861. He had dark complexion, 5ft 9ins. Tall, brown eyes black hair He had re-enlisted at Stevensburg Va. 16<sup>th</sup>. Feb 1864 and was promoted corporal date unknown. Mustered out 1<sup>st</sup> July 1865. His brother Peter in Co. D was killed at the battle of Locust Grove Mine Run Va. Nov 27<sup>th</sup> 1863. No known grave. Bernard buried in the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia Plot O.2.36. +.

**Diviney John** Sergt Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Fair Oakes May 31st 1862.

**Dougherty (Doherty) Cornelius** Private May 19th 1864 3Yrs aged 35. 5ft 6ins. dark blue eyes hair dark grey, a boatman by trade Died at Philadelphia July 1st 1864.

**Donnelly Charles** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted May 30th 1863

**Dugan Hugh** Private April 8th 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Dugan John** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at Cold Harbour Va June 3rd 1864. Absent at muster out. Born 1843 died 1917. Buried Union Cemetery Bellefonte Centre Co Pa.

**Elliott George** Private May 19th 1864 3 Yrs Wounded at Hatchers Run Va. March 25th 1865 a facial wound. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865

**Fesmier Charles** Private May 15th 1861 3 Yrs Discharged by G.O. June 15th 1865. Died 14.5.1893. Buried Beverly National Cemetery Beverly Burlington Co. N.J.

**\* \* Flooney Hugh** (Co. DOWN) Sergt Feb 7th 1864 3 Yrs Born Co. Down Ireland: Joined 19th June 1861 aged 35. Wounded at The Wilderness May 6th 1864 wounded in leg. Commissioned 2nd Lieut June 16th 1865. Not mustered. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Buried National cemetery Dayton Ohio. Plot N 23 55. A small man height 5ft. 6 ins.

**Flynn John C.** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs aged 19 Killed at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Buried in the Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia. Plot F.7.42-M Possible brother to Michael below.

**Flynn Michael** Private Oct 31st 1861 aged 25 for 3 Yrs Wounded and captured at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. May have survived Andersonville prison. Paroled to Camp Parole Md. Complexion light, height 5ft 10 ins. eyes blue. Deserted date unknown. Brother to John above. Buried with brother Michael but not named on marker.

**\* \* Fox Patrick** (Co. FERMANAGH) Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Glendarragh Ederney Co. Fermanagh. Tyrone border Ireland: Had fought at battle of Glendale but had a lot of sickness throughout the war. Deserted May 26th 1863. Was a cordwainer by trade (shoemaker) Enlisted aged 32. Fought at Glendale, Antietam and Fredericksburg.

**Gervard Henry Harrison "Harry"**. Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs .Initially enlisted in Co C 22<sup>nd</sup> Inf in 3 months enlistment 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1861 in Philadelphia and mustered out 7<sup>th</sup> Aug 1861, then enlisted into the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa Co K 1<sup>st</sup> Sept 1861 again in

Philadelphia and mustered in at Camp Observation Md. Captured at Savage Station June 30th 1862 Wounded in leg at Antietam. Absent sick at muster out. Died in hospital Norristown Pa 19.11.1890 aged 50. Born in Pa as was wife Emma who died 30.1.1932 aged 59. Harry was a merchant. Both buried initially in what was the Philadelphia Philanthropic Hospital later made defunct and bodies taken for reburial in Arlington Cem. No descendant family known of. A small man at 5ft 7ins, Grey eyes, dark hair, dark complexion. When he enlisted he gave his home as Bedford Mass. But later lived Philadelphia. Recorded as having taken part in 17 battles.

**Gleeson Frank P** Private Sept 8th 1861 3 Yrs aged 19. Died at Philadelphia Aug 2 1863 aged 20 of wounds received at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 where he was shot in the shoulder. Died in the South St. Hospital. Buried Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia from his fathers home. Was unmarried. Native of Philadelphia. Name sometimes spelt Gleason. Born Philadelphia 1843 Died Aug 2<sup>nd</sup> 1863 Philadelphia.

