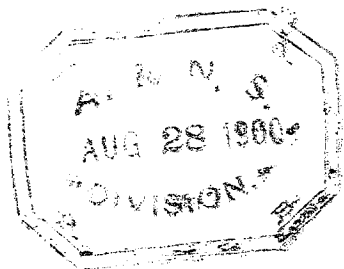

Dear Sir:

I enlisted in Phila, in the 19<sup>th</sup> Regt Co. G, as an enlisted man, in the first 75,000 call, under the name of William Mack, an abbreviation of my proper name. In my younger days I was called William Mack. My full and proper name is William F. Mc Namara.

I enlisted under my full and proper when I enlisted in 69 Regt. P.V. for 3 years, also re-enlisted in the 69 Regt under my full name. I never received one cent for bounty as an enlisted man, as I believe I am entitled to it. Will you kindly look after this for me?

I was honorably discharged by special orders. Special Orders No. 56 Star Dept. for physical disability, dated Aug 20, 1864, under my proper and full name William F. Mc Namara. As 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant Co D 69 Regt. P.V.