**Gulver (Cuiver?)** Private Unknown 3Yrs Captured Petersburg 22nd June 1864. Held at Andersonville Ga. Died there 5th Nov. 1864 of Scorbutus. Grave 11826.

**Hackett William** Private Oct.31st 1862 3 Yrs Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Absent at muster out.

**Halfman William F.** Private July 3rd 1861 3 Yrs Deserted. Returned April 17th 1865. Mustered out with Co.

**Hammond Samuel** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Captured at Savage Station June 30th. Deserted June 28th 1863.

**Hand John** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Antietam Sept 17th 1862 .Buried Antietam National Cemetery. Md. Killed Antietam 17<sup>th</sup> Sept 1863. Born 1842 +.

**Happerset Henry** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 yrs Deserted Oct.31st 1861.

**Harrington John** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Camden N.J. Enlisted aged 19. Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Buried in National Cemetery Pa. section B.-69. Born 1842 Camden New Jersey Died Gettysburg July 2<sup>nd</sup> 1863

**\*\* Hart Patrick** ( Co. CARLOW). Sergt. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Rathvilly Co Carlow Castledermott parish Ireland to Richard Hart and Marcella Cullen and baptised 23rd. Nov. 1834 Ireland. Killed at Antietam Sept.17th 1862. Buried Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia 19th Oct 1862. A single man.

**Haseler James** Corp Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Fredericksburg Dec 13th 1862.

**Haskins William H.** 1st Sergt. Oct 31 1861 3 Yrs Prom to 1st Sergt. April 23rd 1864. Captured at Petersburg June 22nd 1864. Held at Andersonville Ga. Sent to Millen Ga. Oct 31st 1864. Survived. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. A mariner by occupation, William Haskins was supposed drowned off Cuttyhunk Island. His body was found on the shore at or near Vineyard Haven. *Per Massachusetts, Deaths, 1841-1915.* Died 1880. Buried Riverside Cemetery Fairview Bristol Mass. Had alternate name listed as Haskind .Born Nov 16<sup>th</sup> 1826 Rochester Plymouth Co. Mass. Died Sept 1880 Cuttyhunk Dukes Co. Mass. He had been a mariner by occupation. Had been commissioned 1<sup>st</sup> Lieut June 16 1864. +.

**\*\* Hines John** (Co. LOUTH Private Aug. 26<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs aged 22. He had come to America with parents and uncle. He was born Co. Louth April 15<sup>th</sup> 1841 Ireland:

Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. He was hit by a bullet on the left shoulder socket Some bone fragments pierced his body. Also hit on the left hand side of his head. Initially treated in Wash D.C. hospital later being transferred to the Mower Hospital in Philadelphia and later ended up in the Dayton Old Soldiers home and finally to the Johnson City Home where he died May 4<sup>th</sup> 1915. He had transferred to Vet Res. Corps Mar 15th 1864. Buried Mountain Home National Cemetery Johnson City TN. Plot G-8-24, +.

**Hopkins George** Private June 3rd 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll

**Howard Thomas R.** Private April 27th 1864 3 Yrs Discharged by G.O. Aug 10th 1865.

\* \* **Howe Patrick** (Co. GALWAY) Enlisted aged 16 as musician 9.1.861 Philadelphia. Mustered in 31.10.1861 Camp Observation Md. Florid complexion, 5ft 6" tall. fair hair hazel eyes. Gave trade ad painter. Came from Bedford Ma. Re-enlisted Stevensburg Va. Noted sick since 1.5.1864. Promoted as musician date unknown

**Hughes Henry** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Transferred to Vet. Res. Corps. Nov. 15th 1863.

**Insley Cyrus** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Mar 5th 1863.

**Jack Josias** 1st Lieut. Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Enlisted Philadelphia 30th Sept. 1861 Mustered in 31st Oct. 1861 as Asst Sergt Camp Observation Md. Aged 22 dentist by profession and born in New York but lived in Philadelphia. Re-enlisted Stevensburg Va. 4th Feb. 1864. Prom. 1st Lieut April 23rd 1864. Killed at Spotsylvania Court House May 12th 1864 commanding Co. K. Resident of Germanstown.

**Jackson Charles** Private April 26th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Johnson John H** 2nd Lieut Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom from Sergt May 1st 1863. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Dec 30th 1863.

**Jones William J** Corp Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Captured Petersburg Va. Sent Andersonville Ga. Prisoner from June 22nd 1864 to May 17th 1865. Sent Camp Lawton Millen Ga. Oct 31st 1864. Discharged by G.O. July 1st 1865.

**Kearney James** Private Oct. 31st 1861 3 Yrs Wounded at Antietma Sept 17th 1862. Absent at muster out.

\* \* **Kelley (Kelly) (Kelley) James F** (Co. TYRONE ) Private 25<sup>th</sup> Sept 1861 3 yrs Killed at Gettysburg. Left behind a wife Ellen and baby daughter Mary. Buried in the National Cemetery at Gettysburg Adams Co. Pa. Grave PA C-89. Note name is Kelly though on some records noted as Kelley. James was shot at Gettysburg on 3<sup>rd</sup> of July 1863 when he was shot through the left breast and died. Later on Sept 15<sup>th</sup> 1864 Capt William Davis the Lieut Col. Of the 69<sup>th</sup> wrote a letter of commendation and giving detail of James death ensuring that James' wife Ellen obtained a pension.

**Kelly (Kelley) James** Pvte 7<sup>th</sup> July 1864 24<sup>th</sup> April 1865. Probably drafted soldier. Captured Boydton Rd Oct 27<sup>th</sup> 1864. Taken to Andersonville Prison and then Libby prison for 8 weeks. Absent sick at muster out. Discharge papers had been lost. Born 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct 1828 died 22<sup>nd</sup> Aug. 1898. Buried with wife at Plot 8 St Mary's Catholic Church Phoenixville Pa. Named on some documents as Kelley. Wife Sarah lived Jan

1<sup>st</sup> 1830 died Dec 10<sup>th</sup> 1885 some 13 years before James. Born Oct 2<sup>nd</sup> 1828 Died Aug. 22<sup>nd</sup> 1896.

**Kelly Joseph Morgan** Capt. Sept 11<sup>th</sup> 1861 3 Yrs He had initially joined the 19<sup>th</sup> Pa. Co. G. May 18<sup>th</sup> 1861 for a short period before joining the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. Wounded at Antietam Sept 17<sup>th</sup> 1862 and at Fredericksburg Dec 13<sup>th</sup> 1862. Discharged on Surgeons Cert Mar. 4<sup>th</sup> 1863. Then after a very short period in the 38<sup>th</sup> Pa. Infantry joined the 10<sup>th</sup> Cavalry and soon promoted Major. Spent his full army career in the West mainly fighting the Indian nations. At the end of his career he retired and died in St Louis Mo. March 7<sup>th</sup> 1911. He had been born in New York Sept. 19<sup>th</sup>. 1844. Buried in Arlington Cemetery Va. He never married. A life long career soldier.

**Kelly George** Private July 13<sup>th</sup> 1864 3 Yrs Drafted. Absent in arrest at muster out.

**\*\* Kennedy William (Co. ROSCOMMON)** .(Not listed in Bates) Enlisted aged 32 Oct.28<sup>th</sup> 1862. Died of pneumonia Jan.. 23<sup>rd</sup> 1863. Buried Wash. D.C. cemetery. U.S. Soldiers and Sailors Home National Cemetery Wash D. C. Grave 4765.Site G.

**\* \* Kerns John (Co. WATERFORD)** Private Oct 31<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Born Lismore Co Waterford 1831. Enrolled 15<sup>th</sup> Oct. 1861 Phila. Aged 30. M.I. Camp Obs Md. 31<sup>st</sup> Oct 1861 Got sick June 17<sup>th</sup> 1863 hospitalized .Missed Gettysburg but returned to service Oct. 1863 enlisting with bounty payment and fought in all battles until killed by bullet in right chest June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1864 a victim of action at Jerusalem Plank Rd. near Petersburg Va. All the men killed at this battle simply thrown into a mass pit grave as nor doubt the fate of John Kerns the young man from Lismore.

**Kooney Joseph** Private May 11<sup>th</sup> 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**La Roche Edward** Private Oct 31<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert.nov 20<sup>th</sup> 1862.Died 15<sup>th</sup> June 1901.Buried Hampton Va.Nat Cemetery. (Headstone photo)

**Lagarty James** Private Sept 25<sup>th</sup> 1863 3 Yrs Drafted absent sick at muster out.

**Lantz William F.** Corp Oct 31<sup>st</sup> 1861 3 Yrs Not a lot known about Lantz. By April 26<sup>th</sup> he was in Germanstown hospital with being treted with several medicines used at the time. Fought Gettysburg and seemed to have had traumatic stress as the result and was assigned to recruitment duties in Philadelphia. He was on paper returned to duty July 11<sup>th</sup> 1864 but never left Philadelphia. His mustered out discharge card noted a “camp discharge” Dec.10<sup>th</sup> 1864 signed by order of Major Gilbert 19<sup>th</sup> U.S. Infantry Chief M & D.O.

**Lawrence Edward** Private July 17<sup>th</sup> 1863 3 Yrs The 69<sup>th</sup> Regimental butcher. Born 1830 in Philadelphia a butcher by trade as were many of his siblings and extended family members. Drafted July 17<sup>th</sup> 1863 into Co. B. of the 71<sup>st</sup> Pa. Vols. in a three year enlistment. Transferred into Co. K of the 69<sup>th</sup> Pa. June 6<sup>th</sup> 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1<sup>st</sup> 1865 at Balls Cross Roads Va. When he enlisted he had been married for some 10 years to Mary Ann Etley. He had married Oct. 8<sup>th</sup> 1855 in Hedding Methodist church. They had three sons Albert Lafayette 1856-1951, Michael William 1858-1937 and George Robbin 1860-1938. A daughter Lillian Collins Lawrence was born after the war 1869-1947. As a regimental butcher he would not have carried on too many fighting duties. Edward had four other brothers John Albert Layfayette, George and Hiram who also joined the army. Though butchers by trade they did not take their trade into the Army. James survived a few

scrapes with authorities whilst in service as did many of the men but was honourably discharged. Edward died aged 42 from T.B. Oct 16th 1872 at 2135 Wright St. Philadelphia. Family initially buried in the Oddfellows Cemetery Lot L238 In Philadelphia but removed to Lawnview Philadelphia cemetery in 1951 . Susquehanna Section Lot 2-26. The family originally named Lorentz from the German Rhineland Johannes Lorentz having arrived in Philadelphia in 1748. Edward's mother Mary Ann Etley also came from a butcher family her brothers having that trade.

**Little George** Private Sept 23rd 1863 3 Yrs Drafted Captured June 22nd.1864. Died in prison at Andersonville Ga Oct.11th 1864 from scorbutus. Grave 10,725. Had alternate name of George Tibbles.

**Luby John** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Jan 14th 1863 with chronic diarrheah and fever Discharged from Lincoln hospital Wash D.C. Had enlisted Philadelphia 26<sup>th</sup> Aug 1861. He was a married man wife Mary J. Mother Mrs Ann Ruby. He was in height 5ft 11ins dark hair and complexion, hazel eyes could read and write. Catholic. Was a plasterer by trade. Died Philadelphia May 18<sup>th</sup> 1902. Born in Philadelphia 1842. Buried Old Cathedral Cem. Philadelphia under a government headstone.

\* \* **Lynn Charles (Co DERRY)** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland. Probably born Portglenone area Co. Derry. Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Nov 20<sup>th</sup> 1862. Buried Dayton National Cemetery Ohio. Plot L 5 6. 13<sup>th</sup> June 1898. +.

**Martin John C.** Private Feb 1st 1865 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Maynes John** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Oct.3rd 1862.

**McConnell Patrick** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed Antietam Sept 1862

\* \* **McCormick Michael** (Co. KILDARE) Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Kildare Ireland 1824. Wounded Antietam. Badly wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 gunshot wounds to left shoulder and right leg. Discharged on Surgeons Cert Sept 26th 1864. Was a coal dealer in Philadelphia. Had been married. Died in the Old Soldiers Home in Dayton Ohio 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1910. Family lived at 1225 Sergeant St Philadelphia from where he was buried to the New Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia 7<sup>th</sup> June 1910.

**McDonald Michael** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert April 23rd 1863.

**McDowell Joseph C** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Died at Harrisons Landing August 5th 1862 on the steamer "Vanderbilt". Buried in the Haines St. Methodist church Germanstown Philadelphia.. When this cemetery closed he was reburied in Ivy Hill cemetery in Philadelphia. Died on the "Vanderbilt" at Harrisons Landing 5.8.1862. Age 22.

**McGarvey John** Private March 3rd 1864 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**McGrath Thomas** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged Jan 3rd 1863 for wounds received at Antietam Sept 17th 1862.

**McGraw Patrick** Private Aug 20th 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**McHugh John J** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Enrolled Sept 19th 1861 at



Philadelphia aged 19. Mustered in Oct. 31st 1861 as private at Camp Observation Md. Mustered out July 1st 1865 He was born in Philadelphia. His father and mother both born Ireland. Father John and mother Rose Ann. Was a bartender by trade. A married man wife Margaret. Born 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb 1843 Philadelphia Died 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb 1908 Philadelphia. Buried in the Old Cath. Cem Philadelphia 24<sup>th</sup> Feb 1908.

**McIntosh Joseph L.B.** Sergt. Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom Corp July 1st 1864 then to Sergt Nov 11th 1865.Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.Born Philadelphia 1849 Died Philadelphia July 14<sup>th</sup> 1887 aged 43. Buried in the Monument cemetery. (Defunct) Philadelphia and later remains transferred with others to Lawnview Cemetery Philadelphia communal grave.

**McKelvey Henry E.** Private Oct 19th 1864 3 Yrs Enlisted Oct 19th Carlisle Pa and mustered in on same day. He was aged 25 .He was of fair hair, hazle eyes, brown hair, 5ft 4" in height. He was a labourer by trade. Born in Perry Co .Pa and resided in Liverpool Pa. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**\* \* McNichols William** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Captured at Savage Station June 29th 1862. Wounded at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863 by shell fragment. Treated Mower Hospital Philadelphia. aged 28. Had surgery on Aug 14th 1863 and returned to duty Dec 18th 1863. Deserted date unknown.

**\*\* McStay Patrick** (Co. CAVAN) Feb 26th 1864 3 Yrs Enlisted Stevensburg Captured Petersburg Va. June 22nd 1864 to April 6th 1865.Miissing in action 12.6.1864. Captured Petersburg Va. 12.6.1864 and held Andersonville Va .Exchanged Vicksburg Miss. April 20th 1865.Discharged by G.O. June 27th 1865. He was 5ft 7ins tall, dark complexion, black hair and worked as a labourer.

**McTighe Patrick** Private May 16th 1864 3 Yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Miller Adam A** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Captured New Market Cross Roads June 30th 1862.Wounded at Fredericksburg Dec.13th 1862.Absent at muster out.

**Moore Peter** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted June 12th 1863.

**\* \* Moran George M** (Co. DERRY) Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Co. Derry Ireland: Killed at Antietam Sept 17th 1862.

**Morrissey Edward** Private Feb 9th 1864 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**\* \* Mulhall John** (Co. KILKENNY) Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Kilkenny Ireland: Discharged Jan28th 1863 from hand wounds received at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. He re-enlisted in the 48<sup>th</sup> Pa Infantry Co. K. Feb 25<sup>th</sup> 1864. The 48<sup>th</sup> Inf Regt. credited with building the tunnel of explosives at the battle of Crater. A small man 5ft 3ins tall. Died July 9<sup>th</sup> 1897. Buried Dayton National Cemetery Dayton Ohio Section Plot K Row 16 Grave 13.

**Murray Henry W.** Sergt Oct 31st 1861 3Yrs Born 6.6.1834. in Philadelphia. Joined as a private in Philadelphia 11.9.1861.Mustered in Camp Observation Md. 31.10.1861. Promoted to corporal and then sergeant dates unknown. Wounded at Gettysburg July 2nd by Confederate shot which blinded him in both eyes. Spent a year in hospital. Returned to Philadelphia now blind. Married Hannah W.James who was from the Cleveland area. June 15th 1867. Lived on farm in the Cleveland area. However Henrys health steadily declined and he died Dec.10th 1884 aged 50.

Buried with wife Hanna in Shadyside cemetery Auburn Township Geauga Co. Section 2B Lot 12. Near Cleveland Ohio. Hannah born 1841.

**Murray James** Private Sept 23rd 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Missing in action June 22nd 1864.

**Newman George W.** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Nov 10th 1861. Returned. Dishonourably discharged Nov.16th 1863.

**Noon Joseph** Private July 27th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Captured Petersburg Va June 22nd 1864 taken to Andersonville Prison Ga. but survived. Discharged by G.O.June 14th 1865.

**Noon Timothy** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Missing in action June 22nd 1864.

**\* \* O'Connor Patrick** (Co. LOUTH) Private Sept 13th 1862 3 Yrs Born Co Louth Ireland: Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863. Buried Old Cathedral Cemetery Philadelphia.

**\* \* O'Donnell James** (Co. DUBLIN) Private July 12th 1864 3 Yrs Drafted. Deserted by swimming the Potomac July 30<sup>th</sup> 1864 Imprisoned for period. No active service. Born Co. Dublin

**Paisley Samuel R.** Private Jan 6th 1865 3 yrs Discharged by G.O. June 13th 1865

**Pierce Henry** (E.I.) Enlisted as Private aged 19 Oct 31st 1861 for 3 Yrs. He was raised at Mabtua Village West Philadelphia. Captured Petersburg Va June 22nd 1864 held Andersonville then sent to Camp Lawton Millen Ga . Exchanged April 1st 1865. He had re-enlisted 6<sup>th</sup> Feb 1864. Parolled at Jacksonville Fla 28<sup>th</sup> April 1865. A labourer by trade 5ft 7ins. in height. Born Philadelphia lived at a time in Bedford Mass. Was captured in the confrontation at Jerusalem Plank Road June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1864. Had a history of poor health and at a time was in hospital NYC (Davids Island) Escaped on several occasions from hospital but always recaptured. Buried Hampton National Va. Cemetery plot 10998.+.

**Polley John** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 yrs Captured at Antietam Sept 17th 1862. Returned. Deserted date unknown.

**Quigley Patrick** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Captured June 22nd 1864 at Petersburg. Held prisoner Andersonville Pa. Sent to Millen Ga.31st Oct.1864.Survived.

**Reuch August** Private Sept 25th 1863 3 Yrs Drafted. Captured at Reams Station Aug 25th 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Rhile Henry** Private Feb 21st 1864 3 Yrs Captured June 22nd 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Robinsin John H.** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted Nov 10th 1861. Returned. Absent in arrest at muster out.

**Sailor S.H.** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Died near Portsmouth Grove R.I. July 26th 1862 after taking ill during the Peninsular Campaign. Buried Cypress National Cemetery Brooklyn Kings Co. New York. Plot 3289. Died age 46.

**Schmidt John** Private Sept 26th 1861 3 Yrs Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Shermer Charles B.** Private Oct.31st 1861 3 Yrs Absent sick at muster out.

**\* \* Shields Francis** (Co. DONEGAL) Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born

Kilmacrennan Co. Donegal Ireland to John Shields and Ann Gallagher. Baptised 12th April 1840 . Killed at Antietam Sept. 17th 1862 aged 23 years from gunshot wound. Buried Oct 7th 1862 St Annes Catholic cemetery Le High-Memphis St. Philadelphia. (Marker photo)

**Simpson John S.H.** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs aged 18. Sallow complexion brown eyes, a salesman. Height 5ft 7ins. Re-enlisted 6<sup>th</sup> Feb at Stevensburg Va. Corp rank 3<sup>rd</sup> June 1864. Wounded at Cold Harbour June 3rd 1864. Born 1842 Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Died March 28<sup>th</sup> 1916 and buried Mount Moriah cemetery Philadelphia.

**Slocum Crosby** Private Mar 8th 1864. 3 Yrs Captured June 22nd 1864 Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865.

**Smith Draper** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom. to Q.M. Sergt. Mar 15th 1863. Transferred to Vet Res. Corps.

**Story Benjamin** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Deserted July 2nd 1863.

**Stratton Theodore (Thomas) F** Capt Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom. from Private to Sergt. Sept 1st 1864, to 2nd Lieut. Nov 11th 1864 and to Capt April 3rd 1865. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. Was initially in Co. K 22<sup>nd</sup> Pa. Died 2<sup>nd</sup> March 1931 in Nat. soldiers Home Hamton Va. Buried Hampton National Cemetery Va Grave 1954A. Was a paperhanger by trade. Was a married man. Had been in many old Vets Homes. Born in Philadelphia but states enlisted from Bedford Mass. 5ft 6ins, fair complexion brown hair, (image of his dog tag elsewhere in website).

**### Sullivan Thomas** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Born Ireland: Deserted Oct. 15th 1862.

**Taylor Charles Howard** 2nd Lieut. Sept 11th 1861 3 yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. ( T.B.) Died Nov 7th 1862. Buried Woodlawn Cemetery Philadelphia.

**Thompson James** Private Sept 26th 1864 3 yrs Not on muster out roll.

**Todd James H.** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Killed at Gettysburg July 2nd 1863. No known grave probably buried in battlefield grave close to the area he fell.

1863. Wounded at Gettysburg July 2nd 1863. Prom. to Adjutant July 16th 1863. Died  
from gun shot received at battle of Cold Harbour 3rd June 1864 aged 31. Buried  
Moriath Cemetery 16th June 1864. Unmarried. Was adjutant of the Regt. at a time.  
Buried from 551 Newmarket St. Philadelphia.

**White John** Private Oct 31st 1861 3 yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert Sept 18th  
1862.

**Whitecar James M** Sergt. Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Prom. from Corp to Sergt July  
1st 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. (photo)

**Whittick Robert F** Corp Oct 31st 1861 3 Yrs Discharged on Surgeons Cert. Dec  
22nd 1863. Re-enlisted Feb 28th 1864. Mustered out with Co. July 1st 1865. During  
Picketts charge at Gettysburg a young Conf. soldier Sergt. Arthur Willmington of  
Conf. 53rd Va Co. A. jumped over the wall to attack in front of Co. K. He was  
captured and disarmed by Whittick and was later exchanged in prisoner swap. Some  
25 years after the war was over and the two soldiers met at the wall. Willmington  
and Whittick met up again as old men. Such is war. From Philadelphia. (Photo)

April 1st 1865.
